Students in grades 4-6 are participating in an afterschool workshop to crochet a plush chicken. These students had been exposed to crochet two years ago after completing an owl design for the Celebration for Education centerpiece. Crocheting is a great tool to increase fine motor, math, comprehension and problem-solving skills. Once learned, crocheting can bring a sense of calm through its rhythmic patterns and a sense of accomplishment though the project achieved. All beginners feel a bit awkward getting going (trying to hold the yarn and hook while stitching is rather complex), however, the students are excited to complete their finished project. We plan on four sessions total to achieve our fluffy chicken. “Bawk Bawk!!”
