





From the Desk of Fr. Joe Zabinski

The Message of Christ's Love

From the proclamation of the Gospel at the beginning of the liturgy, we know that today is different, not only because we hear two Gospel passages, or because we hold palms and move in procession. Today begins Holy Week,



a time set apart, a week in which to listen, pray, reflect, and take to heart the truth of Christ's passion, crucifixion, death, and ultimately, resurrection. It takes a week, and a lifetime, to truly hear the message of Christ's love. It is difficult for us to comprehend that Jesus willingly sacrificed himself, so we must hear the story again and again. Let this week be for us a new moment of faith in which we, together with the criminal who was crucified with Christ, cry out, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Copyright © J. S. St. Albert Parishioners,

With the Homily Series of Making our Parish your spiritual home, I'm inviting all parishioners to invest in our parish. One significant way you can do that is by attending the Triduum this week.

You might ask, "What is the Triduum?"

Well, it's one of the most solemn and glorious weeks of the liturgical year. It's even more sacred than Christmas! This is because Holy Week commemorates the final week of Our Lord's life, the very purpose for which Christmas happened.

Holy Week begins today with Palm Sunday (when Jesus made his final entrance into Jerusalem) and culminates with Easter Sunday. As Holy Week progresses to its final days the solemnity heightens—The Triduum begins at sundown on Holy Thursday and ends at sundown on Holy Saturday. It is considered the most solemn part of the liturgical year. This three-day period—Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, including the Easter Vigil—is referred to as the Easter Triduum, also known as the Sacred Triduum, or the Paschal Triduum. Basically, the Sacred Triduum is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the Lamb of God laid down his life in atonement for our sins. Though it is three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us—the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. Bring yourselves and bring your children, allowing a greater experience of the mystery of Christ's Life, Death, and Resurrection—for yourselves and for our parish family. See you all here this week!

Prayers for an Invested and Blessed Holy Week! Fr. Joe Zabinski

Reflect, today, upon the contrast of emotions from Palm Sunday through Good Friday. Ponder the fear, confusion and despair that many would have had as they saw Jesus murdered. Reflect, also, upon this being a divine act by which the Father permitted this grave suffering so as to use it for the greatest good ever known. The Lord gave His life freely and calls you to do the same. Reflect upon the cross in your life. Know that the Lord can use this for good, bringing forth an abundance of mercy through your free embrace as you offer it to Him as a willing sacrifice.

My crucified Lord, when I am tempted to despair, give me hope. Help me to see your presence in all things, even in those things that are most troubling to me. May this Holy Week transform my darkest moments and weakness as I surrender all to You, my God. Jesus, I trust in You!

Divine Mercy Novena

In preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday, start the Divine Mercy Novena on Good Friday, April 15 and pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Novena prayers for nine consecutive days.

A copy of the Divine Mercy Novena is available in the narthex and as an insert in this week's bulletin. Jesus asked St. Faustina (Maria Faustina Kowalska) that the Feast of the Divine Mercy (the Sunday



following Easter) be preceded by a Novena of Chaplets to the Divine Mercy which would begin on Good Friday. "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fount of My mercy, that they may draw there from strength and refreshment and whatever graces they need in the hardship of life and, especially, at the hour of death." (1209) Additionally, He promised, "By this Novena (of Chaplets, I will grant every possible grace to souls." (796)

The Paschal Fast

All Parishioners age 18-59 are encouraged to enter into the Paschal Fast, which is the normal obligatory Fast and Abstinence on Good Friday, but continued until after the Easter Vigil, Holy Saturday night, in order to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully his Resurrection.

Solemn Good Friday Prayer Vigil

Join us on **Good Friday, April 15** from 8:30am to 4:00pm at Planned Parenthood, 671 Vandalia Street in St. Paul we remember the unborn victims of abortion while meditating on the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. We will gather beside one of the largest abortion facilities in the Midwest, Planned Parenthood. Pastors of various denominations lead us in Scripture and prayer every half hour. There is no protesting or signs, just solemn prayer, a wooden cross and our sorrowful hearts. There is no parking near the Planned Parenthood on Good Friday. We have reserved free parking at the University of St. Thomas Anderson Parking Deck at the intersection of Cretin Ave and Grand Ave in St. Paul and will be running shuttle buses all day to and from the vigil.
