

FROM FR. LEO



3rd Sunday of Advent

"Be Patient!" These first words of James in our second reading sum up what follows. James is encouraging patients as an important aspect of following Christ. For me, being patient is hard. It is much easier for me to be impatient than it is for me to be patient.

I asked myself why? I have come to the conclusion that I want, what I want, now. There are times when this kind of assertiveness is proper. In critical situations immediate action

is needed and good leadership moves in and acts.

At other times fast action may be a detriment. We may jump to conclusions missing what might be truly helpful. Sometimes God's will is not our own. At times we need to put our problem solving in the hands of God. Our being patient gives God the time to form us in his image and enlighten us to what is holy and good moving forward.

Just as we need to slow down and smell the roses, sometimes we need patience to know the love and will of God.

In the gospel John sends some of his disciples to determine if Jesus is the one. When asked, Jesus doesn't say yes. Such a claim would not be helpful. Instead, he tells them to tell John what they see. "The blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear and the dead are raised."

So, it isn't what we claim ourselves to be that defines us, it is what we do. Jesus came for us and not for himself. In this, Jesus joins humility with patients to be our guide for living in the Spirit and bringing the Kingdom to earth as it is in heaven.
