

Clubs & Activities

American Sign Language (Grades 3-5) - The American Sign Language (ASL) Club is a welcoming and inclusive space for students interested in learning and practicing ASL while gaining a deeper understanding of Deaf culture and celebrate the beauty of visual language.

Archery (Grades 4-8) - Students learn the art of shooting and compete in 1-2 state tournaments.

Book Bee (Grades 3-8) - An academic competition where students read from a selection of books and then participate in a quiz-style competition.

Book Club (JK-2) - A small group of students who explore and discuss books together, fostering a love for reading and improving comprehension skills.

Buddy Program (PreS-1st & 6-8) - The purpose of the Buddy Program is to build community, support students in building stronger social emotional skills, and develop positive peer interactions. Older students act as role models and helpers to our younger students.

Chess Club (Grades K-8) - A group of students who come together to play and learn about chess. Whether a beginner or an experienced player, chess club offers opportunities to learn new strategies and improve your game.

Choir (Grades JK-8) - Students in grades JK-3 develop the skills to prepare for singing in the 4-8th grade church choir during school liturgies.

Crafting Emporium (Grades 2-8) - A creative space where students can learn and practice the art of crocheting while building community and sharing Christ's love through handmade projects.

Drama (Grades K-8) - Invites students to explore their God-given creativity and talents through the performing arts. Whether on stage or behind the scenes, members grow in confidence, collaboration, and communication while bringing stories to life.

Fellowship of Christian Athletes (2nd grade) - Students participate in this international organization that helps athletes unite faith and athletics, and grow their relationship with Jesus Christ.





Clubs & Activities

Governor's Cup/Quick Recall (Grades 4-8) - Students compete against other schools in an academic quiz bowl competition. Questions are divided into categories such as math, science, social studies, spelling, Arts & Humanities, and language arts.

Green Club - Students are dedicated to promoting environmental awareness and sustainability within our school or community and engage in activities aimed at reducing environmental impact.



Lego Club (Grades 1-3) - A fun, imaginative space where students come together to build, create, and explore using LEGO bricks. This club encourages teamwork, problem solving & creativity.

KYA (Grades 6-8) - A youth government program that provides hands-on experience in the executive, legislative, and judicial branches of Kentucky's state government.

KUNA (Grades 6-8) - A youth government program that focuses on international issues and diplomacy. Students participate directly in simulated international diplomacy and gain a greater appreciation for the global community.

Math Lab (Grades 4-8) - Students receive math support before or after school to support essential math skills.

Music Lessons (Grades 3-5) - Take your musical skills to the next level with private lessons offered right after school, taught by a professional music instructor! (Piano, voice, & a variety of instruments)

Morning News (8th grade) - Students produce & develop a daily news broadcast for all classrooms.






Middle School House Program

Step 3: Admissions Assessment - After a review of the complete application, we will schedule the admissions assessment for all JK-8th grade students. The assessment includes a reading and math screening along with an evaluation of language capability, the ability to follow directions and complete tasks, and conceptual skills.

Step 4: Application Review - The admissions team will thoroughly review the complete application and admissions testing results. The family will be notified of (1) Acceptance (2) Waitlist (3) Non-acceptance.
