

- PLEASE NOTE: Our group discount as a parish is only for adults who wish to register without children. If you plan to register with your child (18 years old and under) you receive the best discount by registering as a family directly through the NEC's website (use the URL above).
- As a parish, the maximum number of group-discounted tickets we are able to purchase is 200. This number is set by the National Eucharistic Congress.
- We will be accepting Pre-Registrations until March 19, 2023. Anyone who pre-registers after the first 200 will be on our waitlist. We will close the pre-registration if we greatly exceed 200. Pre-Register using the following URL or scanning the QR Code below: https://bit.ly/OLMCNEC
- By pre-registering, you are committing to pay for your tickets. We will be contacting you starting March 20, 2023, to collect payment. Registration is transferable if needed, but tickets are nonrefundable.
- The two-week window to submit payment for your ticket(s) is from March 20, 2023, to April 2, 2023. If payment is not received, your ticket will be forfeited.
- The only benefit to purchasing your individual adult ticket through our Parish bulk discount is the discount itself – this does not ensure group seating.

#### **College Newman Centers:**




## **CFF: Children's Faith Formation**



## •• ASK THE APOLOGIST •• with Steven O'Keefe•••••••

#### Dear Apologist,

#### Could artificial intelligences have souls?

Previous generations have wondered about whether mankind's creations might someday have lives of their own, but these were musings about far-off scenarios. However, as artificial intelligences continue to increase in their complexity and capability, these questions are becoming more and more important to us today.

The first reason why people wonder whether AI's have souls is because they a growing more able to mimic our behavior. We instinctively regard something which is mimicking human behavior as sharing in our nature. That instinct has allowed us to recognize humanity in one another. So an AI which mimics human responses and creativity triggers that instinct powerfully. But imagine this: Suppose there was a computer running a simple Excel spreadsheet. In that spreadsheet was every question a human could think to ask paired with a perfectly appropriate and human-sounding response. Every time a user types in a question, the spreadsheet looks it up and prints out the corresponding reply. To a human observer, the program would seem impeccably human and rational. But underneath the surface it has all the intelligence of the CTRL+F function. All this is to say that we cannot go by behavior alone when asking whether a robot has a soul. We have to ask the deeper question of whether the AI shares our nature.

Both divine revelation and human reason point us to the idea that human beings have both a material and spiritual aspect. Regarding that spiritual aspect, the Church says the following: "Every spiritual soul is created immediately by God - it is not 'produced' by the parents. It is because of its spiritual soul that the body made of matter becomes a living human body" [CCC 365-366]. The important take-away is that rational souls are immaterial, produced by God, and give life to a biological organism. None of this can be said of an AI, which is a program running on a silicon chip.

## Scripture Readings —

#### Week of March 5

#### How to Report an Incident of Sexual Abuse of a Minor

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by clergy (priest or deacon) you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call Jackie Montrie M.A., LMFT, LMHC, Victim Assistance Coordinator of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana at 765.464.4988.
- 3. Thereafter, an investigation will be undertaken by or on behalf of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by someone working in a parish or school for the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana (such as a religious sister or brother, lay employee, lay volunteer, etc.), you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call our Ethics Hotline 855.375.6796, or go to dioceseoflafayetteinindiana.ethicspoint.com.

3. Call Jeanne Lausten, Director of Human Resources at 765.269.4604.
