



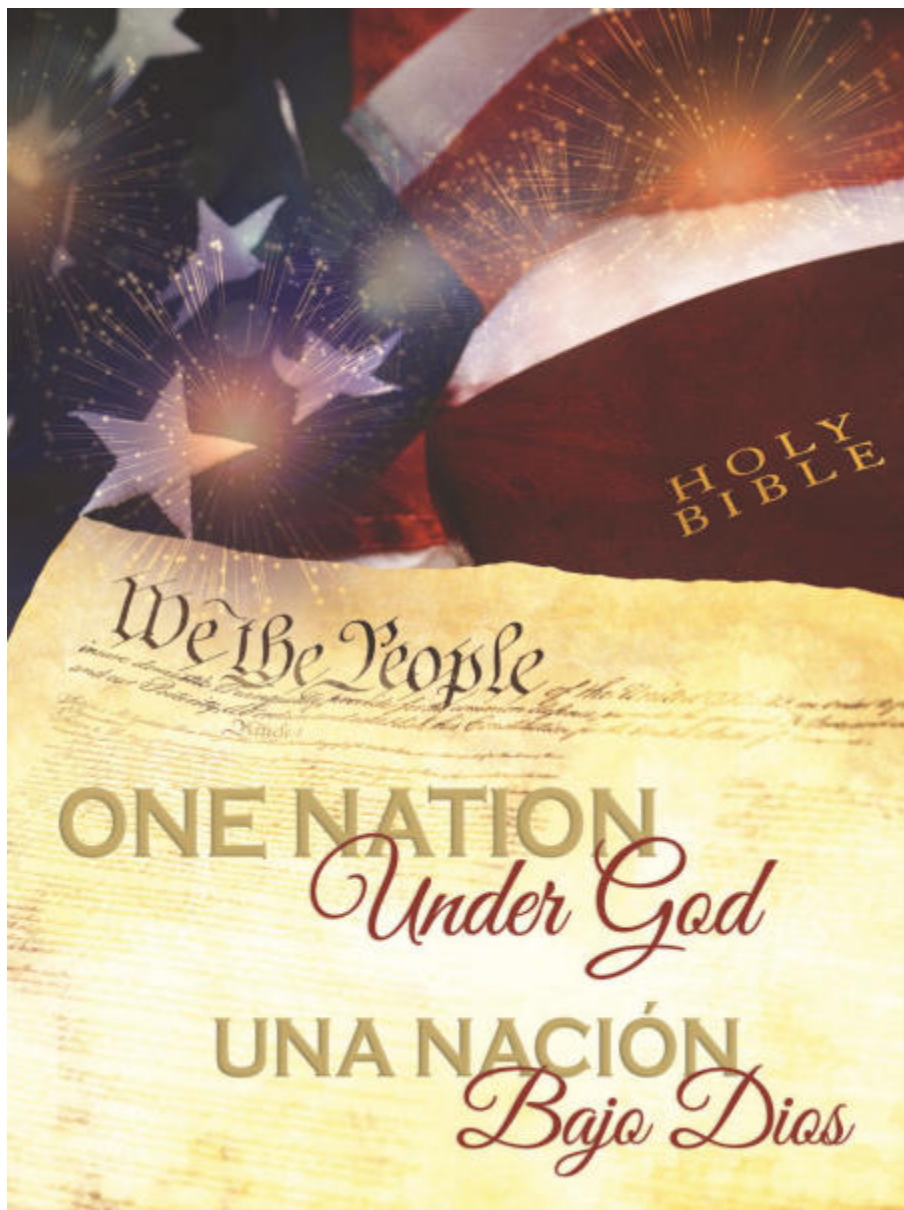

From the Pastor • Del Pastor

Dear Friends at St. Louise,

Every six years, our United States Independence Day holiday falls on a Sunday. The Church to which we belong is universal, and, especially at Mass, we always keep our eyes fixed on our eternal homeland of heaven – and Independence Day is a day when we give thanks to God for the freedoms that we enjoy and hold dear. We recall to mind the lofty words of the Declaration of Independence and the values that are enshrined in our Constitution. The highest of these values are also ones that we Christians uphold as Gospel values. Just as Christians struggle to interpret and then live those values, so too do we as a nation. We have seen this on display most especially since the pandemic. The political, racial and religious divisions among Americans, along with social unrest, seem to have all come to the surface. **Honestly, for the first time in my life, I have wondered whether the experiment of democracy will survive.**

Americans need to keep going back to the Constitution, and Christians, to Jesus. Catholics in particular have a wealth of wisdom from which to draw; not only Scripture, but the writings of the early Church Fathers, the spirituality and testimony of the saints, and the Sacred Tradition, including Catholic Social Teaching. As long as we can remain rooted in these values, I have faith and hope that God will see us through. **Faith and hope, supported and sustained by prayer.** I watched the movie *Fatima* recently. The faith of three young peasant children in Portugal, who had the courage to speak the message that they heard from Our Lady of Fatima, made a difference in the age of World War I. I have found myself praying the rosary more frequently, to pray for world peace in our own age. Our true “independence” from the struggles of our time is found in God, and through the intercession of the Mother of God. Please pray with me.

On another note, **Welcome to Fr. Ben Bray!** What a joy to welcome him. I think most of you know that he was baptized here at St. Louise, and he and Fr. Carlos were ordained together two years ago. I met Fr. Ben (just plain Ben then) in 1999 when I was first assigned to St. Anthony Parish and he and his family were parishioners. Fr. Ben loves being with the youth, so you will see him frequently at St. Louise School and with CROWD and Lifeteen. He will be taking on the Liturgy portion of what used to be Lynette Basta's job. He can't do it alone and so he will be asking for your help. I am sure that our parishioners will respond generously.

Another piece of our pastoral transition also needs your help: the **parish prayer list** we publish in each week's bulletin. It has become very long and, I fear, somewhat outdated; so we will wipe the slate clean and begin the list all over again later this month. Queridos Amigos de Sta. Luisa:

Cada seis años, el día de la Independencia de los Estados Unidos cae en domingo. La Iglesia a la que nosotros pertenecemos es universal y siempre tenemos los ojos puestos en nuestra patria eterna del cielo –especialmente en Misa– y el Día de la Independencia es un día en que damos gracias a Dios por las libertades de las que disfrutamos y que tanto valoramos. Volvemos a tener en mente las nobles ideas de la Declaración de Independencia y los valores que están recogidos en nuestra Constitución. Los más altos de esos valores también son los que nosotros los cristianos sostenemos como valores del Evangelio. Y de la misma forma que como cristianos nos cuesta trabajo interpretar y después vivir esos valores, también nos sucede como nación. Hemos visto muestras de esto, especialmente desde la pandemia. Las divisiones políticas, raciales y religiosas entre los americanos, junto con la agitación social, parece que todo eso ha salido a la superficie. **Honestamente, por primera vez en mi vida me he preguntado si el experimento de la democracia sobrevivirá.**

Los americanos necesitan seguir regresando a la Constitución, y los cristianos, a Jesús. Los católicos en particular contamos con una riqueza de sabiduría; no solo la Escritura, sino los escritos de los Primeros Padres de la Iglesia, la espiritualidad y testimonio de los santos, y la Sagrada Tradición, incluyendo la Enseñanza Social Católica. Mientras podamos permanecer enraizados en esos valores, tengo fe y esperanza en que Dios nos llevará a buen puerto. **Fe y esperanza, apoyada y sostenida por la oración.** Hace poco vi la película *Fatima*. La fe de tres niños campesinos en Portugal, que tuvieron el valor de comunicar el mensaje que habían escuchado de Nuestra Señora de Fátima, logró una diferencia en la época de la Primera Guerra Mundial. Yo mismo me he descubierto rezando el rosario con más frecuencia, para orar por la paz del mundo en nuestra época. Nuestra verdadera “independencia” de las dificultades de nuestro tiempo se encuentra en Dios, y por medio de la intercesión de la Madre de Dios. Por favor recen conmigo.

Cambiando de tema, **¡Bienvenido el Padre Ben Bray!** Qué alegría es recibirlo. Creo que la mayoría de ustedes saben que él fue bautizado aquí en Sta. Luisa, y que él y el Padre Carlos fueron ordenados juntos hace dos años. Yo conocí al Padre Ben (que entonces era simplemente Ben) en 1999 cuando me asignaron a la Parroquia de San Antonio y él y su familia eran parroquianos. Al Padre Ben le encanta estar con los jóvenes, así que ustedes lo verán muy seguido en la Escuela de Santa Luisa, y también con CROWD y Lifeteen. Él va a tomar la porción de Liturgia que era trabajo de Lynette Basta, pero él no puede hacerlo solo, así que les va a pedir ayuda. Estoy seguro de que nuestros parroquianos responderán de forma generosa.

También necesitamos de su ayuda en otra pieza de nuestra transición pastoral: **la lista de oración** de la parroquia que publicamos cada semana en el boletín se ha vuelto muy larga, y me temo que un poco obsoleta, así que daremos “borrón y cuenta nueva” y a fines de este mes vamos a empezar la lista desde el principio. Si ustedes desean poner a alguien en la lista de oraciones, por favor envíen un correo electrónico o llamen por teléfono a Geri Hanley con la información antes del **18 de julio**.

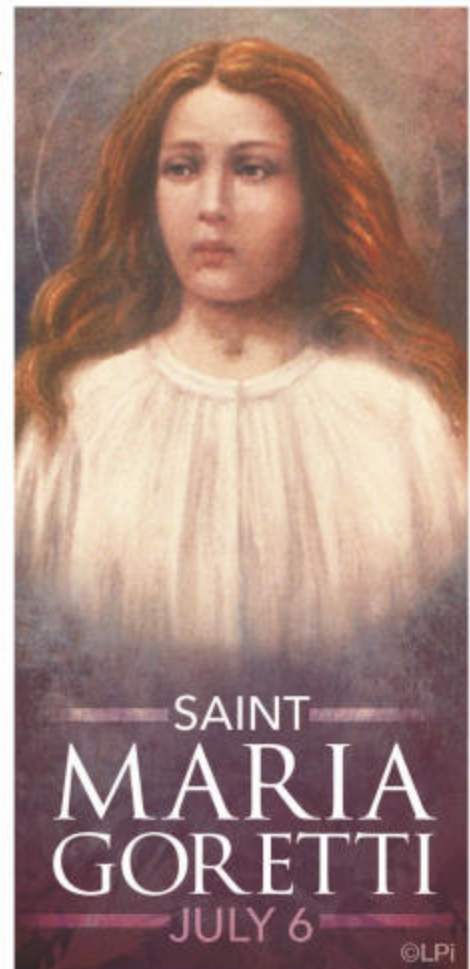

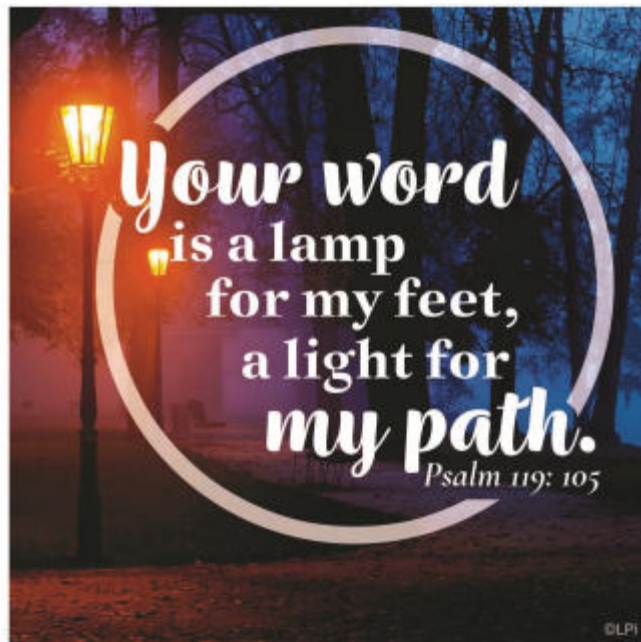

Marriage is a gift

One of the goals of the Year of the Family is to proclaim that the sacrament of marriage is a gift that contains in itself a transforming power of human love. Pope Francis writes:

Marriage is a precious sign, for "when a man and a woman celebrate the sacrament of marriage, God is, as it were, 'mirrored' in them; he impresses in them his own features and the indelible character of his love. Marriage is the icon of God's love for us. Indeed, God is also communion: the three Persons of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit live eternally in perfect unity. And this is precisely the mystery of marriage: God makes of the two spouses one single existence." (*Amoris Laetitia* 121)

Married life is a gift. It is a lifelong journey of love, friendship and faith. It is a beautiful mystery wherein two individuals walk together side by side, each fully unique but joined as one.

Our worldly culture tends to paint the picture of love through the lens of romance. Yet we know that romance is just one small part of married life. Romance may be the kindling that sparks the flame of love, but the true beauty of a lifelong commitment lies much deeper and is the greater gift.

The Greatest Form of Friendship

Pope Francis writes:

After the love that unites us to God, conjugal love is the "greatest form of friendship." It is a union possessing all the traits of a good friendship: concern for the good of the other, reciprocity, intimacy, warmth, stability and the resemblance born of a shared life. (*Amoris Laetitia* 123)

When two individuals enter into the sacrament of marriage, they commit to be true and steadfast companions: to care for and support one another and to be faithful for the rest of their lives. In a world that is constantly changing, this kind of stability can be a source of great comfort and strength. Especially in this time that is so full of uncertainty, married life can offer a sense of peace that can be hard to find in the world.

What sets the great friendship of marriage apart is how the sacrament sanctifies the passion between husband and wife. In *Amoris Laetitia*, Pope Francis describes this passion as "always directed to an ever more stable and intense union." The fire of marital passion is a life-giving force. It galvanizes the friendship between husband and wife, until it "acquires an all-encompassing character" that is unique to the marital union.



An Expansion of the Heart

As two individuals live out their marital vows, they come to know one another in fullness. Years of married life have a way of removing our filters and pretenses. This process is an inevitable part of marriage and intimacy. Pope Francis writes:

Saint Thomas Aquinas said that the word "joy" refers to an expansion of the heart. Marital joy can be experienced even amid sorrow; it involves accepting that marriage is an inevitable mixture of enjoyment and struggles, tensions and repose, pain and relief, satisfactions and longings, annoyances and pleasures, but always on the path of friendship, which inspires married couples to care for one another: "they help and serve each other." (*Amoris Laetitia* 126)

Married couples have the benefit of sharing life's journey with another person. This is not always easy, but it can be uniquely rewarding and empowering. Fortitude grows as two people grow closer to God and one another through adversity. Virtues are magnified and shared as one person's strength complements the other's weakness. In short, married life is an expansion of the heart as the couple come to share in a love that reflects the divine life of the Trinity and blossoms into new life.

Honor the Gift of Your Marriage

1. **Make a commitment to be in each other's company outside the daily routine.** Spend time together in ways that allow you to experience each other, whether in conversation, in recreation, in prayer, or even in silence.
2. **Take time to "see" one another, both with your eyes and with your heart.** Be conscious of observing and appreciating your spouse. Make eye contact during conversation. Allow each other to speak without interruption or judgment. Reignite your curiosity about one another.
3. **Cultivate the joy in your married life.** Find ways to make your spouse smile, or better yet, laugh! Gifts, humor, acts of kindness, even a little silliness from time to time, can go a long way.
4. **Pray together.** Make a commitment to pray regularly as a couple. Attend Mass and encourage one another in your individual faith journeys. Use At Home with Faith to reflect on the weekly Mass readings. Enrich your marriage through retreat experiences.

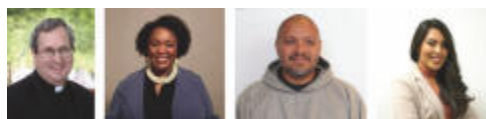
