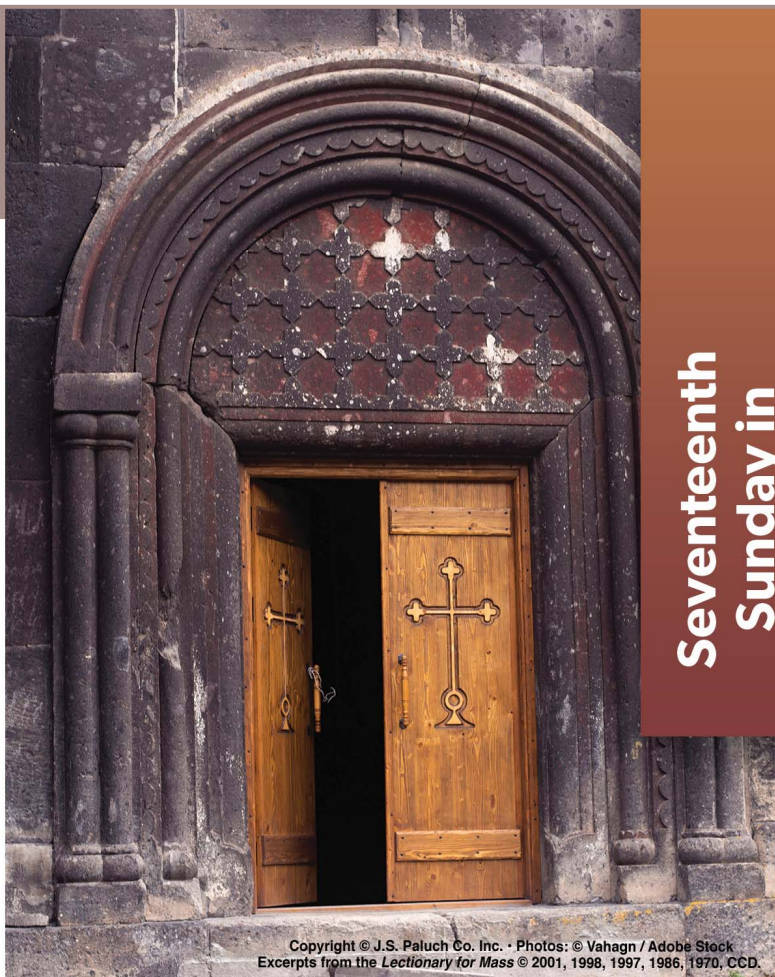

A Note from Annie.

As those who attend bible studies with me know— I enjoy understanding the roots and meanings of words. Often times, the more we understand the root of the word, the more it makes that word come alive— specifically when it comes to words that involve the Church. It's why I love the word "ruach" which means wind, or breath of God. Wind is such a bland word, but the word actually translates as the breath of God that has been breathed out. When you read that in context of Pentecost, or the burning bush, it makes the word come alive and gives it a deeper understanding.

The word "catechize" does the same thing for me. For many people, they hear the word "catechize" or "catechist" and instantly associate it to teaching the faith— or those "qualified" to teach the faith. But when we understand the association of "catechize" to the Latin "catechizare" which comes from the Greek "katechein"— and we break that word down we get "kata"- "cata" and "echein"- "to resound." The word "echo" has the same root. So, the word catechist doesn't necessarily mean "to teach" (as it has been associated with in the modern age) but rather, it means "one who echoes."

And isn't that what a good catechist does? They are the ones who echo the faith. They echo the words of Christ. They repeat and repeat and repeat over and over and over again until it fills the space. We hear the same words at Mass during the consecration each week, but until those echoed words settle in our hearts do they mean something.

Right now, we are standing on the precipice of an amazing opportunity. We are launching a Youth Ministry program for our 5th-8th graders and High School students. We are beginning to make changes to our PRE program. And, Little Hearts is adding what is called "CREW" (Catholic Religious Education and Worship) for our littles of the parish every other month for two Sundays that month. But to do all the amazing things we have in store for the youth and young people of our parish— **we need people who can echo.** We need individuals who have a love of Jesus, who are willing to take the time to share their faith, and who have generous and patient hearts to work with our youth. For Youth Ministry— we need people to help in the kitchen, to assist in small groups, and who would be willing to teach and give witness. For PRE— we need individuals who can commit a few hours every week, but especially on Sunday, to grow in their faith along side our young people as they explore the faith more deeply. Truly, watching "light bulb moments" when young people understand the faith is amazing. And we need at least 2 of these individuals for each grade (though more are welcome). We also need aids— individuals who help run the program from behind the scenes. For CREW— we need parents. Parents who are willing to bring and participate with their little ones in these first moments of exploration of their faith.

You don't need to have a theology degree. You don't need to be well versed in doctrine, scripture, and done extensive studies. You don't even need to read encyclicals, know every move of the Pope or our Bishop, or understand the "insider baseball" of the Church. **We need individuals who love Jesus and want to share that love of Jesus with our parish youth.** When I first started in ministry, I was a freshmen in High School who wanted to share the love of Jesus with our first and second graders. From there, it slowly grew to third and fourth and fifth grades, then Middle School YM, then High School YM, and the next thing I knew, I had a degree. The degree helps me with the practical aspects— but it's from those first moments of sharing my faith that taught me to be a catechist. Echoing the words of Jesus is the foundation. From there, everything else just flows.

We will have on-going support, retreats, and opportunities to grow in your faith— in the practicals— to assist in the role being taken on. But, if at the very least, you have a tug on your heart and you want to help in any of the programs— contact me. I would love to learn more about your desire, see where we can make the best fit, and get you involved with sharing the faith. Because, we can't keep our lamps under a basket. Our faith is meant to be shared. And that means even in our own community.

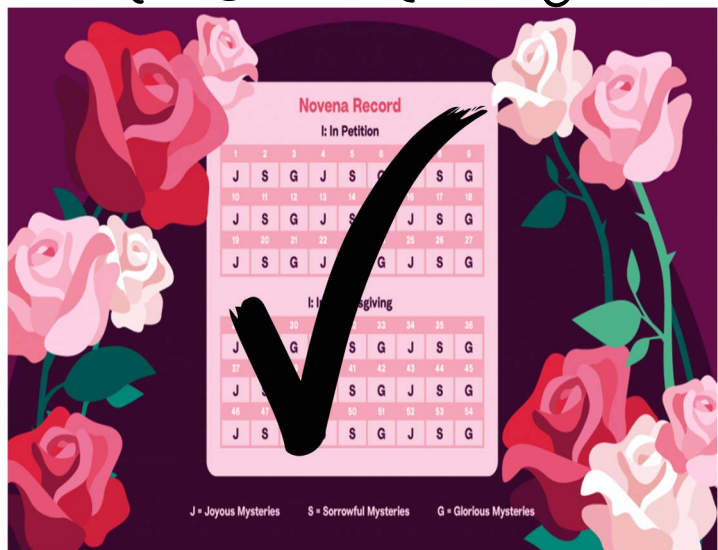


A VERY MARY SUMMER

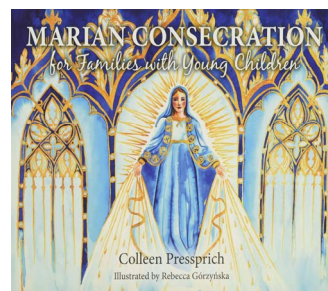
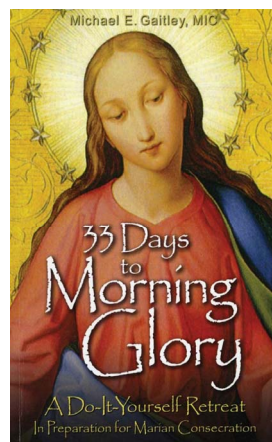

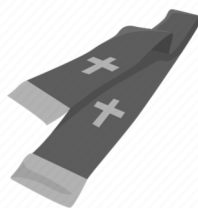

DEVOTIONS AT SACRED HEART

CONFESSION Fr. Sean hears confessions in the Library on Saturdays, 3:30-4:30pm and on Wednesdays, 5:00-5:45pm. If you have been away from the sacrament, there are guides to help!



ADORATION Every Wednesday following 6PM Mass with benediction at 8PM in the Church. Adorers are always needed for this time frame. Also, Adoration is on First Fridays after the 11AM Mass until benediction at 3PM.



FIRST FRIDAYS Every First Friday of the month, the devotions to the Sacred Heart are remembered. Mass is offered at 11am followed by adoration until 3PM with Divine Mercy. There is also a communion service and holy hour from 7-8pm.

Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary through the Rosary

Since the establishment of our faith, Catholics have been calling on the Blessed Mother for her intercession on their behalf to her Beloved Son. While the true beginnings of the rosary are murky, we do know that knotted prayer ropes were used by the early Church Fathers and that eventually, in the early 1200s St. Dominic put together prayers to the knots. By 1571, Pope Pius V instituted a new Marian feast of "Our Lady of Victory" that was changed 2 years later by Pope Gregory XIII who changed the feast to "Our Lady of the Rosary" and was celebrated on the first Sunday in October. In 1913, Pope Pius X changed this date to October 7.

As a prayer, the Rosary utilizes all aspects of our faith. Many find comfort in rolling their fingers over the beads as they silently recite the prayers. While the "Hail Mary"

is the predominate prayer of the Rosary, they are said while meditating on mysteries of Christ's life and asking for our Savior's intercession.

The prayers include...

- Apostles Creed
- Our Father
- Hail Mary
- Glory Be
- Fatima Prayer
- Hail Holy Queen

As a community, the Rosary is recited prior to the 10:30am Mass in the Church on Sundays. Anyone is welcome to come pray together! There are also various Rosary groups who pray the devotion together in the community.
