SUNDAY REFLECTION BY FR. BONAVENTURE O. ANUFORO

Second Sunday of Advent Year A

First reading Isaiah 11:1-10

Psalm 72: 1-2,7-8,12-13, 17.

Second reading: Romans 15:4-9

Matthew 3:1-12

Theme: Hope in the Wilderness of Jesus Christ: A call for peace, justice, and repentance

Dearest sisters and brothers in Christ. We have gathered today on the second Sunday of Advent, a time of both anticipation and profound reflection. The Church calls us not only to reflect on the past coming of Christ at Christmas but also to prepare for his coming in glory, and to recognize his presence in our lives right now. In the first reading of today (Isaiah 11:1-10), Isaiah presents us with a magnificent vision of the Messiah, a figure of profound hope. He is described not as a powerful warrior but as a humble shoot, a "Flower of Jesse". "But a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom. The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him..." This imagery is crucial. A stump is what's left after a tree has been cut down—a symbol of defeat, despair, or desolation. Yet, from this deadness, God causes new life to spring. For the Israelites, this meant hope after exile and political ruin. For us, it means that even from the stumps of our own lives; our failures, our dry spiritual seasons, our broken relationships—God can bring forth his son, the one on whom the Spirit rests.

The characteristics of this Messiah are beautiful: He will judge the poor with justice and decide fairly for the meek of the earth. His reign brings the image of true peace: the wolf living with the lamb, the leopard lying down with the kid. It is a peace founded on right relationships, a restoration of God's original order.

While Isaiah paints the picture of the Messiah who is coming, John the Baptist, in our Gospel reading (Matthew 3:1-12), tells us how to prepare for Him. John is a man of the wilderness, a jarring, uncompromising voice crying out; "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!"

John is the one who prepares the way, fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy. His message is simple, yet revolutionary. Repentance is not just a feeling of sorrow; it is an action. It is a change of mind and heart that leads to a change in life. John's message to the Pharisees and Sadducees who came to him is a stark warning: "Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance."

Advent is our time to ask: What fruit am I producing? (Galatians 5: 16-26). Is it the fruit of selfishness, unforgiveness, or anxiety? Or is it the fruit of love, kindness, patience, and generosity? The justice and peace that Isaiah promises will only take root in a heart that has been cleared and prepared by genuine repentance. John tells us that the preparation is a personal responsibility. We must smooth out the rough spots and straighten the winding paths of our own hearts so Christ can dwell there.

St. Paul in the second reading (Romans 15:4-9) expands more on the theme of this Sunday, showing us how to live this Advent hope, with mutual acceptance and unity: "May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to think in harmony with one another, in keeping with Christ Jesus, that with one accord you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ." Paul tells us that the Scriptures are written "for our instruction, that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope." Our hope is not passive wishful thinking; it is a confident certainty rooted in the revealed promises of God.

And what does this hope move us to do? To "welcome one another, as Christ welcomed you, for the glory of God."

The peace and justice of the Kingdom are first established among us (Luke 17:21). If we cannot welcome the person next to us in the pew, or the challenging person in our family, or the one with different views, how can we truly welcome Christ when he comes? (Matthew 25:34-45). Our ability to live in harmony and unity is the clearest sign that we have genuinely prepared the way of the Lord.

Dearest friends, let us, then, take these readings to heart. Find hope in the dry stumps of your life and trust that God brings life from death, for the dry bones shall rise again (Ezekiel 37:1-14).

Heed the call of John by identifying the areas where you need to repent, to change your mind and actions, and produce good fruit. Welcome one another in harmony and unity, for the advent of Christ is about bringing all people together in peace.

The Psalmist in Psalm 72 encourages us to pray for the Advent of the Messiah in our lives, society, and minds: "He shall rescue the poor when they cry out, and the afflicted when they have no one to help." Christ's justice is always on the side of the vulnerable. Let our Advent preparations include acts of justice and mercy toward the poor and afflicted, making our lives a true reflection of the Christ we await.

May the God of hope fill us with all joy and peace in believing, so that we may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Have a spirit-filled Advent!!!



Jesús admira a Juan y hace de él el mayor elogio: “De entre los nacidos de mujer, nadie es mejor que Juan”. Pero añade este comentario: “Aunque el más pequeño en el reino es mayor que él” (Lc. 7,28). Jesús admira a Juan, se ha dejado bautizar por él, y como él, ha llamado a todos a la conversión. Cuando Herodes mata a Juan, Jesús se retira. Tanto le ha impresionado su muerte que necesita tiempo para el duelo. Pero Jesús no Sigue El Camino de Juan.

Juan vive solo en el desierto y Jesús vive en comunidad con sus discípulos, y mezclado con la gente.

Juan lleva una vida ascética, muy austera. Y Jesús “come, bebe, asiste a bodas y pasa “como uno más, como uno cualquiera”. Su mística es el amor. Un amor ardiente y apasionado por el Padre y un amor concreto con los hombres, sus hermanos.

Juan es duro en su mensaje, mete miedo a la gente y le amenaza si no se convierten. Jesús habla de amor, de perdón, de misericordia. Esto hace que Juan, estando en la cárcel, tenga dudas y mande unos enviados a que les diga si es el Mesías o tienen que esperar a otro (Mt. 11,3). Jesús le dice que es dichoso “aquel que no se escandaliza de Él” (Mt. 11,6). Jesús supera la ira y la venganza propias del A.T. Y pasa por la vida con un amor escandaloso. Los profetas son hombres geniales. Son poetas, artistas, soñadores. Llevan mensajes de protesta cuando el pueblo se desvía y llevan también mensajes de esperanza cuando este pueblo está hundido.

En la primera lectura, Isaías sueña con un mundo al revés, pero un mundo maravilloso: “habitará el lobo con el cordero; el leopardo se tumbará con el cabrito y el ternero y el león pacerán juntos”. Ha puesto juntos a un animal salvaje y a otro pacífico. Lo normal es que el salvaje se coma al pacífico. Pero, en la visión del profeta, en los tiempos del Mesías, el animal pacífico no sólo podrá habitar con el salvaje, sino que llegará a domesticarlo. Esos instintos bestiales, salvajes, que todos llevamos dentro quedarán vencidos por unos nuevos instintos de cercanía, bondad, fraternidad. Tiempos en que un “niño puede meter la mano en la boca de la serpiente y no le hará daño”. El niño, al no tener pasado ni prejuicios, cree que todo el mundo es bueno, que todos son su familia. Para él la vida es un juego. Los mayores no metemos la mano en la boca de nadie porque nos puede morder. Ese mundo ideal en el que nadie haga mal a nadie, es más, en el que todos vivamos como humanos es el que ha venido a traernos Jesús. Él nos habla de un Dios Padre que es bueno para todos:” Hace salir el sol sobre buenos y malos y manda la lluvia sobre juntos y pecadores” (Mt.5,45). Murió pidiendo perdón por sus mismos asesinos.




