From the Pastor • Del Pastor

Dear Friends at St. Louise,

Each one of us, by virtue of our baptism, is called by God in our own unique way to live the mission of Jesus Christ in the world. As we celebrate World Marriage Day this weekend, we reflect on the meaning of the sacrament of Marriage.



Marriage is given to some, for the mission of the Church, for the salvation of the world.

Not all are married – but all benefit from the sacrament of Marriage. I know this to be true in my life as a celibate priest: strong marriages and strong families give strength to my vocation, first of all the marriage of my own parents, as well as those of my brothers and sisters and their spouses, and of couples in the five parishes where I have served as a priest.

I would like to share some words of Pope Francis that speak to marriage and family life as being a vocation. On the Feast of the Holy Family, December 26, 2021, Pope Francis wrote *LETTER OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS TO MARRIED COUPLES FOR THE “AMORIS LAETITIA FAMILY” YEAR, 2021-2022:*

Marriage, as a vocation, calls you to steer a tiny boat – wave-tossed yet sturdy, thanks to the reality of the sacrament – across a sometimes stormy sea. How often do you want to say, or better, cry out, like the apostles: “Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?” (Mk 4:38). Let us never forget, though, that by virtue of the sacrament of matrimony, Jesus is present in that boat; he is concerned for you and he remains at your side amid the tempest. In another Gospel passage, as they rowed with difficulty, the disciples saw Jesus coming to them on the waters and welcomed him into their boat. Whenever you are buffeted by rough winds and storms, do the same thing: welcome Jesus into your boat, for once he “got into the boat with them... the wind ceased” (Mk 6:51). It is important that, together, you keep your eyes fixed on Jesus. Only in this way, will you find peace, overcome conflicts and discover solutions to many of your problems. Those problems, of course, will not disappear, but you will be able to see them from a different perspective.

Whether we are married or not, all of us are called to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus.

Today we hold up specifically **the beauty of the sacrament of Marriage and the unique role it plays in the life of both the Church and society.** The sacrament of Marriage establishes the “sacred space” where a man and a woman – who were two – now come together as one. The married couple together symbolize the love of Christ for his bride, the Church. Couples of child-bearing age also open up their lives to the possibility of receiving the gift of children, for the good of both society and the Church.

Queridos Amigos de Sta. Luisa:

Cada uno de nosotros, por virtud de nuestro bautismo, es llamado por Dios de forma única para vivir la misión de Jesucristo en el mundo. Al celebrar el Día Mundial del Matrimonio este fin de semana, reflexionamos en el significado del sacramento del Matrimonio.

El matrimonio les es dado a algunos, para la misión de la Iglesia y para la salvación del mundo. No todos somos casados – pero todos nos beneficiamos del sacramento del Matrimonio. Yo sé que esto es verdad en mi vida como un sacerdote célibe: matrimonios fuertes y familias fuertes dan fuerza a mi vocación, ante todo, el matrimonio de mis padres, así como el de mis hermanos y hermanas, y las parejas de las cinco parroquias en donde he servido como sacerdote.

Me gustaría compartir unas palabras del Papa Francisco que hablan del matrimonio y la vida familiar como una vocación. En la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia, el 26 de diciembre de 2021, el Papa Francisco escribió *CARTA DE SU SANTIDAD EL PAPA FRANCISCO A LOS MATRIMONIOS CON OCASIÓN DEL AÑO “AMORIS LAETITIA”, 2021-2022:*

La vocación al matrimonio es un llamado a conducir una barca incierta – pero segura, gracias a la realidad del sacramento – en un mar a veces agitado. Cuántas veces, como los apóstoles, ustedes sienten ganas de decir, o mejor dicho, de gritar: “¡Maestro!, ¿no te importa que perezcamos?” (Mc 4:38). No olvidemos que, a través del sacramento del matrimonio, Jesús está presente en esa barca. Él se preocupa por ustedes y permanece con ustedes en todo momento en el vaivén de la barca agitada por el mar. En otro pasaje del Evangelio, en medio de las dificultades, los discípulos ven que Jesús se acerca en medio de la tormenta y lo reciben en la barca; así también ustedes, cuando la tormenta arrecia, dejen subir a Jesús en su barca, porque cuando subió “donde estaban ellos... cesó el viento” (Mc 6:51). Es importante que juntos mantengan la mirada fija en Jesús. Solo así encontrarán la paz, superarán los conflictos y descubrirán soluciones a muchos de sus problemas. Esos problemas no van a desaparecer, pero ustedes podrán verlos desde otra perspectiva.

Ya sea que estemos casados o no, todos estamos llamados a mantener los ojos fijos en Jesús.

Hoy reafirmamos específicamente **la belleza del sacramento del Matrimonio y el papel único que juega en la vida de la Iglesia y de la sociedad.** El sacramento del Matrimonio establece el “espacio sagrado” en el que un hombre y una mujer, que eran dos, ahora se convierten en uno. La pareja casada simboliza el amor de Cristo por su novia, la Iglesia. Las parejas en edad de procrear hijos también abren sus vidas a la posibilidad de recibir el regalo de los hijos, para el bien de la sociedad y de la Iglesia.

We also recognize that not everyone is married, and that widows, the divorced, and single persons too play a vital role in the community of faith. We know that **Pope Francis has said on numerous occasions that all people, no matter who they are, have a right to be a part of a family.** Parents should not reject their children and should always welcome them as members of the family. He has mentioned this especially to parents of homosexual children. And Pope Francis also calls us to recognize the vital role that grandparents play in family life. An important theme for the Pope is that the Church can serve to overcome a "throw-away" culture – he is referring to a sinful indifference toward persons as well as toward our environment.

As Pope Francis says, the lives of a married couple become a single life; they become a "we" in loving communion with Jesus, alive and present at every moment of their existence. Seen this way, the sacrament of Marriage, rooted in our baptism, can serve as a lens through which we see all our relationships and the world. It serves for the good of all, which is good reason for us to give thanks and praise to God.

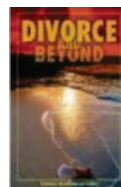

Reminder of Prayer Postures for Communion



To increase our sense of unity, Archbishop Etienne instituted a change in our liturgical practice here at St. Louise and all parishes in the Archdiocese in June 2020. This was announced right after public Masses started

again in a limited way, so it is likely many people aren't even aware of the change.

During the Eucharistic Prayers, everyone is now asked to kneel or sit immediately following the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) until the Great Amen. We are asked to kneel again following the Lamb of God until we stand to get in line for communion. **When we return to their seats after communion, we are asked to kneel again until the presider returns the consecrated hosts to the Tabernacle.**

Using the same prayer posture, all together, expresses our gratitude to God and our unity, both with one another at St. Louise and with all the other parishes throughout our Archdiocese. Thank you!

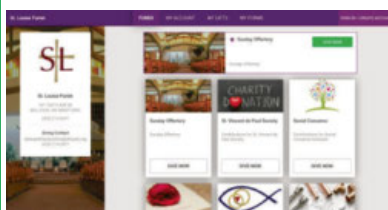

Recordatorio de Posturas de Oración para la Comunión



Para aumentar nuestro sentido de unidad, el Arzobispo Etienne instituyó un cambio en nuestra práctica litúrgica aquí en St. Louise y en todas las parroquias de la Arquidiócesis en junio de 2020. Esto se anunció

justo después de que las Misas públicas comenzaran nuevamente de manera limitada, por lo que es probable que muchos la gente ni siquiera es consciente del cambio.

Durante las oraciones eucarísticas, ahora se pide a todos que se arrodillen o se sienten inmediatamente después de la Sanctus (Santo, Santo Santo) hasta el Gran Amén. Se nos pide que nos arrodilemos nuevamente siguiendo al Cordero de Dios hasta que nos pongamos de pie para hacer fila para la comunión. **Cuando regresamos a sus asientos después de la comunión, se nos pide que nos arrodilemos nuevamente hasta que el Celebrante devuelva las hostias consagradas al Tabernáculo.**

El uso de la misma postura de oración, todos juntos, expresa nuestra gratitud a Dios y nuestra unidad, tanto entre nosotros en St. Louise como con todas las demás parroquias de nuestra arquidiócesis. ¡Gracias!

Sabemos que el **Papa Francisco ha dicho en numerosas ocasiones que todas las personas, sin importar quienes sean, tienen derecho a ser parte de una familia.** Los padres no deberían rechazar a sus hijos y siempre deberían recibirlos como miembros de la familia. Él ha mencionado esto especialmente a los padres de hijos homosexuales. Y el Papa Francisco también nos llama a reconocer el papel vital que los abuelos juegan en la vida familiar. Un tema importante para el Papa es que la Iglesia pueda servir para vencer una cultura del “descarte” – refiriéndose a la pecaminosa indiferencia, tanto hacia las personas, como hacia nuestro medio ambiente.

Como dice el Papa Francisco, las vidas de los casados se convierten en una sola vida; ellos se convierten en “nosotros”, en amorosa comunión con Jesús, vivo y presente en cada momento de su existencia. Visto de esta forma, el sacramento del Matrimonio, que tiene raíces en nuestro bautismo, puede servir como un lente a través del cual vemos nuestras relaciones y al mundo. Sirve para el bien de todos, lo cual es una buena razón para dar gracias y alabar a Dios.

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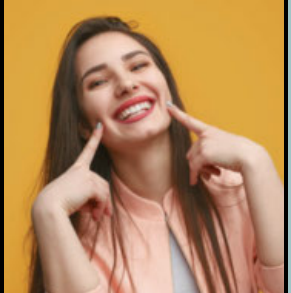
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
