

From the Desk of Fr. Joe Zabinski

Parishioners of St Albert,

Merry Christmas! What a blessing this day is for all of us! This day we celebrate the fact that the 2nd Person of the Blessed Trinity took on human flesh and become one with humanity in all areas except sin. He came in the likeness of our flesh so that we can come to know and picture who God the Father is- that God is a God of love, mercy, peace, justice, joy, freedom, etc- not one that is distant from us and wants nothing to do with us.

This past Advent, we have been reflecting on the gift of the Eucharist with the Eucharistic revival going on this year at a national level. For us Catholics, this gift of the Eucharist very much mirrors what the Christmas holiday is all about. At the Nativity scene, God took on human likeness and became present to us. This was an external reality that the Son of God took on out of love for us. In a similar way in the Eucharist, Jesus becomes present to us Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Jesus comes to be present to us not just in an external way from us, but he can also now take His place within us. So with the Eucharistic presence of Jesus, Jesus is now external to us and internal within us-being Lord of the whole of our being. What a great gift for us! God wants to be so intimate with us that He comes into our very bodies as food for us - to nourish and strengthen us in our journey through this life. If you would like a more in depth look at the correlations of the Nativity Scene with the Eucharist, that will be my focus for my Christmas homily.

With this, I hope that we are all able to spend some time reflecting on this reality in our hearts and how much of a gift it is for us this Christmas season.


Winter Stretch 2023
