#### **SEASON OF LENT**

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ Jesus, Lent is the season for prayerful and penitential preparation for the feast of Easter. Lent is the penitential season of approximately



40 days set aside by the Church in order for the faithful to prepare for the celebration of the Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection. During this holy season, Church members prepare for Easter by a recalling of Baptism and by works of penance, that is, **Prayer**,

Fasting and Almsgiving.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are universal days of both fasting and abstinence from eating meat. Abstinence is also observed on all Fridays of Lent. Catholics age 14 and older are bound to observe abstinence regulations except for serious reasons; Catholics age 18-59 are bound to observe fasting regulations except for serious reasons. For all other week-



days of Lent, the Church encourages fasting, either in the traditional sense or through some other form of self-denial determined by conscience. Other devotions, such as the Stations of the Cross, the rosary, scripture study, participation in daily Mass, and service to those in need, are strongly recommended.

#### **LITURGY OF WORD**

First Reading: Lev 19:1-2,17-18 Second Reading:1Cor: 3:16-23 Gospel Reading: Mt 5:38-48

The first reading, taken from the book of Leviticus, teaches us that we should be holy because it is the command given to us by God through Moses: "Be holy, for I the Lord, your God, am Holy." It also shows us the way to share in God's holiness: "Love your neighbor as yourself."



The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 103) challenges us to be holy as our God is Holy by becoming kind and merciful and forgiving, as He is to us. In the second reading, St. Paul gives us an additional reason to be holy. We are to keep our bodies and souls holy because we are the temples of the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit lives in us. In the Gospel passage, taken from the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus teaches us four ways of becoming holy as God is holy.
