First Reading-Isaiah 66:10-14c-*The Lord will prosper Jerusalem.* Lector: The word of the Lord. **Response: Thanks be to God.**

Responsorial Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20 (Alstott)



Shout joyfully to God, all the earth, sing praise to the glory of his name; proclaim his glorious praise.

Say to God, "How tremendous are your deeds!" R.

"Let all on earth worship and sing praise to you, sing praise to your name!"

Come and see the works of God,
his tremendous deeds among the children of Adam. R.

He has changed the sea into dry land; through the river they passed on foot; therefore let us rejoice in him. He rules by his might forever. **R.**

Hear now, all you who fear God, while I declare what he has done for me.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Response: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.



Priest: Lift up your hearts.


Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. Response: It is right and just.

Priest: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world.


Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

Response: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.



Communion Meditation-Crucem Tuam (Berthier)


