### **School Overview**

- Carondelet's enrollment for the 2021-2022 school year was 401 students is grades PK-8.

  Current enrollment for the 2022-2023 school year is 408 students and counting.
- We have **two campuses**. Lower Campus houses our PK-Grades 2. The Upper Campus is home to grades 3-8.
- Carondelet boasts an **average class size of 19 students** per K-8 classroom. Small class sizes are one of the biggest indicators of academic success and allow us to meet the individual needs of every student.
- Accelerated curriculum and instruction are available to students working above grade-level.
- We offer a full-time **special services** coordinator, literacy specialist, and two schools counselors.
- Our students consistently score **above grade level** on national standardized tests, above at the 93rd percentile nationally in math and at the 95th percentile in reading this fall.
- Our Saints are planning and leading weekly school liturgies, deepening their faith and learning how to participate in parish life.
- Leadership and service opportunities abound for our Middle School Students. They are Student Council and National Junior Honor Society members, lectors, community volunteers, and the captains of our sports teams and academic clubs.
- • We continue to invest in **language**, **science and the arts** offering STEM, coding, robotics, advanced art, Spanish, a band program.
- We offer several different clubs and activities such as chess, sewing, karate, robotics, scouts, running club, book club, jazz band and an extramural sports teams including soccer, volleyball, basketball and baseball
- Our teachers are **lifelong learners**, with 80% holding advanced degrees.

#### **CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDE RENOVATED** MAKERSPACE AND **SCIENCE LABS**

#### MIDDLE SCHOOL LAUNCHES **NEW PROGRAMMING MODEL** WITH "EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING" WEDNESDAYS

Carondelet rolled out a new and innovative middle school programming model with the start of the 2021-2022 school year that includes mixed-grade advisory groups and "Experiential Wednesdays". The Wednesday schedule includes two morning electives that rotate per trimester and a variety of hands-on experiential learning opportunities in the afternoon that include both on-site and off-site field trips to engage students academically, spiritually, and emotionally. Students are eager to engage and love the mid-week schedule change.

This social event is typically held in February and raises funds for the general operating budget and a designated "fund-a-need" program. The 2020 Fund-A-Need supported improvements to our Maker Space and science labs.
