A Note from Annie.

Over the past couple years, I have been challenged in my faith to learn more. I come from a family where life long learning is incredibly important— both my parents are consistently enrolled in some new class to improve their skills or continue to advance their careers. My mother was a valedictorian and my dad studied at Rose-Hulman, so it's easy to see where as a young child, learning was conveyed to be incredibly important.

And this applies to our faith too. We ought to strive to continue to learn more about our faith— for the deeper in love we fall with Christ and His Church, the more we want to know— which tends to cause us to fall even deeper in love and hungrier for more knowledge of the Church. It's why we call this a faith journey— the only time it is going to stop is when we are reunited in the Life Everlasting and everything is then made known to us.

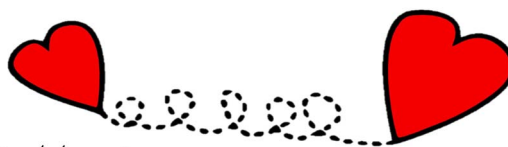
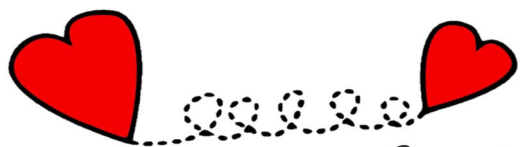
As I have learned more, it's then empowered me to want to teach more. I am the type of person that, when I learn more about the faith, I want to continue to spread the Good News and share that with even more people so that they are equipped to share the kerygmatic message. The beauty of my position as Director of Evangelization is that sharing the faith and spreading the Good News is at the core of what I do. That is why I wanted to share some opportunities that we have as a family of faith to grow not only in our personal relationship with Christ, but also in the knowledge of our faith.

1. **Sunday Morning Lectio Divina** Each Sunday, following the PRE calendar, all adults are invited to gather in either the Chapel or the Church (based on availability) to go over the upcoming Sunday scriptures. It will be a combination of a bible study and praying with the scriptures. Lectio Divina literally means "Divine Word"— as the scriptures are all truly inspired Word of God. By looking at the next Sunday's scriptures, we will give ourselves a week to understand and pray with God's Word before attending Mass— so that when we hear the Word proclaimed on Sundays, we can be fully present and understand what is being said. We begin at 9:20am and end by 10am— with 20 minutes devoted to the 1st and 2nd readings total and the second 20 minutes devoted to praying with the Gospel.
2. **Domestic Church Project** This is open to any family in Sacred Heart— young, old, retired, newly married, single, it doesn't matter. All of our PRE families will already be receiving resources in some way, but if you'd like to participate, registration is available on the website or by emailing me. Essentially, this year we are going to focus on living liturgically at home. Families will be equipped with resources to celebrate Saint feast days, important liturgical celebrations, learn prayers, and unite with the world-wide Church each month. If there is anything we learned in a post-Covid world is that we cannot always depend on our ability to be within the Church walls in order to live our faith. We must bring the Church into our homes.
3. **Bulletin Board in Narthex** And finally, check out the bulletin board in the Narthex at the back of Church. New saints and feast days will be posted from now through All Souls Day with facts and ways to remember them at home. There are also coloring pages of saints for our younger kiddos that can be colored during Mass (crayons in the St. Ann Library). Currently, the folder has September saints, with October's to be added after next weekend's Masses.

These are just some small ways that we can grow in our faith. It all begins with small steps to take that then lead us on the long journey. I am so excited to walk through these opportunities with you and look forward to the fruits we will see grow in our parish family.

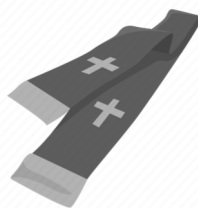

DEVOTIONS AT SACRED HEART



ROSARY Join us in praying the Rosary before the 10:30am Mass. We gather at 10am in the Church to pray together. If you would like to lead the Rosary, please contact Annie to make those arrangements.



CONFESSION Fr. Sean hears confessions in the Library on Saturdays, 3:30-4:30pm and on Wednesdays, 5:00-5:45pm. If you have been away from the sacrament, there are guides to help!



ADORATION Every Wednesday following 6PM Mass with benediction at 8PM in the Church. Fr. Sean offers a sermon called "After Hours with Fr. Sean" at 6:30PM. Adorers are always needed for this time frame.



FIRST FRIDAYS Every First Friday of the month, the devotions to the Sacred Heart are remembered. Mass is offered at 11am followed by adoration until 8PM. A rosary is recited in the 7pm hour. Adorers are always needed for this time frame.

Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary through the Rosary

Since the establishment of our faith, Catholics have been calling on the Blessed Mother for her intercession on their behalf to her Beloved Son. While the true beginnings of the rosary are murky, we do know that knotted prayer ropes were used by the early Church Fathers and that eventually, in the early 1200s St. Dominic put together prayers to the knots. By 1571, Pope Pius V instituted a new Marian feast of "Our Lady of Victory" that was changed 2 years later by Pope Gregory XIII who changed the feast to "Our Lady of the Rosary" and was celebrated on the first Sunday in October. In 1913, Pope Pius X changed this date to October 7.

As a prayer, the Rosary utilizes all aspects of our faith. Many find comfort in rolling their fingers over the beads

as they silently recite the prayers. While the "Hail Mary" is the predominate prayer of the Rosary, they are said while meditating on mysteries of Christ's life and asking for our Savior's intercession.

The prayers include...

- Apostles Creed
- Our Father
- Hail Mary
- Glory Be
- Fatima Prayer
- Hail Holy Queen

As a community, the Rosary is recited prior to the 10:30am Mass in the Church on Sundays. Anyone is welcome to come pray together! There are also various Rosary groups who pray the devotion together in the community.

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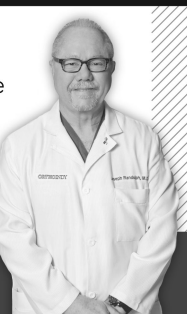
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
