FROM FR. LEO



There is an obvious contrast between the Magi and Herod in the narrative we just heard. On the one hand we have those who came from the East to find the new born King. We don't know much about them. It is speculated that they were priest of another religion, or magicians or even kings as it is translated later. Who ever they were, it is clear they are spiritual seekers and are seeking the new born King. They are blessed because it is by light, a star, that they are guided.

Once they meet Jesus, Mary and Joseph they are overjoyed. They celebrate by giving the new born King gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. After their homage these three spiritual seekers are guided by God to go home by another route and not inform Herod of the child's location.

We contrast these three kind men with Herod, who when he hears there is a new born king, feels threatened and immediately wants to kill him. I can't imagine that level of paranoia. But being so possessed by the need for power, he acts irrationally. He tries to be clever and lies about wanting to pay homage to the new born king. The irony is that the child could have made him truly rich in what mattered, but he was about power - not love. Homicide, not homage.

The Magi return by a different way and leave Herod in the cold. Sadly, Herod can't let go of this and later orders the killing of the holy innocence.

Matthew's hope in sharing this narrative is that we might choose to be spiritual seekers and seek the Lord at all times. The star is always there for us. The light and love of God eggs us on to goodness. So, no matter how dark it is, we will always have God's love and light to guide us. I pray that we may become seekers in this new year and adopt a time of silence in our daily routines of stopping everything and sitting before the new born king to wait, listen and look for what he will show us in that sacred silence.
