





From the Pastor • Del Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Louise,

The evening of October 3, about 50 St. Louise parishioners gathered for a listening session in response to the 2018 clergy sexual abuse crisis. Grouped at tables, parishioners discussed and then wrote out answers to a set of three questions about their reactions and the responses they would recommend. The Adult Faith Formation Committee is still reviewing the written comments, and will prepare letters to be sent to Archbishop Sartain and to Cardinal DiNardo, the President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), on behalf of our parish. These discussions and letters to the bishops are one constructive step we, the people of St. Louise, can take on what will undoubtedly be a long journey for our beloved Church – through pain to a greater good, I hope and pray.



Even though the committee's work is not yet complete, I can share with you the major themes that came forward from the small groups at our meeting.

Essentially all of the participating parishioners would like to see greater lay involvement in the governance of the Church. At their meeting this November the USCCB will discuss Church governance issues, including how to consult more broadly in the selection of bishops. Pope Francis has called for an investigation of how Cardinal McCarrick could be promoted at the same time as rumors were circulating of inappropriate behavior by him with seminarians. Cardinal DiNardo is calling for the formation of a board of lay people, made up of men and women who are experts in the fields of psychology, criminology, treatment of sexual abusers and addressing issues of sexual abuse in our society; the purpose of this board would be to respond to accusations against bishops. **You should know that the Archdiocese of Seattle has had such a Review Board since 1986.** As Vicar of Clergy, I am an *ex-officio* member of this board. My primary role is to present cases of accusations against deacons or priests that come to the attention of the Archdiocese. The board then recommends to the Archbishop whether he should consider the case to be credible and what to do in response. Depending on the nature of the accusation, the Archdiocese may hire a professional, independent investigator to give the board a report to help inform their recommendation.

Numerous participants would like to see the priesthood opened to married men. Those who made that recommendation are not alone – last month the German bishops asked the Pope to open up this question for discussion. Regardless of where the Church may go on this issue, we will need to remain vigilant about protecting children and vulnerable adults, because the evidence is that celibacy is not the “cause” of priests abusing children – in fact, all too often sexual abuse happens within families.

Queridos Amigos de Santa Luisa:

La noche del 3 de octubre, aproximadamente 50 parroquianos de Santa Luisa se reunieron para una sesión en respuesta a la crisis del abuso sexual en la iglesia en 2018. En grupos en distintas mesas, los parroquianos discutieron acerca de tres preguntas y luego escribieron sus respuestas, reacciones y recomendaciones. El Comité de Formación de la Fe para Adultos todavía está revisando los comentarios escritos y va a preparar las cartas que serán enviadas al Arzobispo Sartain y al Cardenal DiNardo, Presidente de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB) a nombre de nuestra parroquia. Esas discusiones y cartas a los obispos son un paso constructivo que nosotros, la gente de Santa Luisa, podemos dar en lo que sin duda será una larga jornada para nuestra amada iglesia – por medio del dolor para un bien mayor, eso espero, y rezo porque así sea.

Aunque el trabajo del comité todavía no está completo, puedo compartir con ustedes los principales temas que surgieron en los grupos durante nuestra reunión.

Esencialmente todos los parroquianos que participaron quisieran ver un mayor involucramiento de los laicos en el gobierno de la iglesia. En sus reuniones este mes de noviembre, la USCCB discutirá asuntos del gobierno de la Iglesia, incluyendo una consulta más amplia para la selección de los obispos. El Papa Francisco ha pedido una investigación para saber cómo fue posible que el Cardinal McCarrick haya sido promovido cuando al mismo tiempo circulaban contra él rumores de conducta inapropiada con seminaristas. El Cardenal DiNardo está pidiendo la creación de una mesa directiva de laicos, formada por hombres y mujeres expertos en los campos de psicología, criminología y el tema del abuso sexual en nuestra sociedad; el propósito de esta mesa directiva sería responder a acusaciones que se hagan en contra de obispos. **Quiero que sepan que la Arquidiócesis de Seattle ha tenido este tipo de Mesa Directiva desde 1986.** Como Vicario del Clero, yo soy un miembro *ex-officio* de esta Mesa Directiva. Mi principal función es presentar los casos de acusaciones en contra de diáconos o sacerdotes que se hacen del conocimiento de la Arquidiócesis. La mesa recomienda al Arzobispo si debe considerar o no que el caso es creíble y lo que debe hacer en respuesta. Dependiendo de la naturaleza de la acusación, la Arquidiócesis puede contratar a un investigador profesional independiente, que haga un reporte a la Mesa Directiva para ayudar a su recomendación.

Numerosos participantes quisieran que el sacerdocio estuviera abierto a los hombres casados. Los que hicieron esa recomendación no están solos – el mes pasado los obispos alemanes le pidieron al Papa que abra este tema a discusión. Independientemente de lo que la Iglesia decida sobre este tema, necesitamos seguir atentos para proteger a niños y adultos vulnerables, porque la evidencia del celibato no es la “causa” de que los sacerdotes abusen de los niños – de hecho, con demasiada frecuencia el abuso sucede al interior de las familias.

Some participants would also like to see women ordained. Pope Francis appointed a commission in 2016 to study the possibility of ordaining women to the diaconate. That option would not so much require a change in Church teaching as it would a change in current Church law, since we know from the Scriptures and other resources that women did serve as deacons (or "deaconesses") in the early Church. The idea of ordaining women to the priesthood is another matter. It is the dogmatic teaching of the Church that only men can be validly ordained as priests.

In reflecting on the discussion and written responses, I sense that the real issue is the question of power in the Church (we face the same issue in society at large). Sexual abuse is more about the abuse of power over someone weaker, than it is about sex. The issue of whom the Church admits to the Sacrament of Holy Orders is perhaps just as much about who makes the decisions of governance and whose voice matters in the Church as it is about who has sacramental faculties. Although power in the Church is still overwhelmingly in the hands of men, things have changed since I was first ordained – we now have women in our Chancery who hold important positions that were once solely the domain of priests, and Pope Francis has named women to Vatican positions that were once held only by the ordained (*i.e.*, men).

The Holy Spirit could be leading us on an interesting ride into the future. We pray for the courage and grace to follow.



24-Hour Prayer Vigil— November 2-3, 2018



