OLMC Missions to Haiti: Part 1

Monsignor Duncan led the first OLMC mission team to Petite Riviere de Nippes (Ti Riv) in the fall of 2003 with six parishioners. The Catholic Parish Twinning Program of the Americas linked OLMC with St. Antoine de Padua in Ti Riv. The purpose of the first mission trip was to meet the pastor, Fr. Rebecca, and learn about the needs of the parish and town. The mission was a success, leading to OLMC’s deep commitment to the people of Ti Riv.

Since that fateful trip in 2003, OLMC has sponsored 30 mission trips with over 200 missionaries, including parishioners and non-parishioners. All missionaries go to provide assistance to our Haitian brothers and sisters and come home having received even greater blessings in return. A trip to Haiti is a life-changing event for all who join a mission team.

Over the years, OLMC sponsored ten medical mission teams to both Ti Riv and Port au Prince. One dental mission and three eye clinic missions (partnered with the Lions Club) also traveled to Ti Riv. OLMC sponsored seven general missions and eight youth mission teams. While each mission team has specific goals, the overall purpose is to align in solidarity with our Haitian brothers and sisters in Christ. We work alongside Haitians, supporting their goals for improved opportunities and life. We follow the lead of the current pastor, Fr. Volcy, to determine the purpose of each mission team.

The recent kidnapping of American missionaries in Haiti emphasizes the safety risk for travelers to this most impoverished country in the Western Hemisphere. The safety of each mission team is of utmost importance for OLMC. We follow the recommendations of Fr. Volcy and trusted Haitian guides with whom our committee has years of experience. The last OLMC sponsored mission trip was in 2017. Mission trips have been on hold since that time due to the unsafe conditions and political situation. We look forward to the day when we can safely travel to Haiti again.

This Month's Theme: St. Joseph, Patron of the Dying

When we pray the Litany of St. Joseph, we recite: Patron of the Dying, pray for us. St. Joseph is also known as the Patron of a Happy Death.

There's no mention in Sacred Scripture about how or when St. Joseph died. The last time the Gospels mention St. Joseph is right after he and Mary find the twelve-year-old Jesus teaching in the temple in Jerusalem. One can deduce that St. Joseph died sometime between then and when Jesus begins public ministry, some eighteen years later.

Scripture does not reveal how he died, but it's safe to assume St. Joseph died in the arms of Jesus and Mary. A peaceful and beautiful passing to eternity after a life of obedience to God's call—a life totally devoted to the service of Jesus and Mary. He perfectly fulfilled his role in God's plan of salvation.

St. Joseph's death can be an excellent example for us and a guide for how we too can enjoy a happy, peaceful death. Let's look at three ways he does that. First, his death encourages us not to fear death when we're in the state of grace, in union with our Lord. The graces available on Joseph's deathbed are available to us on our deathbed, especially through holy Viaticum—the reception of Holy Communion by a sick person on their deathbed.

Second, St. Joseph can help us prepare for a good death by the example of his holy life, which teaches us how to properly prepare to die happily. We should not postpone or delay readying our hearts but demonstrate it daily by the way we live. The beautiful life of St. Joseph: his pious, devout life, his life filled with love for Jesus and Mary, teaches us how we should live our lives to prepare for our death. Nothing is more certain than death, and nothing more important, since at that moment, our eternity is decided.

Thirdly, St. Joseph will intercede for us for a happy death through our devotion to him. All the prayers that we pray in his honor will bring us his blessings at the hour of our death.

As part of my personal prayer each morning, I pray a Daily Act of Consecration to St. Joseph. The prayer ends: Should I take my last breath today, be by my side, and take me to heaven to be with Jesus and Mary.

I can't think of a better way to end my life on earth and enter eternity, can you?

We recently conducted a survey with our Hispanic Apostolate community for feedback regarding our Sunday Spanish Mass and programs. An overwhelming number of responders expressed the desire to have our Spanish Mass and faith formation classes earlier in the day. So we can better serve our growing Hispanic community, our Spanish Mass will move from its current 7 p.m. time to 3 p.m. beginning November 28, with Spanish faith formation classes being held from 12:30 p.m. – 2:30 p.m. This means that OLMC will no longer be offering a Sunday 7 p.m. Mass time. ••ASK THE APOLOGIST••with Steven O'Keefe•••••

Dear Apologist,

When Jesus is describing the end of the world, what did He mean when He said “the current generation” would see it? Was Jesus wrong?

In the thirteenth chapter of Mark’s Gospel, Jesus predicts a cataclysmic event which would be marked by signs in the sky and the “coming of the Son of Man”. Many interpret this as describing the final end of the world, but are confused when Jesus says it will all occur within the generation of those originally hearing Him [Mk 13:30]. Even the great Christian writer CS Lewis saw this verse as a scandal – a time when Jesus Christ was factually incorrect. What is going on here?

The answer lies in looking at the whole chapter and the corresponding accounts in the other Gospels. Those would be Matthew 24 and Luke 21. Jesus begins the prophecy by predicting the destruction of the Temple. His disciples ask when this will occur. Jesus tells them to look for sacrilege occurring in the Temple, signs in the clouds, and Jerusalem being surrounded by armies [Mt 24:15, Mt 24:30, Lk 21:20]. Then He says the current generation will live to see it come to pass. All these clues point to a different cataclysmic event; the destruction of Jerusalem in 70AD.

The signs in the clouds were, in fact, recorded by two historians contemporary with those times. The Jewish historian Josephus recorded in his account of Jerusalem’s fall that chariots and soldiers were seen in the clouds above Jerusalem [Jewish Wars 6.5.3]. The Roman historian Tacitus recorded the same thing [Histories, Book 5:13]. So while Jesus’ prediction may contain a secondary reference to the end of the world, the primary fulfillment was the destruction of the great city and the end of the Hebrew sacrificial system.


