



From the Desk of Fr. Joe Zabinski

Hello Parishioners of St Alberts!

First, I want to thank all of those who participated in this years Parish Council nomination process and their willingness to serve if elected. Thank you specifically to the Parish Council members for helping with that process. I want to announce the winners of the election, Mayen Dufner and Jack Steffl! Thank you for your willingness to accept the election and to serve on the Parish Council! May God bless you abundantly for your desire to serve in the way Christ served! I pray regularly for the Parish Council members that they may come to be models after the Heart of Jesus. We need people who are willing to model what Christ was like here on earth! These members of the Parish Council are ones who model Christ-like ways towards us. Having a consistent time of prayer everyday, making it to Mass every Sunday, Holy Days of Obligation, and even weekdays (if possible), confessing their sins regularly - at least 1x every 2 months, being involved in serving the parish community are all ways they have already demonstrated to be on the Parish Council. Being a part of the Parish Council is an honor and a place that is not for everyone. For this reason. I am grateful for these parishioners who have said 'yes' to serve.

As for the topic of this bulletin article, I have been doing a teaching series on the Mass before each Sunday Mass during the Lenten season. For this article, I wanted to talk about the distinction we have made here at St. Albert's between Sunday and other higher feast day Masses and the weekday Masses. You might have noticed that we use more elegant vestments and even a nicer chalice for these Sunday Masses, than the other weekday Masses. On Sunday, we sing, chant, play piano and organ, have multiple servers carrying various items - candles, the cross, incense, and have a different type of homily that (hopefully) is more polished and better than on the weekday. I'll let you be the judge of that one...Anyway, we have all these things on Sunday, rather than on ordinary weekday Masses. If you wonder why we got that new gold and blue chalice that was a donation from a parishioner, we use it on Sundays and not on the weekday Masses.

The distinction is because on Sunday we celebrate a mini Easter, whereas on the weekdays, we celebrate the ordinary days. I remember my Dad telling me that we needed to wear our Sunday best for Jesus. This is the reason. He was trying to teach me about this distinction. Even within the Lenten season the church allows for a reprieve from our Lenten observances on Sundays, before we go back walking in the desert with the Lord. This goes to the deeper reason for dressing up and using nicer things on Sundays. The deeper reason is that our hearts need to make a distinction between what Sunday is called to be and what we can make it out to be by our sinful humanity. We can tend to not bring any distinction of Sunday vs the other days of the week. If we dress up on Sunday and make it a nicer day of the week, we'll remember the Lord more easily and remember that the Sabbath was made for man and not man for the Sabbath (Is 58:13). It is important for us to make a rhythm of the week and not have the week all one blur so that we can keep our eyes on the most important realities in life - relationship with the Lord and our families.

Remember, one of the ways we keep holy the sabbath day is by resting with the Lord. As the Lord rested from the work

We hear today of God's unrelenting pursuit of us. Our readings tell stories of God's intense desire to share his divine life with us. From Exodus, we see how God shows endless persistence and compassion, even to those who grumble against God, or seem to have forgotten God. From the Gospel of John, we hear of how Jesus, in his extended conversation with the Samaritan woman, gives her dignity, names uncomfortable truths, and gradually leads her into a new path of faith. We can have confidence that as we bring our own confusions, fears, and failings to God, we may receive God's mercy and forgiveness. God always persists and continually finds new ways to invite people into unity with God. As Paul describes in Romans, in the cross we see how God will go to any length to demonstrate the depth and breadth of divine love.



He asked us to worship Him on Sunday in the way that pleases Him (the celebration of the Mass). With this distinction, I have highly encouraged our Ushers, Servers, Readers, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to dress up in their Sunday best. Because they are serving the Church of St Albert, they are called to be a model of this distinction just like the Parish Council members are called to be a model of holiness for all of us.


