SUNDAY REFLECTION BY FR. IGNATIUS EDET

Dear brothers and sisters,

Today, we rejoice in the risen Lord who continues to reveal himself to his disciples after his resurrection. Evidently, the appearances of the risen Lord occupy an important place in the Easter story. They are fundamental to the Chrisitan faith in the resurrection as the apostle Paul highlights in 1 Corinthains 15:3-8. For they deepen the reality of the empty tomb which, on its own, would not exhaustively demonstrate the resurrection. Yet, as the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* puts it, remains "the first element we encounter in the framework of the Easter events" (CCC 640). Through these encounters, the risen Lord gradually convinces the disciples that he is indeed risen, strengthens their floundering faith, renews, restores, and empowers them to witness to the paschal mystery. Against their failures, betrayals, and lukewarmness, the encounter with the risen Lord particularly reassures them that, indeed, love conquers all things.

Love Writ Large

God's unfathomable love and mercy is clear and obvious in the appearances and interactions of the risen Lord with his disciples. His patience and tolerance in the face of their slowness to believe or lack of understanding about the resurrection is unsurprising. It resonates with his merciful attitude and outlook towards sinners (see Mt 9:9-13; Lk 19:1-10; Jn 8:1-11) which climaxes on the Cross. There, he readily forgives and prays for his tormentors: "Father, forgive them for they know not what they are doing" (Lk 23:32). This is astonishing. Reflecting on this, the apostle Paul reminds us that nothing demonstrates God's love for humanity than the fact that "Christ died for us while we were still sinners" (Rm 5:8). The risen Lord repeatedly makes this palpable through his post-resurrection appearances to his initially doubting disciples. Thus, he draws them into the mystery of the Resurrection – not simply as an event, but as an encounter with divine love, a love that conquers all.

A Powerful Resurrection Encounter

Last Sunday, the risen Lord appeared for the second time to the disciples behind locked doors. At the centre was Thomas who was absent at his first appearance and had vowed not to believe unless he personally saw the risen Lord and physically inspected his wounded body. Instead of condemning him, he was unconditionally forgiven and reassured of God's love as he was helped to overcome his initial doubt. Overwhelmed, he confessed Jesus as Lord and God.

Today, the Risen Jesus appears to his disciples by the Sea of Tiberias (also known as the Sea of Galilee or the Sea Gennesaret). It is a very intriguing episode. Led by Simon Peter, they had gone to fish. Was this a routine activity to provide for themselves? Were they giving up already on their evangelising ministry as 'fishers of men' (see Mt 4:19; Mk 1:17; Lk 5:10b) — and so, were trying to return to their former trade as fishermen? Oddly, the evangelist does not give us any hint either way. So, whether they simply went to find subsistence or were abandoning their new calling because of the 'absence' of their Master, the failure of this venture seems more important to the evangelist than any such details: They had toiled the whole night without any success. Imagine their disappointment, fatigue and frustration! Then comes the risen Lord; already waiting for them on the shore. He meets them in their failure, in their fatigue, and in their frustration. Like with Thomas, he comes not with blame, but with breakfast. And, ultimately, with mercy! Through his outreach to them, the risen Lord concretely demonstrates God's steadfastness. He reminds us clearly that God never abandons us! Come what may, he is and will always be there. True to his name: Immanuel — God-with-us! His presence and command changes everything. Besides, this episode is rich in symbolism: echoes of the calling of the first disciples; sacramental imageries; and the imperative of mission.

Renewal of Initial Calling

The setting reminds us of the calling of Simon Peter and the first disciples by the same lake in Luke 5:1-11. In fact, there are significant parallels between both episodes which, to say the least, are theologically suggestive. First, the same location and activity. Second, the failure of the Simon Peter and his companions in their fishing expedition. Third, meeting Jesus without knowing who he was. Fourth, obeying his command to cast the net for a catch in broad daylight – in the first instance into the deep and over the right side of the boat in the latter. Fifth, the resulting miraculous catch of fish that filled the boat to sinking point. Sixth, the impact of the miraculous catch of fish on the unveiling of the identity of Jesus – in the former by Simon Peter who at the same time confessed his utter unworthiness and in the latter by John who exclaims, "It is the Lord." Lastly, the impetuousness of Peter, who abandons everything and dashes towards Jesus echoes his leaving behind everything to follow him at his initial calling.

Restorative Love

Upon reaching the shore, the disciples were treated to a breakfast by the Risen Lord who also *broke bread and gave thanks* (a symbol of the Eucharist!) while feting them with grilled fish. By eating with them, the risen Lord does not just demonstrate that he is not a ghost (see Lk 24:39-43; CCC 645). Particularly, for Simon Peter, this feasting is a sacramental moment of reconciliation and recommissioning. Through it, the risen Lord meets Peter in his weakness and offers him mercy greater than failure. This is expressed as he asks Peter thrice, "Do you love me?" The threefold question mirrors his threefold denial ((see Mt 26:34,69-75) – not to shame him, but to transform and restore him. In other words, no failure is final, and no sin is greater than the love of God who, as Pope Francis repeatedly reminded us, "never tires forgiving us."

Forgiven and Sent

Peter's threefold confession of love is met with a threefold invitation: "Feed my lambs... Tend my sheep... Feed my sheep." This means that Peter is not merely forgiven – he is entrusted with an important responsibility. In other words, Christ's love does not just overlook our sins; it calls us forward into mission.

Of course, Peter is able to profess his love for Jesus because he has personally experienced Jesus' love for him. This is not a sentimental love or mere feeling. Loving Jesus means "keeping his words" (Jn 14:23). This is what Peter and the apostles strive to do in the first reading (Acts 5:27-32,40-41), through their ministry of preaching and healing despite the opposition and threat from the authorities. That is why they insist, "We must obey God rather than men" while at the same tome "rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonour for the sake of the name [Jesus]." Their love for God, therefore, conquers every doubt and fear just as God's love for them conquers their betrayals and sins, restores their dignity, and recommissions them for his mission.

Over to Us

Today and always, the Risen Lord asks each of us the same question: "Do you love me?" Like Peter and the apostles, answering this question honestly presupposes a personal encounter with God's love — a love that embraces, liberates, heals, forgives, renews, restores and empowers. Such an encounter is rooted in faith and communion and leads to mission. As 1 Jn 4:10,19 says, it is not so much about our love for God as God's love for us. This is the love that conquers all!


OICA ha sido una experiencia muy bonita, llena de paz y de fe. Todo el equipo de OICA se convirtió en una familia para mí.

Amados hijos en El Señor, es una cosa muy buena la lectura de las Sagrada Escritura. Da sabiduría al alma. eleva la mente al cielo, hace al hombre agradecido, nos impulsa a no admirar las realidades de aquí abajo, sino a vivir con el pensamiento puesto allá arriba, a realizar todas nuestras obras con la mirada fija en la recompensa que nos dará el Señor, a dedicarnos al trabajo de la virtud con gran entusiasmo. Gracias a ellas, podemos conocer la providencia de Dios, siempre dispuesta a prestar auxilio; la valentía de los justos, la bondad del Señor, la grandeza de los premios. Nos pueden impulsar a imitar fervorosamente la piedad de hombres y mujeres generosos, para no adormecernos en las batallas espirituales y para confiar en las promesas divinas.

Por esto les pido: **iiileamos con mucha atención las Escrituras Sagradas!!!** Alcanzaremos su verdadera comprensión si nos dedicamos siempre a ellas. No es posible, en efecto, que quien demuestra gran cuidado y deseo de conocer las palabras divinas se quede estancad@. Incluso si no tiene ningún maestro, el Señor mismo entrará en nuestros corazones, iluminará nuestra inteligencia, nos revelará las verdades escondidas; será Él nuestro Maestro en lo que no comprendamos, con tal de que nosotros estemos dispuestos a hacer lo que podamos.

Cuando tomamos en nuestras manos el libro de la vida, hemos de poner en vela nuestro espíritu, recoger nuestros pensamientos, echar fuera cualquier preocupación terrena. Dediquémonos entonces a la lectura con mucha devoción, con gran atención, para que se nos conceda que el Espíritu Santo nos guie a la comprensión de lo que está escrito, sacando así gran utilidad. Aquel hombre eunuco y bárbaro, ministro de la reina de los etíopes, que era un hombre importante, no descuidaba la lectura de la Escritura ni siquiera cuando estaba de viaje. Teniendo en sus manos al profeta Isaías, leía con mucha atención, incluso sin comprender lo que tenía ante sus ojos; pero como ponía de su parte cuanto podía diligencia, entusiasmo y atención— obtuvo un guía (Hech 8, 26 -40).

Ese hombre era eunuco y bárbaro: dos circunstancias suficientes para que hubiese sido negligente. Otros factores eran su dignidad y sus grandes riquezas, y el hecho de viajar en una carroza, pues no es fácil dedicarse a la lectura cuando se viaja así; más aún, resulta costoso. Y, sin embargo, su deseo y su celo superaban cualquier impedimento. Hasta tal punto estaba enfrascado en la lectura, que no decía lo que muchos repiten en el día de hoy: «No entiendo lo que contiene, no logro comprender la profundidad de la Escritura; ¿por qué, pues, voy a sujetarme inútilmente y sin fruto a la fatiga de leer, sin nadie que me guie?». Nada de esto pensaba aquel hombre, bárbaro por la lengua, pero sabio por el pensamiento. Creía que Dios no le despreciaría, sino que le mandarla pronto alguna ayuda de lo alto, con tal de que él hubiese puesto lo que estaba de su parte, dedicándose a la lectura. Por eso, Nuestro Padre Dios, viendo su íntimo deseo, no le descuidó ni le abandonó a sí mismo, sino que le mandó enseguida un maestro.







Several months ago, we received a call on our helpline from a woman concerned about her neighbors – a woman and her two teenage sons. The mother had undergone back surgery months before and became addicted to her pain medication. She became so dependent on the medication that she eventually lost her job in the medical profession. She realized she needed help and checked into the emergency room at the hospital, expecting to be referred to a facility where she could get treatment and counseling on an outpatient basis and still be able to care for her family. Her addiction was so severe that she was whisked away to the detox unit of the state hospital in Big Spring. As part of her treatment, she was unable to contact the "outside world." Thank God her neighbor called us! The boys, aged 18 and 16 at the time, were managing to care for themselves, but all utilities were on the verge of disconnection and rent was due. The older boy had a job but barely made enough to feed the two of them. We paid their electric bill, water and rent. We asked them to call us back if they needed additional help, but we never heard from them again. Approximately two months later we were approached by a woman who identified herself as the mother. She had since beaten her addiction, recovered her job, and she approached us with a check. She felt deeply indebted to us for caring for her children during their time of need, and she wanted to pay us back. With great pride she told us that her oldest son was now attending college, and her younger son was planning on following in his older brother's footsteps. She thanked us for making that possible. We asked her to keep the check and use it for her family, but she insisted on donating the money to help another family in need. Financially, emotionally, and physically, she was in a good place now, and she wanted to do something for someone else in need. What a joy! To be a witness to helping someone rise about adversities and make a new start in life is so fulfilling! Your support made that woman's transformation possible. Thank you very, very much, and God bless you!
