SUNDAY REFLECTION BY FR. IGNATIUS EDET

Dear brothers and sisters,

As we make progress in our Lenten journey, we are reminded that true repentance means leading a life that reflects our communion with God whom we encounter in varied ways, especially in his Sacred Word and the Holy Eucharist.

A Terrifying and Fascinating Mystery

Moses' encounter with God in today's first reading (Ex 3:1-8,13-15) echoes a fundamental truth about God in the Judeo-Christian understanding, namely, as a mystery that inspires both awe and fascination at the same time. God is not just a mysterious being who causes creation, especially human beings to tremble before his majesty. He is equally a *personal Being*, who attracts humanity towards himself. He is a mystery that both terrifies and fascinates, repels and attracts at the same time. Besides, God is not merely the creator of the world; that is, an absent, detached or remote creator who cares little about his creation. To the contrary, he is eternally present, active, and deeply interested in his creation. Indeed, he is particularly always concerned with and touched by the lives and circumstances of his people. Understanding this twofold nature of God is very important for the shaping of our imagination and relationship with God. It likewise influences our attitude towards him as well as the mission (or ethical duty) that flows from our encounter and relationship with him.

God is Essentially Relational

God is not a solitary being either in himself or in relation to creation. The relational nature of God in himself is expressed, above all, in the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (hereafter, CCC) asserts in this regard: "for there is only one God, the almighty Father, his only Son and the Holy Spirit: the Most Holy Trinity" (CCC §233). The inner life of the three divine persons in the Trinity expresses itself concretely in the history of salvation through creation, redemption and sanctification (CCC §235). Accordingly, the *Catechism* states clearly: "The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men 'and reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin'" (CCC §234). This underscores God's relation to creation as a whole and to human beings in particular.

The Significance of God's Closeness to Us

Today's first reading demonstrates the relational nature of God in at least three ways:

- 1) God's revelation of himself as the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (cf. Mt 22:32);
- 2) God's awareness of the suffering of the people of Israel and his decision to intervene on their behalf; and
- 3) God's revelation of his personal name, I AM.

The uniqueness of the God of revelation is that he sees, hears, cares, empathises, and acts. As the psalmist declares, it is unimaginable that He who made the eyes, ears, and to whom all powers in heaven and under the heavens are subject would be otherwise (Ps 94:9-14). In the same vein, the prophet Isaiah exhorts the Israelites to trust in the Lord in anticipation of their liberation from Babylon: "Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save, or his ear dull, that it cannot hear" (Is 59:1; see Num 11:23).

Being omniscient, God sees and knows everything, especially the plight of his people. And so, he tells Moses: "I have witnessed the affliction of my people in Egypt." Further, he asserts that he is the One who hears the cry of the poor and oppressed (see Ps 34:6,17): "[I] have heard their cry of complaint against their slave drivers." Furthermore, he does not just see and hear but also identifies with their travails. "So," he says to Moses, "I know well what they are suffering." 'Knowing well' here is beyond abstract knowledge or familiarity with data and statistics or charts. It is a consequence of sharing deeply in their travails precisely as those created in his image and likeness (Gn 1: 27) and as his chosen people to whom he had bound himself in a special covenant through their ancestors. As Jesus emphasises in the Gospel, whatever is done to the least of his brothers and sisters is done to God – same with the contrary (see Mt 25:40, 45). Finally, deeply touched by their plight, he is moved to act, to liberate them from servitude and restore them to the land of promise: "Therefore I have come down to rescue them from the hands of the Egyptians and lead them out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey." To this mission he enlists Moses as his chosen instrument.

God is Always Present and Active

Meanwhile, God's actions are not merely historical or sporadic events. They are not consigned to the past. They are ongoing, consistent and constant. He acts unfailingly and continually, in the present and into the future. Thus, the sacred writer asserts: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness" (Lam 3:22-23, ESV).

This is the meaning of the sacred name that he revealed to Moses – I AM. It means, literally, "I am always there" ... "I will always be there ..." Now, the mystery encapsulated by this sacred name is fully manifested in the mystery of the incarnation and is expressed in the divinely given name of the eternal-word-made-flesh – Immanuel, God with us – the same yesterday, today, and forever (Heb 13:8). In a similar way, the liberation from slavery in Egypt to which Moses (Aaron) was assigned to bring about foreshadowed the ultimate liberation of the people from sin and death by Jesus Christ, thereby, establishing a new and eternal covenant between God and humanity. The apostle Paul alludes to this in the second reading (1 Co 10:1-6,10-12), when he identifies Christ as the rock from which Moses gave the Israelites water to drink during their exodus: "All ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they drank from a spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was the Christ" (cf. Jn 6:32-33).

Granted, through the paschal mystery of his suffering, death and resurrection, Jesus Christ has won salvation for us, definitively. Yet, we must constantly strive through openness to God's grace and mercy to embrace it and express its fruits in our thoughts, words and actions. This calls for constant conversion and renewal on our part. Lent particularly offers us a unique opportunity and time to intensify our effort and commitment in this regard.

Against this backdrop, in the Gospel (Lk 13:1-9), Jesus expresses a strong sense of God's action in the here and now and offers a salutary warning to us, to repent or risk damnation: "But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!"

See, Judge, and Act

This mystery does not just speak to us loosely as we journey through Lent towards the Easter festivities. Confronted with sundry evils and human inhumanity towards human beings – and other members of our common home – around us and in the world at large, it speaks to us concretely and forcefully about our responsibility, like God, to see, hear, be well aware of, understand, and feel the cries of our suffering, marginalised, and persecuted brothers and sisters, and to take solid steps to act to liberate them. God has set before us an example of how to respond in the face of any evil, especially when the safety, life, wellbeing and/or future of the poor, vulnerable, and marginalised is concerned – in our family, community, nation, or globally. Through our Lenten observances may we receive the grace to always see, hear, judge and act like God, to the praise, glory and honour of Him who lives and reigns eternally — Father, Son, and Holy Father. Amen!

TIEMPO DE PENITENCIA Y CONVERSIÓN.

23 de marzo 2025 Hermana Gertrudis Muñoz Mendieta

El pasaje del Santo Evangelio de hoy Lucas 13,1-9 nos invita a la conversión y a reflexionar sobre la paciencia y misericordia de Dios que nos ofrece la oportunidad para dar frutos en nuestra vida espiritual.

En tiempo de Jesús era normal considerar los males de este mundo como "castigos de Dios". Por eso podían pensar que los que derramaron su sangre en la época de Pilato y los que murieron aplastados por la torre de Siloé, murieron como castigo de Dios. Y de ahí se sacaba la consecuencia de que aquellos a quienes no les ocurría esas desgracias era porque eran buenas personas.

Jesús se opone radicalmente a esta manera de concebir la religión. Y nos dice que aquellos que mueren de accidente o de enfermedad contagiosa, o de coronavirus, no es por castigo de Dios. Todavía Jesús lo dejó más claro cuando le presentan un ciego de nacimiento y le hacen esta pregunta: Maestro, ¿Quién pecó para que naciera ciego? ¿Él o sus padres? Y Jesús contesta: Ni él ni sus padres". (Juan 9,2-3). El Dios manifestado en Jesús no es un Dios que castiga, sino que ama y se mete dentro del dolor humano para liberarnos. Esta idea de que nuestros males son castigos de Dios ha llegado hasta nuestros días. Por eso, incluso entre cristianos, se oye decir: ¿Qué le he hecho yo a Dios para que me castigue? Decía Santa Teresa de Jesús: "Señor, con grandes favores castigabais mis delitos". Esa es la manera que tiene Dios de castigarnos. Incluso cuando nuestra vida se parece a esa "higuera seca que no produce frutos", no la corta, sino que, con una paciencia increíble, la cava, la abona, la riega, la mima, para que dé fruto. Dios no nos tiene en cuenta nuestros pecados. Lo que quiere es que volvamos a Él. "A veces nos comportamos como controladores de la gracia, y no como facilitadores. Pero la Iglesia no es una Aduana, es la casa donde hay lugar cada uno. vida paterna para con su cuestas". (Papa Francisco).






