## July 2 2023: 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

## **FEAR** and fears

Last weekend, I asked several people two questions:

First, what is your fear (or fears) right now? Do not think. Respond right away. Say whatever comes to your mind...

Second, what has been your GREATEST FEAR in your life? This is a deeper question. Take your time, all the time you want.

Not surprisingly, the first question led to a large number of different answers. Several said: I do not have any fears at this very moment. Others said: I am afraid that I will get sick, lose my job, or that my wife and my kids might become very ill.

What surprised me the most was the similarity of many answers to the second question. They centered around the word **Fear with a capital F**. Fear of the Lord... Fear of the Devil...Fear of The Enemy... FEAR OF BEING VERY SICK (no longer being able to walk, having a stroke, losing memory, Alzheimer's) and FEAR OF DEATH, the greatest Fear of all, the fear of dying and not going to Heaven.

Last week's Gospel was all about "not being afraid". Three times, Jesus told his disciples, all of us today, including myself: "BE NOT AFRAID". Three times in such a short Gospel: only 8 verses (Matthew 10: 26-33), compared to a total of 365 times in the entire Bible: both Old Testament and New Testament. THREE POWERFUL WORDS as we are all afraid of so many things every day of our life... We are so anxious!

We never forget those three powerful words as used also by Pope John Paul II when he addressed the whole world for the first time from the balcony of St Peter's (1978, beginning of his Long 26-year pontificate). The first Pope not to be Italian in over three centuries. The first Pope ever to come from a Slavic country (Poland). And here he is, speaking in a strong, heavy Polish accent: "BE NOT AFRAID. OPEN WIDE THE DOORS OF YOUR HEART TO CHRIST!"

Pope John Paul II in his own life demonstrated that he had no fear whatsoever. He was truly led by the HOLY SPIRIT! God had given him the GIFT OF

PEACE! I recall his first trip as a Pope back to Poland when he challenged openly the communist regime and dictatorship of the Government totally under the influence of the then Soviet Union... This was the beginning of the end of the all-powerful, communist Soviet Union.

None of us is called to be as courageous as St John Paul II. But last Sunday's Gospel was a wonderful opportunity for each one of us to reflect on our past, current and future fears. Jesus was very specific: "Be not afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul." Our souls are by far much more important than our bodies. They never die. Jesus invites all of us to protect our souls from continuous attacks from the devil. We are weak. We cannot do that alone. We all need Jesus Christ. WE ALL NEED TO RECEIVE THE GIFT OF PEACE FROM CHRIST!

Let us pray that the Holy Spirit will help us to open wide the doors of our hearts to Jesus Christ!

Lord Jesus, only You can give us that Peace. Only You can take away the daily anxieties that oppress us and paralyze us! May we all be open to receiving Your Gift of Peace!!!


