EAST ORANGE, NJ – Join us in congratulating Veteran and SSVF Healthcare Navigator Ivette Caban on her award!

On March 21st, the City of East Orange celebrated Women's History Month on their annual WHM Awards Ceremony.

Ivette was selected as a Hidden Figure - someone who acts behind the scenes, making a difference. Ivette improves the lives of hundreds of veteran men and women who, like her, made their country their calling.

Veterans in New Jersey face a multitude of challenges that impact their well-being and quality of life. Financial instability is a significant concern, with nearly one in four veterans struggling to meet basic needs.

A report from the United Way of Northern New Jersey revealed that in 2019, 24% of the state's veterans lived below the ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) threshold. This highlights the economic hardships many veterans endure despite their service.

Mental health issues further exacerbate the difficulties faced by New Jersey's veterans. The 2023 National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report points that in New Jersey, 53 veterans lost their lives to suicide that year, underscoring the urgent need for comprehensive mental health support and services tailored to the unique experiences of veterans.



March for Meals Celebrates Essential Support for Sussex County Seniors









Gruenert Center Client Wins Honorable Mention in New York Art Show





Our Straight & Narrow clients enjoyed their time outdoors by engaging in a nature walk, swimming, in the pool and practicing social skills during a BBQ.


