

Pastor's Corner | Fr. Richard Doerr



Happy Easter!

I feel exceedingly blessed to pray with so many of you this weekend as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ! To those who may join us only occasionally on big feasts, and to those who are with us who are searching for a religious/spiritual connection, we offer a warm welcome to you also. We hope our celebration of the Lord's resurrection will touch your heart with God's incredible love for you. For He is risen. He is risen indeed!

I often share this Easter greeting, and I know that many of you do as well, in multiple languages I might add! This Easter greeting reminds me of a story of a courageous Christian man in the former Soviet Union. One of the most powerful men in the world in the 1930s was a man named Nikolai Ivanovich Bukharin, a Russian Communist. I read an article about him a few weeks ago that comes to mind today.

Bukharin once addressed an assembly of workers in Kyiv on the subject of atheism. He aimed his most powerful criticisms against Christianity, hurling insults and propaganda against it. His speech lasted an hour, and he verbally crucified the Christian faith and Jesus' disciples that were in the room. When he finished, Bukharin looked out smugly to see the reaction of the proletariat. He was certain that they would be with him, and he expected thunderous applause. But the reaction was silence. He encouraged questions and comments, but the crowd was hushed.

Suddenly, a worker stood up and approached the platform. When he arrived in front of the microphone, he paused and surveyed the crowd, probably weighing the costs of what he was about to say. Finally, he shouted the ancient Easter greeting: "CHRIST IS RISEN!" And en masse, the crowd rose to its feet and responded, "He is risen indeed!"

Of course, we have no idea what the consequence was for this brave soul and those who responded in faith. Perhaps when the worker approached the platform, he remembered the many times that Jesus commanded us to not be afraid! Clearly, he trusted in Divine Providence. In the oppression of the Soviet Union, he had the courage of the martyrs like the early Christians who bravely professed faith in the Risen Lord to their deaths. Their bravery inspires me still today.

Pope John Paul II once said, "Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people and hallelujah is our song." This might seem Pollyanna until we ponder the trauma that the Holy Father endured for his faith under the Nazi and communist oppression.

I am thankful for our constitutionally guaranteed religious liberty that allows us to give witness to Jesus Christ! But as we know, this right is not one that we should take for granted. Nor should we shy away from bravery professing our faith and inviting others to do the same.

During the Easter Season, we will hear the exciting stories of the Risen Lord that paved the way for such extraordinary faith. Another example is the witness of St. Faustina, the first saint of the new millennium in 2000. Among other things, she received the Divine Mercy Chaplet from Jesus Himself. Just a reminder: Next Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday, we will gather to pray a holy hour asking for Divine Mercy in our own day. BUT different from previous years, we will gather at 2 p.m. instead of 3 p.m. due to the time change in the Spanish Mass. I hope to see you there!


Springing Back from COVID!

Upcoming Policy Changes

In good news for our parish, our Mass attendance has continued to climb back toward pre-COVID numbers, slowly but surely. In fact, we just had a stretch of four out of five weekends with total Mass attendance of over 4000 persons – over 90% of our pre-COVID average!

This is great news, but it also presents some spacing challenges, particularly with Holy Week and the Easter Season upon us and no air conditioning in the narthex. For that reason, we will no longer be able to reserve the left-hand side of church for those who wear masks and wish to distance.

Please remember that we do still have one Mass at which face coverings are required: Saturday evening at 5:30 p.m. We anticipate that requirement remaining in place through Pentecost on June 5.



Dear Apologist,

Can you point out some prophecies of Jesus in the Old Testament?

There are many Messianic prophecies scattered throughout the Old Testament. Some have more predictive power than others, but there is enough data that one can make a rough sketch of when the Messiah would come, what He would do, how He would die, and how He would rise.

Regarding the arrival time of the Messiah, we can turn to Daniel 9: 25-26. This is the famous "weeks of years" prophecy which tells us the Messiah would begin His ministry 480 years after King Artaxerxes of Persia gave Nehemiah the command to rebuild the city of Jerusalem. That order would have been given around the year 450BC, which puts the time of the Messiah's ministry around 30AD. From there we can turn to Micah 5:1-3, which tells us the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem: "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."

To learn what the Messiah would do during His ministry, we can look at Malachi 3:1-4. It describes how the Messiah will form a new covenant and offer a sacrifice which is pleasing to God. Lastly, we get a preview of the death of the Messiah from Isaiah 53 and Psalm 22. They describe how He will suffer a death which involves whipping and the piercing of his hands and feet. However, the close of Psalm 22 also speaks of how this suffering servant will experience a final triumph. By drawing on all of these texts, we can begin forming an outline of the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth.

How to Report an Incident of Sexual Abuse of a Minor

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by clergy (priest or deacon) you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call Jackie Montrie M.A., LMFT, LMHC, Victim Assistance Coordinator of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana at 765.464.4988.
- 3. Thereafter, an investigation will be undertaken by or on behalf of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by someone working in a parish or school for the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana (such as a religious sister or brother, lay employee, lay volunteer, etc.), you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call our Ethics Hotline 855.375.6796, or go to dioceseoflafayetteinindiana.ethicspoint.com.

3. Call Jeanne Lausten, Director of Human Resources at 765.269.4604.
