## **Christmas Bright at Catholic Charities**

Over 5,000 gifts donated to individuals at Straight and Narrow, CFCS and the Department for Persons with Disabilities.

Catholic Charities, Diocese of Paterson is proud to provide help and create hope for thousands of people in need throughout the year, especially during the Christmas Season.

Over 5,000 presents were handed out to children, families, people with disabilities, seniors, and Veterans. Hundreds of hours of volunteer service were provided by kindhearted individuals from throughout the Diocese. Our food pantries served thousands of pounds of food during this special time.



Instead of exchanging gifts with each other, the Nicosia Family purchased, gift wrapped and delivered gifts this lovely family of 5, served at the Father English Food Pantry.

Here are some of the acts of kindness that were offered to Catholic Charities during this Christmas Season:

 In November, Catholic Charities Trustee, Katherine M. (Karen) Lordi hosted the 46th Annual Christmas Concert to benefit Catholic Family & Community Services. Over 75 guests enjoyed the hour-long concert at Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church (Morristown), featuring Karen Lordi (Organ), Peter Kanyuk (Saxophone), Joyce Kanyuk (Vocal), Justin Carrasco (Trumpet and Vocal) and the Woman's Club of Morristown Chorus. Over the past four and a half decades, the Lordi Christmas Concert has raised approximately \$500,000 to support various youth programs at Catholic Charities.

 undertaking that begins in October with
 the 23 Parishes and 7 community schools/
 agencies. Kind donors contributed over


time with the children at FECC. Michael is truly missed but very present to everyone thru their love and spirit.

## Hope House Participates in Project Homeless Connect

Leadership Staff from Catholic Charities, Diocese of Paterson, Hope House participated in Project Homeless Connect on January 24th at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Morristown.

Project Homeless Connect is a daylong, consumer focused, one-stop event designed to provide an array of resources and support to those experiencing homelessness in Morris County.

Project Homeless Connect began in 2004, when the city of San Francisco organized a special day dedicated to providing necessary services to the homeless.

The Morris County Project Homeless Connect event began in 2008 under the leadership of the Mental Health Association and typically serves about 200 people per year.

Some 43 community-based service providers, including Catholic Charities, participated and helped provide resources free of charge.


In 2018, NJCounts found 9,303 homeless men, women and children (300 in Morris County) in 6,982 households across New Jersey.

Catholic Charities' Community Emergency Support (CES) Program in Morris County offers a homeless prevention program to assist families to prevent potential homelessness or transition from a state of homelessness to Morris County Residents. This program offers clients short term financial assistance and linkage to basic essential services like food and clothing from our Hope House Choice Pantry.

## El Mundo de Colores Participates in the Full Service Community Schools Program

Beginning in the 2018 school year, El Mundo de Colores has been chosen to partner with Paterson Public School #2 in the Full-Service Community Schools Program. Since 2010, with an aim of building a path that encourages lifelong learning for students, the Paterson School District's FSCS program works to address the needs of students and parents in a more foundational way.

Funded through the U.S. Department of Education, preparing and supporting children's learning and development are crucial components of the program. Understanding that parental involvement remains a chief determiner of lasting student success, enhanced parent training

and increased parental involvement in the school community are core beliefs of the initiative. To facilitate the transition to elementary school, upon graduation, El Mundo de Colores' newly minted graduates, and their parents/guardians will be invited to participate in School #2's Kindergarten Bridge Program to take place in summer 2019. During the summer institute students and families will become acclimated to their new school environment, their teachers and enhanced services available to Paterson families. The offered services include: an in-school health clinic (vision; pediatric and dental); individualized parent/guardian counseling for health, nutrition and wellness; in-school academic assistance and afterschool and summer programs.

We welcome our participation in this vital program and look forward to our ongoing collaboration!
