- Strongly Opposes Embryonic Stem Cell Research
- Supports Stem Cell Research that DOES NOT Involve The Destruction of Human Embryos

The New Mexico Catholic Conference strongly objects to the use of State monies to fund embryonic stem cell research that requires the killing of a human embryo. The Church rejects the killing of embryos for the harvesting of stem cells. There are many other sources for stem cells that do not take human life. Adult stem cells have been successfully used to treat a number of illnesses without taking human life. There is also much promise in the use of stem cells taken from amniotic fluid, which also does not require the killing of human life.

Life must be protected from conception to natural death.
