FRATERNAL SOLIDARITY

Known Fact: In late July 2018, severe flooding affected the south Indian state of Kerala due to unusually high rainfall during the monsoon season. It was the worst flooding in Kerala in nearly a century. Over 322 people died, 15 are missing within a fortnight, while at least a million people were evacuated. All 14 districts of the state were placed on red alert. According to the Kerala government, one-sixth of the total population of Kerala had been directly affected by the floods and related incidents.

Do You know?: The missionaries of Mary Immaculate (MMI), the religious order of Frs. Joseph, David and Joselin who serve in Sullivan County, is at the rehabilitation service in Kerala. Most of our priests and religious sisters are there helping people get back to their normal life which is very hard, since many are affected in various levels and so we are doing our best.

In 2004, when Tsunami hit South Indian costal area, we were there for the rehabilitation service and last year when the flood hit in our own State Tamil Nadu, we were there to help our people. And now we are assisting people in need where the flood came.

Hence our society decided to make an appeal to get some financial help from mission places wherever we are working. We discussed with the dean of our county Fr. Ed Bader who appreciated our effort and gave us positive signal to proceed. Henceforth, in our Holy Cross Parish, the weekend of Sep, 08th & 09th, we will have special collection for the relief work in Kerala– India.

We request your generosity to extend your help towards the needy. This donation will be sent to the society through which it will meet the rehabilitation services in the flood affected areas in Kerala. Therefore, with your collaboration, we will have second collection in coming weekend. I would like to express my gratitude towards you all for all your support and assistance. God Bless you all.
