Brothers and sisters in Christ,

There is a pressing issue before our country today: the future of a very important group of young immigrants called the "Dreamers." Dreamers are the 1.8 million young people who were brought to the United States as children by their parents through no fault of their own. They often know America as their only home. Dreamers are woven into the fabric of our country and of our Church. They are contributors to our economy, veterans of our military, and leaders in our parishes and communities.

There is a need for a permanent legislative solution for the Dreamers, so they will not have to live their lives in constant fear of deportation, which brings with it separation from their families and real dangers of violence and poverty in their countries of birth. Some Dreamers enjoy limited legal protection now, but those protections will begin to expire on March 5. The U.S. Congress is deadlocked over this important issue, so I urge you to take a few moments on this coming Monday, February 26, to join with Catholics across the country, in calling their Senators and Representatives to urge them to give Dreamers legal protection and a path to citizenship.

To make this easier, you will find an insert in your bulletin with all the information you'll need, including the toll-free number to call to reach Congress, and a message you can share with your legislators. Thank you for your prayers, and for taking action on behalf of our immigrant brothers and sisters, who are among the most vulnerable in our society.

25 de febrero 2018 II Domingo de Cuaresma

¡¡¡Éste es mi hijo amado; escúchenlo!!!

Esta narración de la Transfiguración del Señor en el monte Tabor, nos hace reflexionar sobre varios aspectos de la figura de Jesús, y de su plan de salvación. Pero aquí solo comentare algo.

No deja de producir un contraste lo resplandeciente de los vestidos de Jesús transfigurado, con el color intensamente morado de los ornamentos litúrgicos que se usan en la



Cuaresma. Quiere con esto decirnos la Iglesia que no perdamos de vista el sentido total y completo de la Cuaresma y de todo el Misterio cristiano: detrás del sufrimiento, y de la austeridad, lo fundamental es el triunfo y la alegría; el color más cristiano es el del resplandor.

Este pasaje, que está conectado con el hecho de la Redención misma (San Marcos especifica que Jesús conversaba con Moisés y Elías). Es un signo que ayuda a descubrir el sentido mismo de la Pasión. Por eso mismo lo pone la Iglesia como lectura en plena Cuaresma (que es el camino hacia la Semana Santa). Para que sepamos que la Pasión y la Muerte de Jesús, tienen un significado luminoso, porque desde ahí aparecerá la gloria del Señor en todo el esplendor de la Resurrección. La muerte del Señor es la fiesta de la Vida, la llave que abre las fuentes de la Vida. Y por eso la Transfiguración nos ayuda a entender de verdad la Cuaresma.

Hay una necesidad de una solución legislativa permanente para los Soñadores, para que no tengan que vivir sus vidas con el miedo constante de ser deportados, separados de sus familias, expuestos a los peligros reales de la violencia y la pobreza en sus países natales.

Algunos Soñadores gozan de protecciones legales hoy, pero esas protecciones legales caducan a partir del 5 de marzo. El Congreso de los Estados Unidos no llega a un acuerdo sobre esta cuestión urgente, y por eso les invito a tomarse un momento este lunes, 26 de febrero, a unirse con los Católicos por todo el país en llamar a sus Senadores y Representantes en el Congreso e instarles a dar protección legal a los Soñadores con un camino hacia la ciudadanía. Para facilitar el proceso, usted encontrará un inserto en su boletín con toda la información necesaria, incluyendo el número gratis para contactar el Congreso, y el mensaje que puede compartir con sus legisladores. Gracias por sus oraciones, y por actuar y ofrecer su apoyo a nuestros hermanos y hermanas inmigrantes que están entre los sectores más vulnerables de nuestra sociedad.

Because we feel it is important that you know how and where your donations to Helping Hands are spent, here is what was done last week:

Electricity	10 families	\$ 3,456.39

We were recently told of a man who has cancer but cannot afford medical treatment. The information we received was that the man had no insurance and doctors would not treat him because he had no money. Realizing that there must be more to the story than we had been told, we set up an appointment to meet with this man.

Sam is a 54-year-old man who works full-time in maintenance at a local office building. He was diagnosed with prostate cancer that later spread to his bones. Fortunately he did have medical insurance and began receiving care.

But then the bills for those expenses not covered by insurance began pouring in. Sam pays \$1.200 per month for child support, leaving him \$750 per month for his own living expenses. He began to fall behind on medical expenses. He made the mistake of taking out a payday loan (loans that charge exorbitant interest rates in exchange for quick cash). He quickly realized that not only was he unable to catch up, he was falling deeper in the hole.

He quit his medical treatment. The staffs from his doctors' offices called him and tried to persuade him to continue treatments, because without help he would surely die an unnecessarily early death.

He told us that his doctors and nurses have "blessed me for all they've done." But he just doesn't have the money, and he doesn't want to leave his family with the barrage of medical bills that keep accumulating.

We asked him how he is still able to go to work every day. Obviously he must be weak and in some pain. He leans back in his chair, looks up at the ceiling and smiles: "Every day I thank our good Lord for letting me see another day. And if I can get out of bed and go to work I will. God has been good to me."

We are working with Sam on his medical bills, and he has promised us that he will return to treatment. Please pray for him.
