SUNDAY REFLECTION BY FR. BALA

Homily – Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wisdom 9:13-18b; Psalm 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14, 17; Philemon 9-10, 12-17; Luke 14:25-33

Theme: Counting the Cost of Discipleship

Introduction: My dear brothers and sisters,

The readings this Sunday invite us into a sobering yet liberating truth: following Christ is not a casual commitment, but a total surrender. The Book of Wisdom reminds us of the limits of our human reasoning. The Psalm teaches us to number our days with wisdom. Paul's Letter to Philemon models Christian love that transforms relationships. And in the Gospel, Jesus challenges us to renounce everything for His sake. These texts converge on one central theme: **discipleship requires discernment, sacrifice, and a heart ordered entirely toward God.**

1. Wisdom: Human Limitations and Divine Guidance

The Book of Wisdom asks: "Who can know God's counsel, or who can conceive what the Lord intends?" (Wis 9:13). Philosophy has long asked the question: What is the good life? Plato and Aristotle offered noble visions of virtue, but Scripture reminds us that without God's Spirit, human wisdom is clouded by weakness and mortality.

The Church Fathers, such as St. Augustine, taught that our hearts are restless until they rest in God. To discern God's will, we need the "holy spirit from on high" (Wis 9:17). This is a call to humility: we cannot grasp divine mysteries on our own—we must pray, discern, and allow God to shape our path.

2. Psalm 90: Time, Mortality, and Eternal Perspective

Psalm 90 is a meditation on time: "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart." The brevity of life—like grass that flourishes in the morning and withers by evening—reminds us that we are pilgrims, not permanent settlers.

Philosophically, this psalm confronts us with the finitude of human existence. Modern culture often distracts us with illusions of permanence: wealth, pleasure, reputation. But wisdom teaches us to see life *sub specie aeternitatis*—under the aspect of eternity. Each day, then, becomes a gift to be lived in God's presence.

3. Philemon: Christian Love Transforms Relationships

In the shortest letter of Paul, we glimpse the radical reordering of human relationships in Christ. Paul appeals to Philemon to receive Onesimus, a runaway slave, not as a piece of property, but as "a brother beloved" (Phlm 16).

Here we see theology lived out. In Christ, hierarchies of power collapse, and dignity is restored. St. John Chrysostom commented that Paul does not command but appeals with love, showing the Christian way of persuasion. The Gospel transforms social structures, not first by external revolution, but by interior conversion and the recognition of every person as a child of God.

This passage challenges us today: Do we see others—especially the marginalized—not as tools for our benefit, but as brothers and sisters in Christ?

4. Gospel: The Radical Demands of Discipleship

Jesus' words in Luke 14 are stark: "If anyone comes to me without hating father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." This is Semitic hyperbole—Jesus does not literally command hatred, but demands that no relationship, no attachment, not even our own life, take precedence over Him.

Two parables illustrate this: building a tower and waging war. Both require **counting the cost** before committing. Following Christ is not sentimental enthusiasm; it is a reasoned, free, and total decision.

The theology here is rooted in the primacy of God. St. Thomas Aquinas taught that God must be loved above all things, because He is the highest good. All other loves find their meaning when ordered toward Him. To renounce possessions, honors, even attachments, is to live in freedom, so that nothing holds us back from total union with Christ.

5. Application: Living the Call Today

- **Wisdom for daily life**: Seek God's Spirit before decisions—whether in family, work, or ministry. Human plans are fragile; divine guidance is sure.
- Numbering our days: Live each day intentionally. Ask: If today were my last, how would I live differently?
- **Transforming relationships**: See in others—especially those society disregards—Christ Himself. Treat them with dignity and love.

Counting the cost: What attachments prevent me from following Christ fully? Comfort, security, approval, possessions? Jesus calls us to freedom through detachment.

Conclusion: True Freedom in Christ

The readings remind us that discipleship is costly, but the cost is worth everything. To place Christ above all is not to lose, but to gain eternal life. As Psalm 90 concludes: "Prosper the work of our hands for us, O Lord." Our lives, ordered toward God, become fruitful, meaningful, and eternal.

Let us pray for the grace to surrender all that hinders us, so that with wisdom, courage, and love, we may walk as true disciples of Jesus Christ. **Amen.**







Each week we publish a list of what was spent on helping families the week before. That appears on our Facebook page as well as in the St. Stephen's church bulletin. Anyone wanting to know anything more regarding our finances is welcome to contact us. Our books are always open to public scrutiny. We do not "stockpile" money. Every penny that comes into Helping Hands goes right back out to help the needy of Midland County. Our office equipment (desks computers, etc.) have come to us as donations off of our truck, from individual donors, or volunteers who use their own equipment that they have purchased. Most of our equipment is old and worn however we would have it no other way. Granted we have four wonderful, fairly new Ford box trucks however they were all donated to us by wonderful benefactors of ours, Don and Lenee Bennett. They were sorely needed however we felt we could not use the money you gave us for such a luxury. Thankfully Don ad Lenee came to our rescue and our transportation issues were resolved. Our building is not pretty, and it tends to be too warm in the summer and too cool in the winter. To spend money frivolously to have the latest and the best is not in line with our philosophy and our way of doing business. We believe in working poor to help the poor.

The more money that is given to us means that we will have just that much more to help our neighbors in need. We are proud to have been able to sustain a budget that allows us to care for those we feel most need the help for the past several years, which is remarkable considering that so many other agencies are cutting back or disconnecting services to the poor altogether. Most agencies have "caps" on how much they can spend to assist someone. Some do not help with rent, and some will only do utilities such as electric but again, there is usually a cap placed on them as well. To the best of our knowledge, we are the only benevolence agency in Midland that can assist in with the total expense of a client coming to us with a legitimate need.

So many organizations and churches in Midland help us meet those needs: St. Stephen's Catholic Church, St. Ann's, Holy Cross Lutheran, the Abell-Hanger Foundation, Chevron and many more. Equally important and needed is the steady stream of checks we receive from all over our city that come in our mail each day. We believe we receive these generous donations because you believe in us and in the work that we do, and you will always know that every penny you give us will go directly to those in need. We cannot thank you enough for all that you do for the poor through Helping Hands. God bless you for your generosity and for your compassion!
