SUNDAY REFLECTION BY FR. BALA

Homily for the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Theme: Living Wisely in Light of Eternity

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, As we gather on this Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Word of God gently yet firmly redirects our gaze from the illusions of permanence in this world to the eternal wisdom of God. Like a master weaver, the liturgy threads together voices from Scripture—Qoheleth, the Psalmist, St. Paul, and our Lord Jesus Himself—into a single, seamless message: *the futility of earthly pursuits without God and the call to seek the treasures that endure forever*:

Let us allow these sacred texts to speak as one, forming a rich tapestry of divine insight that calls each of us to conversion, simplicity, and a renewed focus on the eternal.

1. Ecclesiastes: The Breath That Slips Through Our Fingers

Our journey begins with the mournful refrain of Qoheleth (the preacher or the assembler): "Vanity of vanities! All is vanity!" (Ecclesiastes 1:2). In Hebrew, the word *hebel* evokes the image of a breath, a mist—something that appears briefly and then vanishes. He laments how people labor with wisdom and skill, only to leave their legacy to others who may not value it. Even in rest, anxiety haunts them. Qoheleth isn't cynical. He's realistic. His lament is the cry of every soul who seeks lasting meaning in a world that constantly slips through our fingers. He exposes the illusion of control and permanence. Like vapor, success, wealth, and reputation evaporate. This existential ache echoes through the ages—from the Stoics' call to embrace mortality to St. Augustine's confession: "Our hearts are restless until they rest in You."

So we must ask: What am I chasing that has no weight in eternity? Am I laboring in fear or in faith?

2. Psalm 90: A Heart That Counts Its Days

And just as Ecclesiastes leaves us yearning for meaning, the Psalmist answers with a prayer: "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart" (Psalm 90:12). Human life is fleeting—like grass that flourishes in the morning but withers by evening. Yet in that fragility lies the potential for greatness: if we learn to live with holy awareness.

Here, we shift from resignation to supplication. The psalm doesn't merely mourn mortality—it seeks *mercy* and *meaning*. "Establish the work of our hands, Lord," the Psalmist pleads. In other words, breathe Your eternal Spirit into our temporal efforts. What Qoheleth deconstructs, the Psalm rebuilds with grace. It teaches us that when we align our limited time with God's limitless love, even the smallest act—done in faith—echoes in eternity.

3. Colossians: Seeking What Is Above

Now, St. Paul lifts our eyes heavenward. "If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above" (Colossians 3:1). The earthly self—concerned with greed, impurity, and worldly status—must die. A new self, made in the image of Christ, must rise.

Paul isn't asking us to abandon the world but to *transform* our orientation within it. Baptism is not just a ritual—it is a radical reorientation. We no longer belong to the world that fades. We belong to Christ, who is eternal. Paul names greed as idolatry because it replaces God with false securities. He urges us to strip off the old self—not with shame, but with hope—because Christ, who is our life, already reigns. Think of your daily routine: Are you seeking what is above in how you speak, serve, and spend? Are you allowing Christ to renew your hidden life?

4. Luke: The Rich Fool and the Illusion of Security

Then comes Jesus, the Eternal Word made flesh, sharpening the focus. A man asks Him to settle an inheritance dispute. Jesus refuses, warning instead: "Guard against all greed, for one's life does not consist in possessions" (Luke 12:15).

He tells the parable of the rich fool—a man who builds bigger barns, thinking he can secure his future with wealth, only to hear God say, "You fool! This night your life will be demanded of you." The tragedy is not his wealth but his blindness—his failure to see life as gift, not possession. We see this in our own age: retirement plans without prayer, full schedules without space for God, hearts cluttered with things but empty of peace. Jesus doesn't condemn planning—He condemns presumption.

So, what does it mean to be *rich in what matters to God*? It means being rich in faith, rich in mercy, rich in love. These are the treasures that no thief can steal and no death can erase.

A Seamless Message: Living for What Endures

When we step back, we see how beautifully these readings speak with one voice. Qoheleth exposes the vanity of labor without God. The Psalm teaches us to number our days in trust. Paul calls us to put on the new self, rooted in Christ. And Jesus, the fullness of wisdom, calls us to store up treasures in heaven. This is not a call to poverty of despair but to the poverty of spirit that Christ blesses in the Beatitudes. Detachment is not rejection—it is freedom. Simplicity is not lack—it is clarity. Wisdom is not weariness—it is love rightly ordered.

Living It Out: Practical Wisdom for Pilgrims on Earth

Let us ask ourselves:

- Am I building barns or building bridges?
- Am I clinging to vapor or planting seeds of eternity?
- If God called me home tonight, would I be found rich in what matters?

Today, let us begin again. Let us number our days not with fear but with faith. Let us simplify not to escape the world but to love it more freely. Let us be rich—*rich in compassion, rich in gratitude, rich in Christ.*

And as we approach the altar, may the Eucharist—our Bread of Heaven—nourish in us the wisdom to seek what is above, the grace to strip away the old self, and the strength to labor for what does not perish.

As St. John of the Cross once said, "In the evening of life, we will be judged by love." May our lives be filled with it. Amen.







Probably the majority of the cases we help are those people impacted by medical calamities. The elderly man on Medicare who needs prostate surgery has an income of \$1,100 per month, but his surgeon is requiring a \$2,500 down payment (not covered by Medicare) before he will perform the procedure. On his income he is barely able to afford his rent, utilities and living expenses. Without our help he would be unable to afford the surgery. We are also covering the mortgage for a woman in the final stages of cancer. She is not expected to live much longer so we will cover an additional month (or as many months as is needed) so that she need not be burdened by the knowledge that she may not have a roof over her head. Many, many of the people we help are working people who have had surgeries and are off work for 6-8 weeks. While their jobs are held for them, they are not paid for their time off. We help them with their expenses.

We do have people who lose their jobs for whatever reason, and while they are able to quickly get another one, it still takes 2-4 weeks before they get their first paycheck. Meanwhile rent is due.

In a city of our size, it is surprising to us that there are not more of these situations. It really takes very little to put someone "over the edge" in being able to care for themselves. We consider ourselves fortunate indeed to be able to reach the people that we do each week and are blessed that we can assist them. And as always, we certainly could not do it without your tremendous support that makes the assistance possible. Thank you very much for letting us by your arms in reaching out to the needy of Midland. May God bless all of you!
