

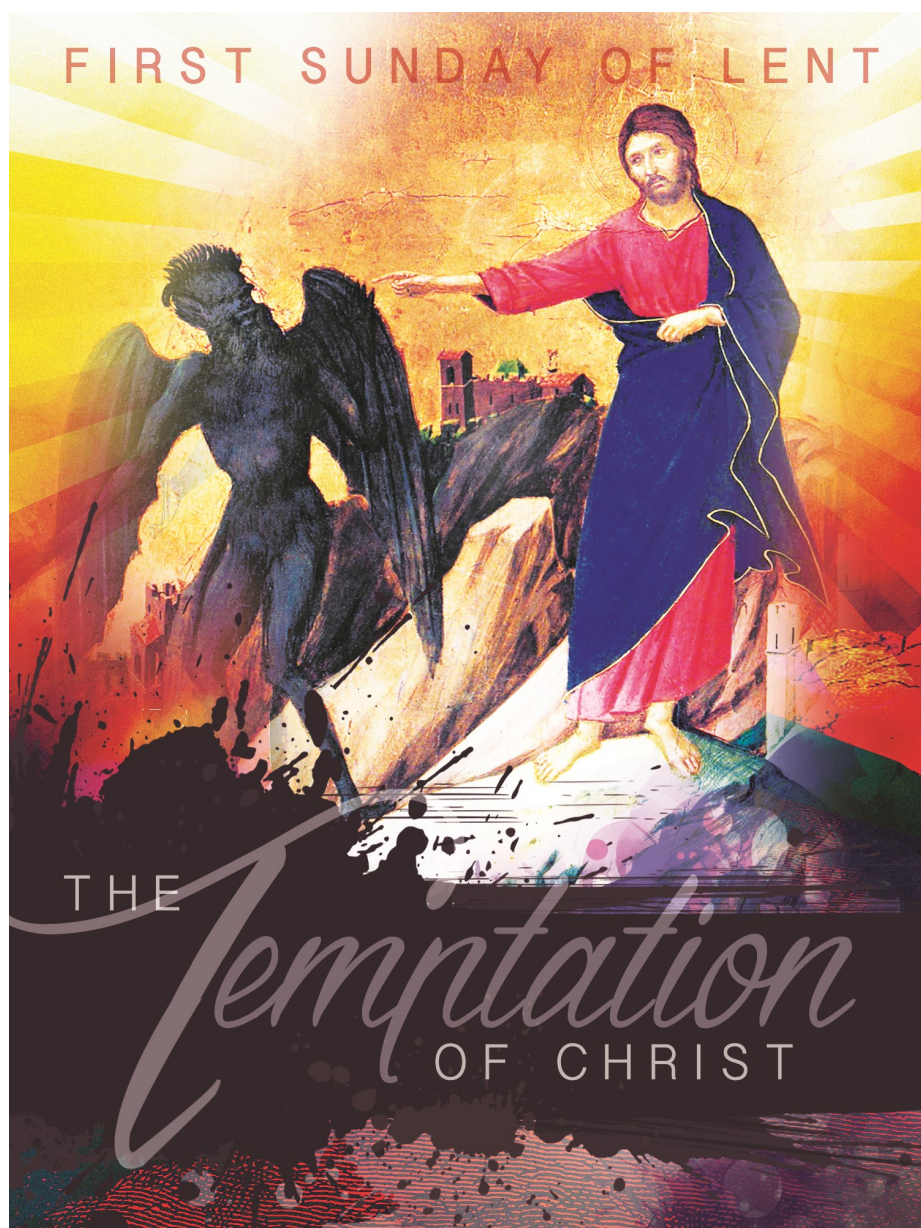

From the Pastor • Del Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Louise,

Happy first Sunday of Lent! **Lent is a joyful season, because it is a season of renewal.** Our penitential acts in Lent are something like turning the soil and fertilizing it. Just as gardeners take joy in the hard work of preparing the soil for the spring planting, so do Christians take joy in preparing spiritually for the celebration of Easter.



Our faith is something that needs constant attention if we are to avoid becoming like “dead wood” on a tree or a plant. **Another area that needs constant attention from all of us is encouraging vocations in the Church.** All of us need to give attention to inviting others to hear Christ’s call to live in the grace of his love, to join the assembly at the Eucharistic feast, to come together as the body of Christ to serve. There are scores of lay ministries that are essential for a parish like ours; the Church needs more youth ministers, parish administrators, Catholic school principals and teachers, to name just a few. And each of us needs to do what we can to encourage people to consider whether God might be calling them to serve His people as a priest, a deacon, or a religious sister or brother.

Fr. Bryan Dolejsi, the Director of Vocations for the Archdiocese of Seattle, will be with us at all the Masses on March 16 and 17 to preach on vocations, especially vocations to the priesthood. He would like very much to meet while he is here with young men who might be interested. I know some young guys who have expressed some interest. And I realize that there might be someone out there who has been thinking about the possibility but hasn’t said anything to Annarose, Katie, Fr. Fabian or me. I remember some years ago in another parish, a young man who was working in banking volunteered to play the piano and cantor at Mass. I had no idea that he was considering the priesthood until he emailed me to say, “Dear Fr. Gary, could you write a letter of recommendation for me? I am applying to the Jesuits.” **I would be delighted to hear from someone like that young man here at St. Louise** and I know that Fr. Bryan would also be happy to talk with you and to answer any questions. No pressure about making a commitment, just “come and see.”

Queridos Amigos de Santa Luisa:

¡Feliz primer Domingo de Cuaresma! **La Cuaresma es una temporada alegre, porque es una temporada de renovación.** Nuestros actos de penitencia en la Cuaresma son algo así como revolver la tierra y fertilizarla. Así como los jardineros sienten alegría en el arduo trabajo de preparar la tierra para plantar en la primavera, también los cristianos se alegran al prepararse espiritualmente para la celebración de la Pascua.

Nuestra fe es algo que necesita atención constante si queremos evitar convertirnos en la “madera muerta” de un árbol o una planta. **Otra área que necesita atención constante por parte de todos nosotros es fomentar las vocaciones en la Iglesia.** Todos nosotros necesitamos invitar a otros a escuchar el llamado de Cristo a vivir en la gracia de su amor, a unirse a la asamblea en el banquete Eucarístico, a juntarse como el cuerpo de Cristo para servir. Hay decenas de ministerios laicos que son esenciales para la vida de una parroquia como la nuestra; la Iglesia necesita más ministros para los jóvenes, administradores de las parroquias, directores y maestros de escuelas católicas, por mencionar solo algunos. Y cada uno de nosotros necesita hacer lo que pueda para animar a la gente a considerar si Dios tal vez la está llamando a servir a Su pueblo como sacerdote, diácono, o hermano religioso(a).

Bryan Dolejsi, Director de Vocaciones para la Arquidiócesis de Seattle, estará con nosotros en todas las Misas del 16 y 17 de marzo para predicar acerca de las vocaciones, especialmente las vocaciones al sacerdocio. A él gustaría mucho reunirse con los jóvenes que pudieran estar interesados. Yo conozco a algunos jóvenes que han expresado algún interés. Y estoy consciente de que puede haber alguien allá afuera que está pensando acerca de la posibilidad, pero no le ha dicho nada a Annarose, Katie, el Padre Fabian o a mí. Recuerdo hace algunos años en otra parroquia, un joven que trabajaba en un banco y era voluntario en Misa tocando el piano y cantando. Yo no tenía idea de que estaba considerando el sacerdocio hasta que me envió un correo electrónico que decía “Querido Padre Gary: ¿podría escribir una carta de recomendación para mí? Estoy aplicando para los Jesuitas.” **Me encantaría escuchar de alguien como ese joven aquí en Sta. Luisa** y sé que el Padre Bryan también estaría muy feliz de hablar con ustedes y contestar cualquier pregunta. No hay presión para hacer ningún compromiso, solamente “vengan y vean.”
