Fr. Bala Sunday Reflection

Heeding God's Voice in a Distracted World

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today, our readings from Deuteronomy, Psalms, Corinthians, and Mark converge around a central theme: the call to listen to God's voice and the challenge of responding amidst the distractions of our world. Let us delve into these sacred texts to uncover the wisdom they offer for our lives today.

In Deuteronomy 18:15-20, we are reminded of God's promise to raise a prophet like Moses, through whom He will speak. This prophet, we know, is Jesus Christ.

God's admonition is clear: "Listen to him." This is not merely an invitation but a command to hear and heed the voice of God as relayed through His chosen messenger. In a world brimming with voices vying for our attention, how often do we pause to listen to the voice of God? Are we attuned to the gentle whisper of the Holy Spirit amidst the clamor of our daily lives?

The Psalmist in Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 7-9, invites us to sing and bow down in worship, acknowledging God as our Maker. Yet, it also warns us not to harden our hearts as the Israelites did at Meribah and Massah. They heard God's voice but did not trust or obey it. How often do we, too, harden our hearts? We come to church, we sing the hymns, but do we truly open our hearts to let God's word transform us? Or do we leave unchanged, our hearts hardened by skepticism, pride, or indifference?

In 1 Corinthians 7:32-35, Paul speaks about the concerns of the unmarried and married states. His underlying message is about undivided devotion to the Lord. In a world that constantly pulls us in multiple directions, how can we maintain a focus on God? Our relationships, careers, and even our personal ambitions can become distractions if they lead us away from God. Paul urges us to evaluate our lives and consider how our commitments impact our relationship with God. Are we divided in our loyalties, or do we seek first the Kingdom of God?

Finally, in Mark 1:21-28, we see Jesus teaching in the synagogue with authority and casting out an unclean spirit. People were amazed at his teaching because he spoke as one having authority, not as the scribes. This passage challenges us to recognize and respond to the authority of Jesus in our lives. Do we acknowledge His power to transform and renew? Or do we, like the scribes, rely on our own understanding and interpretations?

Brothers and sisters, let us take these scriptures to heart. Let us strive to be like the prophet who speaks God's truth, like the worshipper who sings with an open heart, like the believer who maintains an undivided focus on God, and like the faithful who recognize and respond to the authority of Christ.

1. El matrimonio es para amar. Y amar es una decisión, no un sentimiento. Amar es donación. La medida del amor es la capacidad de sacrificio. La medida del amor es amar sin medida. Quien no sabe morir, no sabe amar. No olvides: "amar ya es recompensa en sí", Amar es buscar el bien del otro: cuanto más grande el bien, mayor el amor. Los hijos son la plenitud del amor matrimonial.
2. El amor verdadero no caduca. Se mantiene fresco y dura hasta la muerte, a pesar de que toda convivencia a la larga traiga problemas. El amor, ama hoy y mañana. El capricho, sólo ama hoy. Los matrimonios son como los jarrones de museo: entre más años y heridas tengan, más valen, siempre y cuando permanezcan íntegros. Soportar las heridas y la lima del tiempo, y mantenerse en una sola pieza es lo que más valor les da. El amor hace maravillas.
3. Toda fidelidad matrimonial debe pasar por la prueba más exigente: la de la duración. La fidelidad es constancia. En la vida hay que elegir entre lo fácil o lo correcto. Es fácil ser coherente algunos días. Correcto ser coherente toda la vida. Es fácil ser coherente en la hora de alegría, correcto serlo en la hora de la tribulación. La coherencia que dura a lo largo de toda la vida se llama fidelidad. Correcto es amar en la dificultad porque es cuando más lo necesitan.
4. Séneca afirma: "Si quieres ser amado, ama". El verdadero amor busca en el otro no algo para disfrutar, sino alguien a quien hacer feliz. La felicidad de tu pareja debe ser tu propia felicidad. No te has casado con un cuerpo, te has casado con una persona, que será feliz amando y siendo amada. No te casas para ser feliz. Te casas para hacer feliz a tu pareja.
5. El matrimonio, no es "matrimonio." De ti depende que la vida conyugal no sea como una fortaleza sitiada, en la que, según el dicho, "los que están fuera, desearían entrar, pero los que están dentro, quisieran salir".
6. El amor matrimonial es como una fogata, se apaga si no la alimentas. Cada recuerdo es un alimento del amor. Piensa mucho y bien de tu pareja. Fíjate en sus virtudes y perdona sus defectos. Que el amor sea tu amar es hacer que el amado exista para siempre. Amar es decir: "Tú, gracias a mí, no morirás".
7. Para perseverar en el amor hasta la muerte, vive las tres "Des": Dios. Diálogo. Detalles.
 8. a. Dios: "Familia que reza unida, permanece unida".
 9. b. Diálogo, para evitar que los problemas crezcan.
10. c. Detalles: de palabra y de obra. "Qué bonito peinado". "¿Qué se te antoja comer?" "Eres el mejor esposo del mundo". "Hoy, la cena la hago yo". "Nuestros hijos están orgullosos de ti". El amor matrimonial nunca puede estar ocioso.

A recent post on the Nextdoor app sparked this column today. In her post the woman claims that her husband beat her in front of her children, knocked several of her teeth out, had their car repossessed and now she and her children are homeless on the streets. She said she tried to find help, even going so far as to contact all the churches in Midland, but the no one would help her. She then said she had a Go Fund Me and begged people to send her money. We immediately replied that we suspected a scam and to please not send her money. This is Midland, after all, and there is plenty of help for people in her situation. This situation reminded us of a case from several years ago. We are re-running it to show just how the people of Midland operate:

Susan called our helpline last week asking for help with her mortgage. She was very far behind, she said, and facing foreclosure. We called her and found out that she is the mother of five children ranging in age from 18 months to 13 years. When we asked her the status of her employment she said that she works part time jobs, mainly as a substitute teacher, but she also babysits, takes care of pets, and whatever odd jobs she can scrape up. We asked about the father of the children and she said that he left two years ago and she assumes he is in Mexico now to avoid paying child support. He is the natural father of all of he children. She cannot work a full time job, she explained, because her youngest child was born with bilateral vesicoureteral reflux (VUR) that results in ongoing kidney infections and seizures. They must make frequent trips to Cook Children's Hospital in Ft. Worth for the specialized treatment that her daughter requires. While her husband did not pay child support she said that she was able o keep up with bills the first year since they had a joint checking account which he continued to put money into, however about a year ago he closed it, leaving her and the children to fend for themselves.

She was seriously behind on her mortgage and while Wells Fargo had done an admirable job of trying to work with her, they said Susan could no longer stay in her home without catching up on back payments. Foreclosure papers wee issued. She had 60 days to bring her account current or she had to vacate the home. Wells Fargo told her that if she could bring her account current, they would be able to refinance her home and bring her monthly payment down to something more affordable. She was in arrears over \$7,000 (4 months of mortgage).

We asked her how she managed...with 5 children, one very ill, no steady job, and bills upon bills that she cannot pay. What kept her going? She replied that she cannot fail her children. Her children, she said, are innocent and deserve the best mother than she can be to them. When asked how she felt about her husband, she said that she had no time for dwelling on something she can do nothing about. Her priority is her family.

We shared her situation on Charity Tracker, a computer database used by most of the benevolence agencies in Midland. We immediately found out that there was widespread support for Susan ,and several churches volunteered to share in the expense of helping Susan keep her home. Special thanks to First Presbyterian Church, First Baptist Church, First United Methodist Church and Midland Fairhavens for joining with us to pay Susan's past due debt in full so that she can refinance her home and keep her family safe.

Please pay for this remarkable lady. And thank all of you for your continued support of Helping Hands that allows us to help people such as Susan. May God bless you abundantly!

So yes, there is help in Midland. Churches and social service agencies abound and we are here to help anyone with a legitimate need. Please be very careful and thoroughly research Go Fund Me accounts as well as the panhandlers on the street, since, as we all know, unfortunately scammers are everywhere.

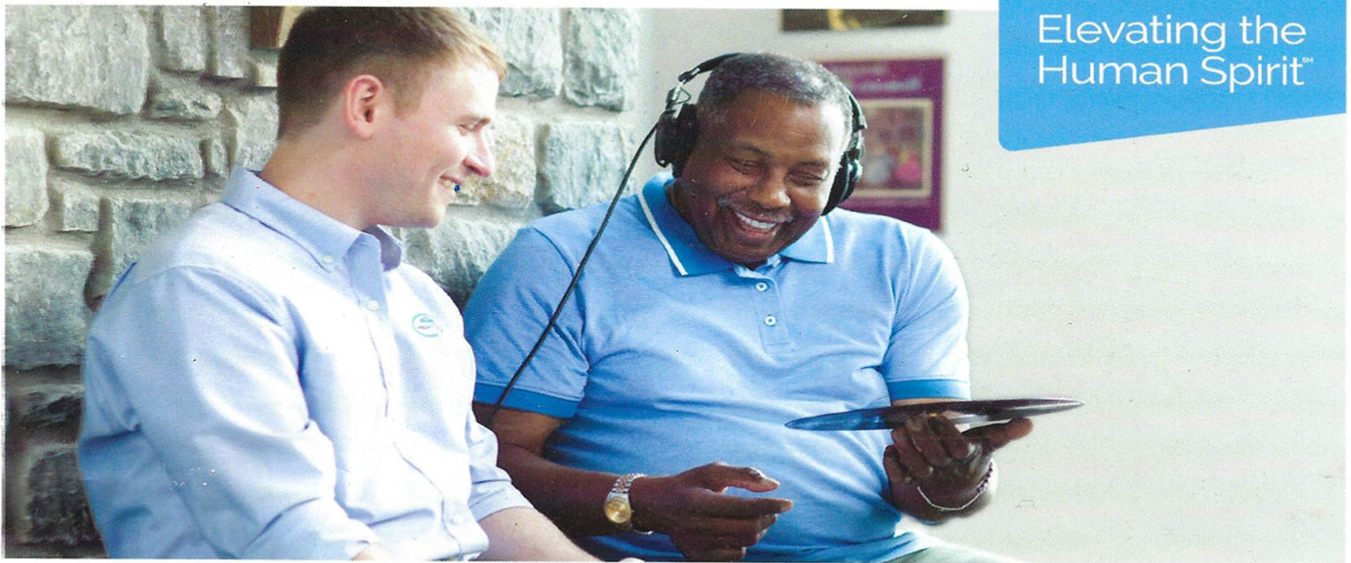
