

Feast of the Holy Family

I was feeling no talgic a few days ago and bought a few pieces of an Italian nativity scene for Christmas. My brother and mother bought me Mary, Jesus and Joseph years ago and I looked online with the hopes that there might be a few extra pieces. You know, maybe a few animals and a shepherd or something. As it turns out, I wasn't disappointed. There were about 100 pieces to the set! That's not a nativity set! Nativity sets are about depravity not abundance. That's more like a complete Christmas market. Ridiculous!

Despite the images of comfortable nativity scenes complete with sufficient food, people and other accoutrement, the original Christmas was anything but cozy. A poor woman nine months pregnant rides 75 miles on the back of a donkey over bumpy (ouch) and dusty roads with her husband, Joseph. If that isn't bad enough, she is forced to have her baby in a dirty stable. She and her husband Joseph were only being obedient to civil authorities who called for a census to maintain as much power and control as possible. Then came a flight into Egypt that wasn't exactly a holiday weekend. They were running for their lives, seeking asylum in a foreign land. As a pre-teen, the son goes missing for several days. In short, even with a nearly perfect family, there were still challenges, tense moments, and misunderstandings. Welcome to family life!

But by assuming a human body and entering a human family, Jesus elevated its dignity. The family, up until then, was good, but becomes an instrument of sanctification and growth in holiness due to the Holy Family. Thus, we celebrate the Holy Family on the Sunday after Christmas, and we ask for the grace to emulate it in our lives.

This time of year, it is easy to become convinced that the chaos of a noisy family life is a distraction to holiness. But the Feast of the Holy Family reminds us otherwise. It reminds us of the universal call to holiness--that all states in life offer opportunities to grow in faith, hope, and love, including family life, if approached correctly. Grandparents can uniquely offer support to grandchildren for example. Adult children are often in the position to offer care to their elderly parents. Children can become holy in obedience to their parents and so on.

Think about it. Jesus spent 90% of his life in a hidden way. He worked with his dad in the family business. He was a tekton, which was a craftsman or woodworker. Mary, the holiest of all creatures, changed diapers, cooked, and cleaned. She also assisted her neighbors, like we see during the wedding feast of Cana. It follows that the secret to holiness is not to do extraordinary things, but to do ordinary things with love as Mother Teresa often said.

My prayer is that during the holidays, you will see family time not as a time of fatigued nerves, but as a time to grow in holiness through how you love one another in your family. Perhaps you can even work a little harder to make the season bright. As the song goes, "Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me...'

During that time, the parents then meet separately from their children with a child psychologist to learn effective co-parenting strategies "Transitions" is held at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Wednesdays, April 17, 2024 beginning from 6:30 - 8:00 pm. This includes a free homemade meal each week for the family.




New Altar Server Training

This Week: St. Stephen

- Feast day: December 26
- One of the first ordained Christian deacons and the first Christian martyr
- Accused of blasphemy, put on trial, and testified against by false witnesses brought by the Sanhedrin
- Was filled with wisdom and saw a vision of Jesus at the right hand of God the Father during his trial defense
- Crowd drove him out of the city and stoned him to death
- Saul of Tarsus (later the famous St. Paul), a vigorous persecutor of early Christians, witnessed St. Stephen's trial and martyrdom



Dear Apologist,

My teenage daughter wants to know what the Bible means when it says wives should submit to their husbands? How do you explain this?

The New Testament contains three instances where we read the dual command for women to submit to their husbands and for husbands to selflessly love their wives. The most detailed of these is in Ephesians 5. There the Apostle explains that by conforming to this pattern, husbands and wives become images of Christ and the Church, and that in a mysterious way it was God's intention from the beginning of the world to have men and women form this living icon. There are some who try to explain away the "submission" command by saying it was just a cultural artifact of ancient times. But it is difficult to imagine that God eternally intended men and women to form an icon of Christ and the Church, only for it to become an outdated cultural artifact. So we're left with the fact that the New Testament teaches a principle of male leadership in marriage.

As for explaining this to people like your daughter, I've found the following to be true: This teaching is terrifying when considered in the abstract. People's imaginations race toward worst-case scenarios, and many are tempted to echo the words of the Apostles: "If this is the situation between a husband and wife, it is better not to marry" [Matt 19:10]. Therefore, I'd want to avoid abstract consideration of this Biblical injunction and stay laser-focused on concrete examples. Identify couples who you believe are beautifully living in the way Paul described. Point to married men whom she respects and ask, "Would it be difficult living under the leadership of someone like that?" From there the task before her becomes plain: Find a righteous man of God who is worthy of her trust, and settle for nothing less.

How to Report an Incident of Sexual Abuse of a Minor

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by clergy (priest or deacon) you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call Jackie Montrie M.A., LMFT, LMHC, Victim Assistance Coordinator of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana at 765.464.4988.
- 3. Thereafter, an investigation will be undertaken by or on behalf of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by someone working in a parish or school for the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana (such as a religious sister or brother, lay employee, lay volunteer, etc.), you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

- 1. Make a report to Child Protective Services by calling 800.800.5556 or local law enforcement.
- 2. Call our Ethics Hotline 855.375.6796, or go to dioceseoflafayetteinindiana.ethicspoint.com.

3. Call Jeanne Lausten, Director of Human Resources at 765.269.4604.
