School has been in session for two months now and uniforms have arrived. Wearing the correct uniform everyday is part of being a self-disciplined student. Please help your child ensure they are dressed appropriately every day. (Kindly refer to the Parent/Student Handbook for guidance.)

And speaking of attire, the chilly weather is here! The students will continue to have outdoor class time, fresh air breaks, and recess. Please remember hats, mittens, and appropriate footwear. The staff will require your student to keep his/her jacket on during recess.

Additionally, our classrooms are cool as we will be keeping windows

open and fans moving to ensure proper cross ventilation. Students need a KCS sweater, fleece, track jacket to wear in their classrroms. Sweatshirts are for gym days only and must be school issued. Other outerwear will not be permitted in our classrooms.

At this point in the school year chronic absenteeism and tardiness is also being addressed. Students who continue to be habitually tardy to school will be making up missed class work during recess. While we all run late every once in a while, tardy students are not only at an academic disadvantage themselves, but they disrupt the learning process for their classmates as well. Speaking of academic success, *I cannot stress*

strongly enough that the single most important thing you can do to advance your children's education is to be sure they are in attendance each day. As I visit classrooms each day, I am happy to see the amount of teaching and learning that takes place during each and every class period. Making up work that is sent home is not the equivalent of being in class. Missing class puts your children at an academic disadvantage and impedes their educational growth. Please keep the importance of school attendance in mind when scheduling appointments and planning vacations.



WE GIVE THANKS

(from VeyWell Mind) A 2019 study published in the *Journal of Happiness Studies*¹ found that gratitude is linked to happiness in children by age 5. This means that instilling gratitude in your kids at a young age could help them grow up to be happier people.

According to a 2008 study published in the *Journal of School Psychology*, grateful children (ages 11 to 13) tend to be happier, more optimistic, and have better social support. They also report more satisfaction with their schools, families, communities, friends, and themselves. Grateful kids also tend to give more social support to others as well.

According to a 2011 study published in *Psychological Assessment*, grateful teens (ages 14 to 19) are more satisfied with their lives, use their

strengths to improve their communities, are more engaged in their schoolwork and hobbies, and have better grades. They've also been shown to be less envious, depressed, and materialistic than their less grateful counterparts.

So clearly there are a lot of good reasons to help kids experience and express gratitude. Here are a few strategies that can help your kids feel more grateful.

Encourage your child to say "Thank you" on a regular basis. Offer gentle reminders like, "Your brother let you go first. What should you say to him?" or "What do you say to Grandma for giving you a cookie?" While it may seem like forcing a "thank you" doesn't stir up any real gratitude, consider it a first step in the process. It can

help kids start to recognize when others have given them something, whether it's something tangible like a gift, or intangible like time.

So even if it doesn't seem like genuine appreciation when your child needs a reminder, encouraging them to verbally express appreciation can be an important learning tool for genuine gratitude down the line.

Make gratitude a priority in your home. Not only will your child benefit, but the adults will likely get a much-needed boost in happiness and well-being also. Experiment with different strategies to help determine which gratitude practices help everyone best experience and express their grateful feelings.
