

Second Sunday Advent

There is a wonderful moment in the movie *The Mission* when after killing his younger brother in a dual over a woman, the elder brother joins the missionaries as a way to repent for his sin. As he is carrying a lot of baggage on his back up a very steep mountain side, making two steps losing three, he finally gets near the top where the priests are waiting. When he gets near them, one of the priest cuts the rope holding all the extra weight to his body. Everything rolls down the hill in a symbolic gesture that his repentance has been accepted by God. Free of the load, he

continues with them to bring faith to the Indians in South America.

This great moment teaches us what it means to repent as St. John the Baptist urges in the gospel. We need to sincerely regret, or have remorse for, our wrongdoing or sin, but there is a moment when forgiveness becomes real and the grace of God makes us whole after our fall. When our faith in Christ is strong we learn to forgive ourselves because of our love for Christ and the inner experience of his deep love for us.

In that experience we are changed for ever. We will think different, act different and love deeply. Repentance is a gift and blesses us with grace to live freely, without fear, in the presence of God at all times.

This week is a good time for each of us to think of something that would be good for us to change. Maybe a resentment, or a emotional wound that keeps us from living in peace. We can all acknowledge something and ask God to guide us with his grace to heal. This is where our faith in Christ comes alive. He loves us, does not condemn us, but is always for us bringing us to share more deeply in his divine life now and for ever.

Special request from Fr. Leo:

Dear people of Our Lady of Lourdes,

Advent begins this Sunday. A time to solemnly reflect on the incarnation of Christ. I would like to invite couples with new born babies to reflect on what it was like to prepare for a birth and all the thought and work that went into that. Then share what the birth was like and how life changed in the weeks following. Things like less sleep, but also the joy at sustains such an experience.

I ask you to share with me because I think your experience is what the season of Advent is all about. A time of anticipation, change, birth, hope, joy and new life. As I reflect on what you share, I may find ways to weave your thoughts into homilies in this season.

Our Parish History

Our Lady of Lourdes is the oldest continuously used church in the city of Minneapolis. In 1877, the growing French-Canadian community bought the church from the First Universalist Society. Constructed in 1854 in what was the Town of St. Anthony, our parish is the first parish in the United States to be named in honor of Our Lady of Lourdes.
