Every year has its good and bad moments. 



2025 Deacon Community Retreat Evaluations

A program is to be planned for the first five years of their ministry ...” (National Directory for the Formation and Life of Permanent Deacons in the U.S.)

It's time to Report Your Continuing Education Hours!

Each year, deacons are asked to submit the hours they achieved in their continuing education and spiritual formation. Each permanent deacon who is granted faculties to function within the Archdiocese of Santa Fe is expected to complete a minimum of forty hours of continuing education each year. Hours of continuing education are determined on the basis of clock time actually spent in attending formal classes, lectures, seminars, and workshops on academic subjects related to the personal development of the deacon as an ordained minister. Newly ordained deacons must participate in their own formation as part of this requirement. Deacons are also expected to participate in an annual retreat.







If your parish is in need of another deacon, your pastor must request this in writing. The Personnel Board also can help with retirements and leaves of absence.



Once the office has received your request, and a new assignment location has been agreed to, both your current pastor and the pastor of the parish of your new assignment will also be required to submit letters. Once this is accomplished, the Archbishop will make the final decision and issue a letter with the change of assignment.



No to Women Deacons



Last month, a committee appointed by the Vatican rejected the notion of ordaining women to the permanent diaconate in a report presented to Pope Leo. The recommendation still offers a possibility for women to be ordained, but requires, according to the committee, an examination on doctrinal grounds. Two American deacons were part of the committee (Dcn. Dominic Cerrato and Dcn. James Keating). 

