I am so grateful. I am filled with gratitude for the great blessing that is our common faith. I am thankful for our savior Jesus Christ, born in the radical simplicity of a cave in the little town of Bethlehem 2000 years ago. I am grateful for the thousands of Catholics worshipping with us this weekend and receiving our Eucharistic King in Holy Communion — If you are new to our community, welcome! This year our construction has added yet another complexity to our Christmas celebrations. I want to especially thank our parish staff for their hard work and preparations. Merciful HELP Center Furniture Needs

The Merciful HELP Center Furniture Crew has been working so hard to meet the need for basic furniture for families in need in our community!

We are really in severe need of twin and queen mattresses, box springs and bed rails! We need 18 sets of twins and 14 sets of queen. It is always our goal to get everyone in beds that we know are on the floor.

We accept mattresses from single family dwellings only in Hamilton County. Mattresses need to be less than 20 years old, and have no stains, or tears. The cannot be from apartments, dorms, retirement homes or storage spaces. We need donators to understand, if we get one bed bug in our furniture building, we will loose ALL donations and will not be able to assist people. Buildings with connected walls have more bed bug difficulties and you may not even be aware!

We will come and get them from your garage! **If you email: furniture@mercifulhelpcenter.org, we will arrange a pick up!**

We only accept basic furniture, such as twin, full and queen size bed, box springs and red rails, dressers, couch or love seats, living room chairs, recliners, lift chairs, kitchen table and chairs. We will also accept coffee tables, end tables and bed side tables or any small tables that can be used for the purpose of holding a lamp or C-Pap machine.

We do not have the capacity to store anything beyond basic need. Our mission is to supply the most basic needs to families in need. Our goal is to get people off the floor, sleeping in a bed, eating and doing homework at a table, and spending family time on a sofa or chair. We are a ministry to help families meet their most basic needs. We have limited storage capacity!

Some things we would like to make parishioners aware of is: we do not accept TV's, sleeper sofas, hutches, storage cabinets, outside furniture, king sized beds, and sectionals or gas appliances, dishwashers or built in microwaves. The people we serve mainly live in small places with small rooms. We pick up from garage's. We cannot enter homes.

Please email furniture@mercifulhelpcenter.org if you have furniture you would like to share with a family in need. Please give us 48 hours to respond. The Merciful HELP Center is a volunteer organization, and the furniture ministry is staffed with volunteers who are dedicated and need you to be patient, kind and understanding when they cannot accept furniture that is outside of our parameters!

Dear Apologist,

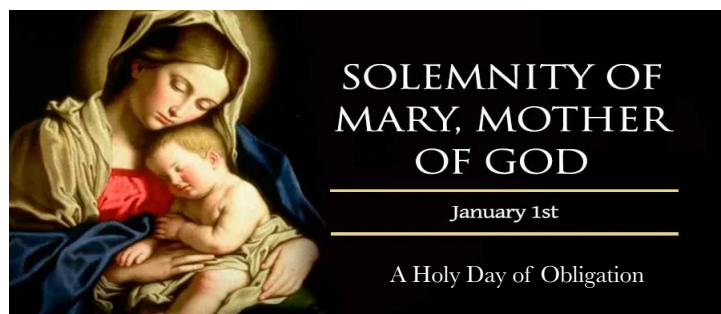
I heard Jesus was born sometime before 1AD. Is that true?

The exact dating of Jesus' birth has been a question for much of Christian history. The Bible itself gives us a number of clues. Matthew's Gospel tells us it happened when Herod was the king of Judea [Matt 2:1]. Luke's Gospel says Augustus was the reigning Roman emperor at the time [Luke 3:1]. He also says Jesus began His ministry in the 15th year of Tiberius' reign, when He was about 30 years old [Luke 3:23]. Lastly, Luke says the birth coincided with the first census which took place when Quirinius was the governor of Syria [Luke 2:2]. Let's look at all of these.

The reign of Augustus lasted from 27BC to 14AD. So that doesn't tell us much. Luke's note about Jesus beginning His ministry in the 15th year of Tiberius bears more fruit. If Tiberius became emperor in 14AD, his 15th year would be 28AD. Subtracting 30 years would give you 3BC (because there is no '0' AD). Some people say this is contradicted by Matthew's detail about Herod still being king, because Herod's death is commonly dated to 4BC. However, some scholars believe the 4BC dating involves a counting error and the real date is 1BC.

The last detail is the census. Again, Luke (supposedly) says Jesus was born the year of the first census during Quirinius' reign as governor of Syria. However, Quirinius wasn't installed to that office until 6AD. What gives? One promising solution is that the Greek word for "first" in Luke 2:2 should actually be rendered as "before". Thus the sentence would read: "This census took place before the time when Quirinius was governor of Syria." This would reconcile Luke's various time indicators and point to Jesus being born around 3BC.

How to Report an Incident of Sexual Abuse of a Minor

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by clergy (priest or deacon) you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
2. Call Jackie Montrie M.A., LMFT, LMHC, Victim Assistance Coordinator of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana at 765.464.4988.
3. Thereafter, an investigation will be undertaken by or on behalf of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by someone working in a parish or school for the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana (such as a religious sister or brother, lay employee, lay volunteer, etc.), you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
2. Call our Ethics Hotline 855.375.6796, or go to dioceseoflafayetteinindiana.ethicspoint.com.

3. Call Jeanne Lausten, Director of Human Resources at 765.269.4604.
