### LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

*There will be Training Sessions for each of the Liturgical Ministries.*

#### ALTAR SERVERS

Altar Servers are on the front lines! Anyone in fourth grade or older is welcome to be an Altar Server to help the priest at Mass, assisting him by holding the Sacramentary book when needed, holding a candle during the reading of the Gospel, preparing the altar for the Eucharistic Celebration, and processing in and out with either the processional cross or a candle.

#### EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION (EMHC)

This person has a great love and respect for the Holy Eucharist! It is such an important designation that all who help this ministry are commissioned with special prayers and a blessing. At Mass the EMHC comes forward at the “Lamb of God” to receive Holy Communion, and then distributes Holy Communion to the congregation. Each week communicants have the opportunity to receive the Precious Blood by intinction. EMHCs are trained to distribute in this way as well. This person may be scheduled for daily or weekend Mass or as a Homebound Distributor.

### TOTAL LIFELONG CATECHESIS-TLC

Each month from September through May a meal is prepared and served for TLC families on a Wednesday evening. Volunteers are needed to prepare and serve the meal and to clean-up afterwards. They are humble servants who enjoy cooking and like to work behind the scenes.

### TLC Nursery

Nursery volunteers are responsible for the care and safety of a small group of children under the age of 5 during TLC sessions. They are people who enjoy children, have a responsible and caring personality and experienced with children. Both adults and teens are needed.

### VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL/ TOTUS TUUS

Volunteers who enjoy working with children and have a responsible and caring personality are needed for a week-long summer faith camp during the month of July. The day session is held for students in grades 1-5 and an evening session is for students in grades 6-12. Volunteers are needed to oversee youth, especially during snack time, lunch, recess, and clean-up while maintaining a safe environment.

A Summer Program is also offered at St. Albert's.

### PARISH FESTIVAL COMMITTEE



## THEOLOGY 101 (GRADES 9-12)

Theology 101 is an opportunity for High School youth to grow in their knowledge and understanding of our beautiful Catholic faith. We will be using the Catechism of the Catholic Church as our main text. Our goal is to get through all four sections of the Catechism in four years. Every participant must do the reading and be prepared to discuss what was read. They will be tested throughout the year through asking questions, small quizzes, and a variety of challenges both individually and as a group.
