

Pastor's Corner Fr. Richard Doerr



Memorial Day

I have been out of town for a few days on vacation with my best priest friend in the Diocese of Phoenix, Arizona. I will return to the parish on June 1. This gives me plenty of time to rest and pray for you and your intentions. Pray for me as well!

I always love this time of year in Indiana, so I am sad that I will miss it this year. Although we never went to the race on Memorial Day weekend as a family, we always did a pool - chose drivers and rooted for them. Winners received a \$10 prize, which I only won once in a rain cloud of controversy. The only time I won was in 1975. I was 9 years old and my victory was tainted by a rain delay finish. I had the winner Bobby Unser while my brother had Johnny Rutherford in second place and called foul! Let's hope and pray for a clean, rain-free, and safe race this year!

As the son of a Viet Nam veteran, I have tremendous respect and pastoral concern for those who have stepped forward to defend our country. Some carry the wounds of war for the rest of their lives, physically, emotionally, and spiritually. They deserve our prayers, respect, and service.

Observing Memorial Day is not the glorification of war. What we remember and honor on Memorial Day is heroic sacrifice, much like we honor martyrs in the Church. We acknowledge those who nobly gave of themselves, even unto death, for a purpose that was greater than themselves.

Since the days just following the end of the Civil War, Americans have gathered in late May to honor those who died in military service for their country. In the spirit of the day, I also recall, honor, and pray for all those we know who have lived lives of service and sacrifice for the good of others—policemen, firemen, border patrol officers, medical caregivers, priests, sisters, and so on. Notice that many of those on that list are often maligned, largely because of the indiscretions of a few bad apples. I see through the media tendency to doubt altruism and self-sacrifice and honor the majority of those who serve for the good of humanity.

The United State Conference of Catholic Bishops had provided a beautiful Memorial Day prayer. Perhaps if you're having a cookout, you can include it with your meal prayer. It certainly serves to focus on Memorial Day as more than just a three-day weekend to start the summer.

God of power and mercy, you destroy war and put down earthly pride. Banish violence from our midst and wipe away our tears, that we may all deserve to be called your sons and daughters. Keep in your mercy those men and women who have died in the cause of freedom and bring them safely into your kingdom of justice and peace. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

If you are a veteran, thank you most especially for your service.

At the end of March, our diocese officially lifted all its remaining COVID restrictions. The one exception is that the Precious Blood will not be offered at Communion until further notice.

After consultation with staff and the Liturgy Council, we have determined the following upcoming changes at Mass.

 - NO 6:45 p.m. Mass
- 2. Hand sanitizing stations will be removed; masks still available in the narthex.
- 3. 11 a.m. Mass will continue to be livestreamed until further notice.

As always, for those who cannot attend Mass in person due to illness, please contact the Parish Office if you would like Holy Communion brought to you.

We understand that not everyone will be happy with these changes, and that others will be ecstatic! Please be assured that these decisions were made prayerfully, seeking to best serve the needs of our parish.

As a parish that has a center specifically to helping families in need, we ask that you refer anyone standing outside our church after Masses asking for money to the Merciful HELP Center so that we may help the family in a wholistic way. The families that stand outside of our church have been offered food, drink, diapers, and other assistance but have refused. The MHC is open 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and Saturday morning from 8 - 11:30 a.m. Information cards can be found in the back of church.



Dear Apologist,

I was told that the ascension accounts of Acts and Luke contradict. Do they?


The Gospel of Luke and Acts both give accounts of the ascension of our Lord. Some believe the two accounts contradict one another. The first thing to remember is that they were both written by Luke, so it would seem strange for Luke to contradict himself.

Acts 1:3-11 says Jesus joined His apostles, told them to stay in Jerusalem until Pentecost, taught them for forty days, and took them to Bethany where He ascended. Luke 24:50 says Jesus met his apostles, told them to stay in Jerusalem, and took them out to Bethany where He ascended. There is no mention of the 40 days. However, Luke didn't say there wasn't 40 days. Rather, he compressed the events in the Gospel, hitting the highlights before ending the book. In Acts he gave more details.

Something like this also happens between Acts 9:25 and Acts 9:26. It says Paul escaped Damascus and went to Jerusalem. But in Galatians 1:15-18 you read that after Paul escaped from Damascus he went to Arabia, returned to Damascus for 3 years, and then finally traveled to Jerusalem. If you just read the text of Acts 9:25-26, you'd think there was nothing in between Paul's escape from Damascus and his return to Jerusalem. Paul's letter reveals there is a whole 3 years between those two verses.

The Biblical writers didn't feel the need to include every detail and every length of time. They could write in a way that gives the appearance of direct continuity, but really entailed a longer period which is compressed for the sake of space or narrative continuity. Thus, Luke knew the events of the resurrection were stretched out over forty days and was not trying to assert otherwise when he concluded his gospel.

How to Report an Incident of Sexual Abuse of a Minor

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by clergy (priest or deacon) you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call Jackie Montrie M.A., LMFT, LMHC, Victim Assistance Coordinator of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana at 765.464.4988.
- 3. Thereafter, an investigation will be undertaken by or on behalf of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by someone working in a parish or school for the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana (such as a religious sister or brother, lay employee, lay volunteer, etc.), you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call our Ethics Hotline 855.375.6796, or go to dioceseoflafayetteinindiana.ethicspoint.com.

3. Call Jeanne Lausten, Director of Human Resources at 765.269.4604.
