Pastor's Corner

Happy Labor Day!

After my mother's death this past February, I temporarily inherited a box of family photos that will be distributed over the next few months at family gatherings. I have had the occasion to look through some of them which brings a smile to my face. I came across several older pictures, particularly of my grandfather coming home from a hard day's work, that have spoken to me greatly. They come to mind this weekend as we observe Labor Day Weekend.

My grandfather came from a large Polish immigrant family that settled around car manufacturing plants in Anderson, Indiana. I remember him as a very smart man though not well educated. He went to school until maybe the end of junior high school and did not return. My mother relayed to us that the problem was shoes. That is, he didn't have a decent pair. When my great grandfather died fairly young, there simply was not sufficient resources for the family of 13 children. So began my grandfather's career at Delco Remy in his mid-teens. When he retired in his 60s, he had worked there for almost 50 years and was a well-respected plant supervisor.

I found a picture of his retirement party. I even framed it to remind me of his hard work. We lived in Illinois and my parent's decided to surprise him by attending. He took us on a tour. I remember loud noises, hot machines and hard-working men, many of whom were veterans of foreign wars. I've always wondered what those workers were exposed to in a time when we really did not understand the effects of such emissions. Sadly, my grandfather's retirement only lasted a few shorts years.

Of course, if you've been to Anderson lately, nearly all of those factories have closed leaving buildings to decay. Predictions of more sophisticated automation in the future does not bode well for those who wish to work by the sweat of their brow as fewer and fewer workers are needed. Recently, however, there has been a slight increase in respect for men and women who "work the trades," that keep our nation moving. It is probably because we notice when they have been absent from their posts post-Covid which is an inconvenience to us. Instead of being irritated by those who have shown up, perhaps an extra prayer for them is in order.

I think it is important to remind ourselves that Jesus was a laborer. He learned skills from St. Joseph, who is often described as St. Joseph the Worker. He also chose laborers as his first disciples. When he began his earthly ministry, it was natural that Jesus used parables about laborers that his audience could understand. In our Catholic tradition, work is more than a way to make a living. It is not a burden, but a blessing. Work is an expression of our dignity and a contribution to the common good. In spiritual terms, work is a way to participate in God's continuing work of creation and labor is a means to enhance the dignity of the person

For many, Labor Day is part of a long weekend that signifies the end of summer and the closing of the neighborhood pool, or the beginning of school football season. Let us remember that Labor Day is a national holiday in which we celebrate the economic and social contributions of workers.

These are the men and women that we celebrate on Labor Day. It seems to me that it would be a wonderful gesture to pray for workers on Labor Day. Maybe more of us can come to mass on Monday to pray for their intentions. And finally, maybe we can make an effort to thank workers who make our lives better!






Stephen Ministry

Not Ready to Commit to a Weekly Hour?

- Rotate covering an hour with someone else, or find an accountablility partner to make sure you go a certain amount of time
- Commit to going monthly or every other week
- Become a substitute
- Start out with a few minutes then gradually increase over time

Whatever you decide, it's important to stick with it! Spending time with our Lord should be a top priority. While there's no doubt that we can pray anywhere, there are special graces that can be received by praying before the Blessed Sacrament. If you're skeptical, try spending some time each week with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and see what happens. An hour is ideal, but if you can only spend 15 minutes, you will still receive many graces. Consider signing up for an hour to help stay committed to going!

Dear Apologist,

Why doesn't God just annihilate the devil?

Saint Peter says in his first letter, "Discipline yourselves, keep alert. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour" [1Pet 5:8]. This passage invites the question you pose: If God knows that Satan is a danger to us, why not annihilate him and spare us all the trouble?

The core reason is found in the book of Wisdom. In chapter 11 we read: "For you love all things that exist and detest none of the things that you have made. For you would not have made anything if you had hated it. How would anything have endured if you had not willed it?" This gives us the main reason why God doesn't annihilate Satan; God even loves the Devil. As weird as that seems, the love which God has for Satan is the same unconditional love which holds you and the rest of reality in existence.

But what about all the harm Satan causes? This is the more difficult question because it is tied into the problem of evil more broadly. Saint Augustine had the following to say about why God would allow evil: "Since God is the highest good, He would not allow any evil to exist in His works, unless His omnipotence and goodness were such as to bring good even out of evil." In other words, God allows His creatures to choose evil because He plans to use these choices to produce even greater goods. JRR Tolkein captured this in the Silmarillion, when the Iluvatar said to Melkor: "And thou, Melkor, shalt see that no theme may be played that hath not its uttermost source in Me, nor can any alter the music in My despite. For he that attempteth this shall prove but Mine instrument in the devising of things more wonderful, which he himself hath not imagined."

How to Report an Incident of Sexual Abuse of a Minor

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by clergy (priest or deacon) you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call Jackie Montrie M.A., LMFT, LMHC, Victim Assistance Coordinator of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana at 765.464.4988.
- 3. Thereafter, an investigation will be undertaken by or on behalf of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by someone working in a parish or school for the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana (such as a religious sister or brother, lay employee, lay volunteer, etc.), you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call our Ethics Hotline 855.375.6796, or go to dioceseoflafayetteinindiana.ethicspoint.com.

3. Call Jeanne Lausten, Director of Human Resources at 765.269.4604.
