Financial Report

On behalf of your Finance Council, it's my honor to present to you our financial report for the 2024-25 fiscal year, ending June 30, 2025.

With Pope Leo XIV's American roots as inspiration, you have dedicated yourself to making our parish a place of homegrown holiness—a place where all of us can encounter Christ through community, the sacraments, and opportunities to serve. It's humbling to see.

Our giving through **Collections and Gifts increased by \$40,000** this year, and while this is wonderful, we continue to strive to support our growing mission.

While many of your sacrifices are made privately, please know they have a very public effect – allowing more people to encounter Jesus Christ, the source of all holiness.

Our school enrollment was lower than we had anticipated in the budget, but thankfully we were able to recover this shortfall through increased income elsewhere, and by trimming our expenses accordingly.

We are therefore continuing to focus our energies into promoting the excellent work of Saint Mary Academy, through social media, and the upcoming Open House on November 9th. We encourage everyone to spread the word so that we can share our faith and welcome new families to our school.

As we say goodbye to our 2024/25 fiscal year, and look ahead to what's happening next year, it's wonderful to know that holiness is on tap here at Saint Bernadette and Saint Mary Academy!

Understanding our Bond

The Bond was a loan that was taken out in 2008 to purchase our land, and to build the church, the parish center and the school. The original loan was for \$10 million, and for the first ten years we could only make interest payments. In 2018 we started repaying the principle.

Payments are made in March of each year, and in 2025 the payment was \$625,000. This reduced the outstanding balance to \$3.175 million, and so we have made significant progress in reducing our indebtedness. We have five more payments scheduled from 2026 to 2030; at which time the bond will be fully paid.

This is a substantial undertaking, and we rely on the continued growth and generosity of our community to sustain the financial health of Saint Bernadette and Saint Mary Academy.

MISSION & CATHOLIC IDENTITY

- Celebrated our annual Fall Festival with the collective Saint Bernadette and Saint Mary Academy community.
- Students and staff planned and participated in Reconciliation, Holy Thursday & Good Friday prayer services, a May Crowning, and Veteran's Day program.
- 2nd grade students received the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion.
- 8th grade students received the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- Students in grade levels K-4 performed a dance and choir ensemble at local nursing homes
- Middle school students met with their Pre-K, K, and 1st grade buddies regularly
- Middle school students participated in Canstruction, creating structures out of donated food items which are then donated to local food banks.
- SMA donated 50 desks and chairs to West End School, a scholarship-based independent school serving boys in PreK-8th grade, in the west of Louisville. SMA also donated the remainder of

old classroom desks and chairs to schools in need in the area.



- Students and staff raised over \$1,000 during a
 Catholic Schools Week Penny War to support
 the Catholic Education Foundation. Members of
 the Catholic Education Foundation and
 Superintendent, Mary Beth Bowling, visited
 SMA kindergarten students to thank them.
- 8th grade students participated in a Leadership Retreat at the beginning of the year, a culminating retreat at the end of the school year, and a group of students partnered with Hand in Hand Ministries for a service trip to Appalachia to help build homes for those in need.
- Each grade level participated in focused trainings related to various parts of the Mass led by Saint Bernadette priests and parish staff. Students become "experts" in different aspects

- of the Mass, including serving, responding, and lectoring
