#### The Power of Transformation: From Rejection to Redemption

**Introduction:** Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today we gather to reflect upon the transformative power of God's love and grace. Our readings from Ezekiel, Philippians, and Matthew remind us of the importance of repentance, humility, and the willingness to change our hearts. Let us open our hearts to the Word of God as we explore the message of transformation and redemption found in these passages.

#### I. The Call to Repentance (Ezekiel 18:25-28)

Our first reading from the Book of Ezekiel speaks to us about the call to repentance. In this passage, God challenges the idea that the sins of one generation are automatically passed down to the next. He declares, "Yet you say, 'The way of the Lord is not just.' Hear now, O house of Israel: Is my way not just? Is it not your ways that are not just?" (Ezekiel 18:25).

God calls us to examine our ways and turn from our sinful paths. He promises that if we repent and turn to Him, we shall live and not die. This passage reminds us that God's justice is rooted in mercy, and He desires that we seek forgiveness and transformation.

#### II. The Humility of Christ (Philippians 2:1-11)

Our second reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Philippians reveals the ultimate example of humility in the person of Jesus Christ. St. Paul writes, "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility, value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others" (Philippians 2:3-4).

Paul reminds us of Jesus' humility, who, though equal with God, emptied Himself and took on the form of a servant. He humbled Himself even to the point of death on a cross. Through Christ's humility and obedience, God exalted Him and gave Him the name above every name.

#### III. The Parable of the Two Sons (Matthew 21:28-32)

Our Gospel reading from Matthew presents the Parable of the Two Sons. In this parable, a father asks his two sons to go and work in the vineyard. The first son initially refuses but later goes, while the second son agrees but does not go. Jesus asks, "Which of the two did the will of his father?" The crowd rightly answers, "The first."

This parable teaches us that actions speak louder than words. It's not enough to say we will follow God; we must actually do His will. Repentance involves a change in our hearts that leads to transformation in our actions.

#### El Poder de la Transformación: De la Rechazo a la Redención

**Introducción:** Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo, hoy nos reunimos para reflexionar sobre el poder transformador del amor y la gracia de Dios. Nuestras lecturas de Ezequiel, Filipenses y Mateo nos recuerdan la importancia del arrepentimiento, la humildad y la disposición para cambiar nuestros corazones. Abramos nuestros corazones a la Palabra de Dios mientras exploramos el mensaje de transformación y redención que se encuentra en estos pasajes.

#### I. El Llamado al Arrepentimiento (Ezequiel 18:25-28)

Nuestra primera lectura del libro de Ezequiel nos habla del llamado al arrepentimiento. En este pasaje, Dios desafía la idea de que los pecados de una generación se transmiten automáticamente a la siguiente. Él declara: "Dices: 'El camino del Señor no es justo'. Escucha ahora, casa de Israel: ¿No es mi camino el que es justo? ¿No son vuestros caminos los que no son justos?" (Ezequiel 18:25).Dios nos llama a examinar nuestros caminos y apartarnos de nuestros caminos pecaminosos. Promete que si nos arrepentimos y volvemos a Él, viviremos y no moriremos. Este pasaje nos recuerda que la justicia de Dios está arraigada en la misericordia y que desea que busquemos el perdón y la transformación.

#### II. La Humildad de Cristo (Filipenses 2:1-11)

Nuestra segunda lectura de la carta de San Pablo a los Filipenses revela el ejemplo supremo de humildad en la persona de Jesucristo. San Pablo escribe: "Nada hagan por egoísmo o vanidad personal; más bien, con humildad consideren a los demás como superiores a ustedes mismos. Cada uno debe velar no solo por sus propios intereses, sino también por los intereses de los demás" (Filipenses 2:3-4). Pablo nos recuerda la humildad de Jesús, quien, aunque era igual a Dios, se despojó de sí mismo y tomó la forma de siervo. Se humilló incluso hasta la muerte en la cruz. A través de la humildad y la obediencia de Cristo, Dios lo exaltó y le dio un nombre sobre todo nombre.

#### III. La Parábola de los Dos Hijos (Mateo 21:28-32)

Nuestra lectura del Evangelio de Mateo presenta la Parábola de los Dos Hijos. En esta parábola, un padre les pide a sus dos hijos que vayan a trabajar en la viña. El primer hijo inicialmente se niega, pero luego va, mientras que el segundo hijo acepta, pero no va. Jesús pregunta: "¿Cuál de los dos hizo la voluntad de su padre?" La multitud responde correctamente: "El primero".

Esta parábola nos enseña que las acciones hablan más alto que las palabras. No basta con decir que seguiremos a Dios; debemos hacer realmente su voluntad. El arrepentimiento implica un cambio en nuestros corazones que conduce a una transformación en nuestras acciones.

Recently we received a letter with a very generous donation. The letter read:

My husband and I appreciate the way you all manage Helping Hands:

- How you update the community
- How you select recipients
- How you try to use every donated item or cash to maximize the benefit.

I hope we can be regular donors and volunteer time. Thanks for all you do.

What a great letter! This couple certainly has their fingers on the pulse of Helping Hands. We have always felt it key to let everyone know just exactly where our money goes. Since we survive solely on donations from the public we feel obligated to let you know just how your money is spent. Our books are wide open to anyone who cares to look at them. All of our workers are volunteers. There are absolutely no paid salaries. Money to pay utilities, gas for the trucks, garbage disposal etc. are all paid from proceeds from the thrift store, so you can be assured that every penny that you donate to us goes to help the poor. And how blessed we are to be able to do so much each week for our neighbors in need. God bless you for making that happen!

We are careful in selecting recipients. When someone calls our helpline, we ask that they leave the last four digits of their social security number. Most of the benevolent agencies in Midland use Charity Tracker, a computer database that contains each person's past history of getting assistance. It becomes fairly easy to weed out those people who are, or who are trying to be, habitual abusers of the system. Granted there are some people who do require repeated assistance due to age, medical disabilities or other reasons, but they are few. Each person that we meet with is counseled on how to change their living situations to prevent them from getting in that particular situation again. If someone tries to come back again and again and they have done nothing to better their lives then we will decline them. The money is better spent assisting someone who is in a crisis situation over which they have no control.

We work poor. If a piece of office equipment breaks down we look in our store to see if we have a similar item that has been donated to us. If necessary we repair it. We try never to buy new. And again, there are no salaries, so we are most able to maximize the benefits.

How we would love to have this wonderful couple come and volunteer time with us! If anyone is interested in joining our family, all they need do is come on down! We are here Monday through Saturday from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m. Or you can call Mary at (432) 528-6265 anytime. Thanks, and God bless!
