



### From the Desk of Fr. Joe Zabinski

Greetings people of St. Albert's,

This week, I am continuing my article from the June 6, 2021 Bulletin. I will continue with the 5 reasons I should come to Mass in person based on Ken Yasinski's Youtube video at: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dkO9HDHUs0w) I am putting Ken's thoughts into my own words here.

Reason #3 - If we stay online with the Mass, it won't take as much exercise of virtue than if we were going in person. Think about it: it takes less energy and less virtue just being in our pajamas watching Mass at home on the couch, than getting dressed up and going to Mass in person. If we don't exercise virtue in life, we will get lazy with our own prayer time, and fall away from Christ.

Reason #4- Livestreaming the Mass takes us away from our community. Being made in the image of a Triune God (the feast we just celebrated two weeks ago), we are made to be within a community of believers. One can see this stamped in our very bodies that we are not complete without another person in our lives. Because we have an innate need for a community of believers, we need to come to Mass in person.

Last reason and most important reason: We don't get to receive the Eucharist when we are not at the Mass in person. There has been a thing about receiving Our Lord spiritually in the Eucharist, but it is not the same as receiving Him in a real way through a Sacrament. While I was on NET ministries, I did not get to go to Mass daily as I had while being in seminary. Throughout those weeks and months, I felt a deep hunger within me that was only fulfilled by receiving the Eucharist. I received Our Lord in a spiritual kind of way, which was good, but it was not the same as receiving Jesus in His real and physical form in the Eucharist.

We see in these reasons that it is important to come to Mass in person rather than attending to it online. I know that some of you are nervous about the health implications in coming to Mass in person. If that is you, I was in the same position before the Lord gave me His consolation and confidence in His love and protection for me. I would get really nervous and anxious being around people in the beginning of this pandemic. I brought that to the Lord. He brought me to a place of surrender before Him. He asked me to surrender my life and my health to Him. Through the surrender novena, I was able to surrender to Him all my fears, nerves, and anxieties to Him. He brought me a deep peace and knowledge of His love for me. Now that I know He will take care of me, I am at peace and not afraid to be around people anymore.

If you are in this same camp I was, do not be afraid to take risks for Jesus. He loves you deeply. He is there in the Mass in a deeply personal way. When we go to the Mass, we are going to Heaven on earth. If we had eyes to see, we would see angels and saints around us at the Mass. Let's not forget that. Let's remember that when we go to Mass, we get to experience Heaven on earth. The heavenly realm is brought down to us on earth through the Mass. If we are afraid to go to Mass on earth, how much more would we be to go to the Mass in Heaven? Let's ask the Father for an outpouring of faith into our hearts- being willing to take a risk for Him as He has done for us.


#### St. Albert's Cemetery Update

#### **FEAST OF FAITH**

#### The Preparation of the Altar

The altar is the focal point of our churches. It is a sign of Christ in our midst; indeed, it has been said that "the altar is Christ" (Dedication of an Altar, 4). The altar is a table "on which the sacrifice of the cross is perpetuated in mystery throughout the ages until Christ comes"; but it is also the place for a festive meal: "a table at which the Church's children assemble to give thanks to God and receive the body and blood of Christ" (Dedication of an Altar, 4). Both these functions of the altar are clear in the rites for the preparation of the altar that follow the general intercessions, which remind us of the preparations we make at home for a festive meal. The deacon or altar servers come forward and, bowing, place a cloth known as a corporal (from the Latin for "body") over the altar cloth. They place the chalice, the cup to be used in the celebration of the Eucharist, and the Sacramentary or Roman Missal, which contains the prayers of the Mass, on the altar. These reverent preparations help us to focus on what is about to happen: the sharing of a holy meal, a solemn sacrifice. - Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J.S. Paluch Co.


