

Mary, The Mother of God

Happy New Year!

The title "Mother of God" goes back as far as the fourth century and quite possibly earlier. The other term associated with this day is the Greek word Theotokos or "The God-bearer." It was officially consecrated as Catholic doctrine at the Council of Ephesus in 431 and became the first Marian dogma of the Church. Historians tell us that at the end of the Council of Ephesus, crowds of people marched through the streets shouting: "Praised be the Theotokos!"

This doctrine is based on the doctrine of the incarnation, as expressed by St. Paul in his letter to the Galatians 4. That is, "God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law." The Council also affirmed the findings of the Council of Nicea that taught about Jesus' two natures—fully human and divine. Further, his two natures cannot be separated. So as Mary was the mother of Jesus' humanity, she is also the mother of his divinity. The Church also affirmed the title "Mary, Mother of God" at the Second Vatican Council. In its chapter on Mary's role in the Church, the Dogmatic Constitution "Lumen Gentium" ("Light of the People"), the Fathers of the Council called Mary "Mother of God" 12 times.

World Day of Peace

On this day, the Catholic Church also celebrates the World Day of Peace, a tradition established by Pope Paul VI and confirmed by Pope John Paul II, Pope Benedict, and now Pope Francis. The United States Conferences of Catholic Bishops suggest a three-pronged approach.

- 1. **Pray for Peace.** This includes praying for those currently in war torn areas like Ukraine, but also in our streets and in our public conversations in our own country. A simple internet search revealed that there are wars in Ethiopia and Yemen, looming humanitarian catastrophe in Afghanistan, and a deepening political crisis in Myanmar. Global powers in standoffs over Ukraine, Taiwan, Korea and Iran's nuclear program.
- 2. Learn. As faithful citizens, we must seek to understand the political and social issues that lead to poverty and conflict that threatens the lives of our brothers and sisters throughout the world. For example, join us for Gospel of Life lectures, including January 22 after the 5:30 PM Mass with Kevin Murphy, a former parishioner and staff attorney at Notre Dame Law School's Exoneration Justice Clinic. Their mission is to assist wrongfully convicted incarcerated prisoners. More information to come about this extraordinary work!
- 3. Act. Join tens of thousands of Catholics who advocate for policies that seek justice and peace in the U.S. and around the world. Also, consider helping refugees escaping international violence who seek help at our Matthew 25 Center.

During this year of our Lord, let us follow the example of our Blessed Mother, the Mother of God. Let us realize our communal power to be agents of peaceful change in the world. Let us bring Christ to our broken world during this New Year!


Donunt Ministry


A Most Sincere Thank You

Merciful HELP Center Furniture Needs

The Merciful HELP Center Furniture Crew has been working so hard to meet the need for basic furniture for families in need in our community!

We are really in severe need of twin and queen mattresses, box springs and bed rails! We need 18 sets of twins and 14 sets of queen. It is always our goal to get everyone in beds that we know are on the floor.

We accept mattresses from single family dwellings only in Hamilton County. Mattresses need to be less than 20 years old, and have no stains, or tears. The cannot be from apartments, dorms, retirement homes or storage spaces. We need donators to understand, if we get one bed bug in our furniture building, we will loose ALL donations and will not be able to assist people. Buildings with connected walls have more bed bug difficulties and you may not even be aware!

We will come and get them from your garage! If you email: furniture@mercifulhelpcenter.org, we will arrange a pick up!

We only accept basic furniture, such as twin, full and queen size bed, box springs and red rails, dressers, couch or love seats, living room chairs, recliners, lift chairs, kitchen table and chairs. We will also accept coffee tables, end tables and bed side tables or any small tables that can be used for the purpose of holding a lamp or C-Pap machine.

We do not have the capacity to store anything beyond basic need. Our mission is to supply the most basic needs to families in need. Our goal is to get people off the floor, sleeping in a bed, eating and doing homework at a table, and spending family time on a sofa or chair. We are a ministry to help families meet their most basic needs. We have limited storage capacity!

Some things we would like to make parishioners aware of is: we do not accept TV's, sleeper sofas, hutches, storage cabinets, outside furniture, king sized beds, and sectionals or gas appliances, dishwashers or built in microwaves. The people we serve mainly live in small places with small rooms. We pick up from garage's. We cannot enter homes.

Please email furniture@mercifulhelpcenter.org if you have furniture you would like to share with a family in need. Please give us 48 hours to respond. The Merciful HELP Center is a volunteer organization, and the furniture ministry is staffed with volunteers who are dedicated and need you to be patient, kind and understanding when they cannot accept furniture that is outside of our parameters!

When they saw this, they made known the message that had been told them about this child.

All who heard it were amazed by what had been told them by the shepherds.

And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart.

Then the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, just as it had been told to them.

When eight days were completed for his circumcision, he was named Jesus, the name given him by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.

About The Gospel


Today's reading is a continuation from the Gospel proclaimed at the Christmas Mass at midnight. In it the shepherds act upon the message they receive from the angel and go to find Jesus in the manger in Bethlehem. In their visit to the manger, the shepherds find things just as the angel had said. The shepherds' visit, therefore, is a moment of fulfillment, manifestation, and the beginning of the salvation we receive through Christ.

In the context of today's Solemnity, this reading also helps us focus on Mary as the Mother of God. The reading tells us at least three things about Mary as a mother. First, Mary is described as a reflective person, keeping the reports of the shepherds in her heart. Second, we are reminded of how obedient Mary was to God when she named the baby Jesus as the angel Gabriel had directed. Third, this reading shows Mary and Joseph faithfully observing their Jewish tradition by having Jesus circumcised.



Dear Apologist,

How do I respond to my friend who says Catholics show too much honor to Mary?

In Romans 13:17, Paul says we should "pay [...] respect to whom respect is due, honor to whom honor is due." So we need to begin by asking: "What is the appropriate amount of honor owed to Mary?" Let's take an account.

In Luke 1:46-55, Mary prophecies about the mercy and justice of God, as well as the honor she will receive in the future. And if we look at Matthew 10:41, Jesus encourages us to honor prophets.


In Luke 2:35, Simeon describes the suffering Mary will experience as part of God's plan of salvation. He says, "A sword will pierce your own soul too." Correspondingly, in Paul's letter to the Philippians, he instructs his readers to give great honor to people who have suffered for God's sake [Phil 2:29].

In John's Passion account, he recalls Jesus saying to him, regarding Mary, "Behold, your mother" [Jn 19:26]. Jesus' statement describes the new relationship we have with His mother as disciples.

Lastly, if one looks through the Old Testament, we see that in the Davidic monarchies the mother of the king was considered the queen of that kingdom. Jesus is the reigning Davidic King, which would make His mother - Mary - the queen.

Thus, you should not feel the least bit defensive when challenged on how much we honor Mary. You are not the one who is out of bounds. How much honor is due to Mary? Going from the Bible alone, we would owe her the honor due to a mother, a martyr, a prophet, a queen.

How to Report an Incident of Sexual Abuse of a Minor

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by clergy (priest or deacon) you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call Jackie Montrie M.A., LMFT, LMHC, Victim Assistance Coordinator of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana at 765.464.4988.
- 3. Thereafter, an investigation will be undertaken by or on behalf of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by someone working in a parish or school for the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana (such as a religious sister or brother, lay employee, lay volunteer, etc.), you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call our Ethics Hotline 855.375.6796, or go to dioceseoflafayetteinindiana.ethicspoint.com.

3. Call Jeanne Lausten, Director of Human Resources at 765.269.4604.
