







From the Desk of Fr. Joe Zabinski



"Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." Luke 15:1-2


What a foolish and arrogant thing to say! Jesus was merciful, welcoming, forgiving and loving to those who were sinners. And the Pharisees and scribes complained about this as if Jesus were doing something wrong.

On one level, it is understandable that the pride-filled scribes and Pharisees would look for anything they could to condemn Jesus. They were on a sort of "witch hunt," so to speak, seeking to find any fault they could with our Lord. So, out of the fullness of their malice, they attempted to make it look like Jesus was an awful sinner due to the fact that He spent time with sinners and welcomed them.

From a perspective of the pure truth, however, the jealousy, envy, manipulation and deception of the scribes and Pharisees are clear. The "condemnation" they uttered against Jesus was no true condemnation at all. It was a fabrication and a twisting of the truth. The truth is that Jesus' kindness to those who were sinners was a living out of His countless virtues. He was understanding, merciful, compassionate, patient, forgiving and the like. He saw troubled hearts and reached out to them in their need, especially when He could tell they were sorry, open and humble.

We may all encounter those who are religiously "selfrighteous" at times. This is an ugly sin and one that should not sit well with us. The problem is that those who are self-righteous are oftentimes also intimidating and oppressive. Those who condemn others in the name of God are hard to confront. Jesus' initial response was to ignore them and to go about His ministry of love and compassion, telling parables and helping those in need. But eventually He took these religious leaders on directly, condemning them for their pride and arrogance. https://mycatholic.life

There is still time to register for TLC - Total Lifelong Catechesis! TLC is St. Albert's family formation model of catechesis and the primary faith formation for families with school-aged children. As we enter our 15th year of TLC, we have changed our approach to better serve our families and youth. Our focus is still to build strong Catholic families in which children learn the joys of following Jesus Christ and the truths of their Faith through the witness of Christian life given by their parents; however, now TLC will center on families with children in Kindergarten through 6th Grade. Get complete details and registration for TLC at: churchofstalbert.org/tlc. All families are asked to attend the TLC Kick-Off on Wednesday, September 28 at 6:30pm.

So where do youth in **Grades 7-12** fit in? Good news. They can join us in two ways. First, we highly encourage those teens who have younger siblings participating in TLC to come with their family and volunteer for the many needs of TLC. See the TLC Registration for all the ways to volunteer and to sign up. What a great way to be of service to our parish! Second, our Youth Ministry Team has expanded their offerings for youth to grow in the faith. Looking to prepare your child for their **First Holy Communion** and **First Reconciliation**, which is available for those in 2nd grade or older? The Parent and Child Informational Meeting is on **Monday, September 12** at 6:30pm at the Parish Center.

Looking to prepare your child for the **Sacrament of Confirmation**, which is available to those in 8th grade and older? Come and learn more about the steps for preparing for Confirmation as the approach has changed and is separate from Discipleship Groups, or D-groups, and TLC. Also, learn about new opportunities available to help 8-12 graders grow in their faith. The Parent Inquiry Meeting is **Wednesday, September 14** at 7:00pm at the Parish Center. Children Liturgy of the Word begins this weekend on **September 11** during the 10am Mass. All children ages 3-6 (1st Gr) are invited to listen to the Gospel at their level of understanding. About STMA Catholic Youth Ministry

STMA Catholic Youth Ministry is something special. Not only do we have three full-time and two part-time youth ministers serving more than 700 students a year in grades 4-12, but we see the fruits year after year in the number of teens who stay involved in ministry and parish life through high school and beyond, in young adults serving as missionaries, in vocations to priesthood and religious life, and in holy Catholic marriages and growing families.

We are also blessed to have a Youth Ministry team that is constantly striving to meet teens where they are and call them into deeper relationship with Jesus through fellowship, formation, prayer, and the sacraments. This means reexamining what we are doing to see what works and changing our approach to better serve our teens and kids. To that end, this year we are tweaking our approach to Confirmation preparation and discipleship small groups, or D-groups.

Four years ago, we transitioned from traditional Confirmation classes in grades 9 and 10 to focusing on D-groups and offering Confirmation as early as grade 8. D-groups started at the beginning of the 8th-grade year and became conflated with Confirmation prep. The number of groups and leaders needed for all the 8th-graders interested in Confirmation quickly became huge, and many students, once confirmed, were not interested in continuing with a group or needed further evangelization and formation before they could really embrace discipleship.

Starting this fall:
Steps for preparing for Confirmation will be clear and separate from D-groups. Get complete details on Confirmation preparation on the Confirmation page of our parish website.
