From the Pastor • Del Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Louise,

As I am writing this column, a caravan, more than 7,000 people from Honduras, El Salvador and Guatemala, are making their way on foot through Mexico, driven by the hope of crossing the U.S. border to seek asylum. They are fleeing terrible conditions of violence and starvation in their home countries. President Trump is positioning our country to prevent them from entering. What are we as Catholics to make of the seemingly conflicting principles of Catholic social teaching, the right to migrate versus the right of sovereign nations to protect their borders?

I found helpful information in the article, *The Migrant Caravan through the Eyes of Catholic Social Teaching*, in the October 23 online edition of *America* magazine.

(www.americamagazine.org/politics-society/2018/10/23/migrant-caravan-through-eyes-catholic-social-teaching) “According to a summary of Catholic social teaching on migration from the U.S. bishops: ‘[P]eople have the right to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families. This is based on biblical and ancient Christian teaching that the goods of the earth belong to all people. While the right to private property is defended in Catholic social teaching, individuals do not have the right to use private property without regard for the common good.’”

And, according to *Strangers No Longer: Together on the Journey of Hope*, a joint pastoral letter from the Mexican and U.S. bishops, “More powerful economic nations, which have the ability to protect and feed their residents, have a stronger obligation to accommodate migration flows.”

“The defense of the national border is not the only value at stake,’ Father (David) Hollenbach said. ‘When people in other parts of the world are in great need or danger, that takes precedence.’” (Fr. David Hollenbach, S.J., is a moral theologian at Georgetown University.)

The essential point is that while our country’s right to defend our borders is important, it is not absolute – especially not when the protection of human life and dignity is at stake, as it is in the case of migrants who are escaping violence, drug-infested neighborhoods and abject poverty.

Queridos Amigos de Santa Luisa:

Mientras estoy escribiendo esta columna, una caravana de más de 7000 personas de Honduras, El Salvador y Guatemala, vienen atravesando México a pie, motivados por la esperanza de cruzar la frontera de Estados Unidos para buscar asilo. Ellos están huyendo de terribles condiciones de violencia y hambre en sus países de origen. El Presidente Trump está posicionando a nuestro país para impedirles la entrada. ¿Qué es lo que nosotros como católicos podemos hacer ante este aparente conflicto entre los principios de la enseñanza social católica, el derecho a migrar, frente al derecho soberano de las naciones a proteger sus fronteras?

Encontré información útil en el artículo *La Caravana Migrante a través de los Ojos de la Enseñanza Social Católica*, en la edición en línea del 23 de octubre de la revista *America*.

(www.americamagazine.org/politics-society/2018/10/23/migrant-caravan-through-eyes-catholic-social-teaching) “De acuerdo a un resumen de la enseñanza social católica de los obispos de Estados Unidos sobre migración : ‘[La] gente tiene el derecho de migrar para sostener sus vidas y las vidas de sus familias. Esto se basa en la enseñanza bíblica y antigua enseñanza cristiana de que los bienes de la tierra pertenecen a todas las personas. Aunque el derecho a la propiedad privada es defendido en la enseñanza social católica, los individuos no tienen el derecho a la propiedad privada sin tener en consideración el bien común.’”

Y, de acuerdo con *Extraños No Más: Juntos en la Jornada de Esperanza*, una carta pastoral conjunta de los obispos de México y los Estados Unidos, “las naciones más poderosas económicamente, que tienen la capacidad de proteger y alimentar a sus residentes, tienen una mayor obligación de dar cabida a flujos migratorios.”

“La defensa de la frontera nacional no es el único valor que está en juego’ dijo el Padre (David) Hollenbach. ‘Cuando la gente en otras partes del mundo está en gran necesidad o peligro, eso tiene prioridad.’” (El Padre David Hollenbach, S.J., es un teólogo de ética en la Universidad de Georgetown.)

El punto esencial es que, aunque el derecho de nuestro país a defender nuestras fronteras es importante, no es absoluto – especialmente cuando la protección de la vida y la dignidad humana está en riesgo, como es el caso de los migrantes que están escapando de violencia, vecindarios infestados de drogas y terrible pobreza.


Grief Support Group

St. Louise Charger Cards

Charger Cards is a scrip fundraiser that our parish and school participate in year-round. St. Louise buys gift cards at a discount from a supplier and offers them for sale at face value. The difference in cost is what St. Louise keeps as a profit for our parish school. The average profit is \$5 for every \$100 of gift card. This is a unique fundraiser because you buy gift cards for stores that you already use. It is a rare fundraiser that doesn't ask you to buy anything you don't already buy.

The idea is that families buy groceries and gas (or spend at restaurants or other stores) that are in their normal budget. Instead of paying with a check or cash at the store, you pay with a gift card that you purchased from St. Louise. This way St. Louise School earns a small percentage of every normal purchase you make. Charger Cards are available outside the church today. There are hundreds of stores to select from. It's guaranteed that there is at least one store you are planning to shop at this week whose gift card you could first buy from St. Louise. **Charger Cards are typically available between Masses on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Thank you for your support of St. Louise School through your purchase of Charger Cards.
