Why Jesus Was Born — The Hunger of the Human Heart

Jesus was born not because the world was peaceful or prepared, but because the world was wounded and hungry. Christmas is God's response to the deepest ache of the human heart an ache we try to silence with distractions, possessions, achievements, and pleasures, yet which only grows louder in the quiet.

But God did not answer this hunger from a distance. **He chose to come through a woman.** Before Christ was laid in a manger, He was first received in the heart and womb of Mary. The hunger of humanity met the obedience of one woman who said, *"Let it be done to me according to your word."* In Mary, God found a heart empty enough to be filled, humble enough to receive, and faithful enough to offer the Savior to the world.

Psychologically, humanity lives under fear: fear of being unloved, fear of abandonment, fear of failure, fear of death. Beneath our confidence lies anxiety; beneath our success, insecurity. God did not respond to this fear with ideas or commands. He responded with **presence**. He became a Child; small, vulnerable, and reachable, so that no one would ever feel too insignificant to be seen or too broken to be held.

And this presence came wrapped in a mother's arms. **Mary's embrace is the first place where divine love becomes humanly touchable.** In the face of the Infant Jesus, held by His Mother, our fear of abandonment is healed: God is with us and He comes to us through maternal tenderness.

Spiritually, Jesus was born because humanity had lost its way. Sin fractured our communion with God, with one another, and within ourselves. We knew what was right but lacked the strength to live it. So God did not wait for us to rise to Him; He descended to us. In Jesus, eternity entered time, heaven touched earth, and mercy took on flesh.

Mary stands at this moment as **the new Eve**, where the first Eve's disobedience closed the door, Mary's obedience opened it again. Through her *yes*, the path back to the Father is reopened. Christmas is not only the birth of Christ, it is the beginning of restoration through a woman who trusted God completely.

And He was laid in a manger, not a cradle, but a feeding trough, the place where animals come to eat. This was no accident. From the very first night, God was revealing His plan. Before Jesus would ever say, *"I am the Bread of Life,"* He was placed where food is given.

But notice this: **the Bread of Heaven first came to us through Mary.** She carried Him, nourished Him, protected Him, and then laid Him down for the world. Mary is the first tabernacle. The manger is the first altar. The Child is already a gift meant to be received.

Bethlehem means *"House of Bread,"* and the Bread of Heaven was born there but Mary is the living house that carried the Bread before Bethlehem ever did.

Emotionally, Jesus was born to heal wounded hearts. He entered poverty, vulnerability, rejection, exile, misunderstanding, and suffering. And Mary walked every step of this pain with Him from Bethlehem to Egypt, from Nazareth to Calvary. She shows us that God does not eliminate suffering immediately; He **enters it with us**.

That is why Christmas assures us that God is not distant from our pain. He is Emmanuel; God with us **and Mary is the first witness that God stays**, even when the road is dark and unclear.

But He came not only to be with us He came to feed us. The human heart suffers from a hunger no human love can fully satisfy. Many live on crumbs: conditional love, shallow affection, temporary comforts. In the manger, God says, *"Come and eat."*

Mary does not keep the Child for herself. She presents Him. She shows Him. She gives Him. Just as at Cana she will later say, *"Do whatever He tells you,"* at Christmas she silently says, *"Here He is."* Jesus was born to nourish what is empty within us, to strengthen what is weak, to restore what is broken.

The manger already points to the altar. The wood of the feeding trough whispers of the wood of the Cross. The Child laid down in Bethlehem is the same Jesus who will one day take bread and say, *"This is my Body."* Mary, who gave Him flesh, will one day stand at the Cross and offer Him again this time for the salvation of the world.

In the Eucharist, the mystery of Christmas continues. The God who once came hidden in flesh still comes hidden in bread. Love makes itself consumable so that we may live. And just as Mary once gave Him to the world, the Church like Mary continues to present Christ to hungry hearts.

Jesus was born to reveal a love that does not dominate or force but invites. A love that chooses us even in our sin. A love that becomes food. From the manger to the Cross, from the Cross to the altar, God repeats the same message:

"You are worth coming for."

This is why Jesus was born: To replace fear with trust. To restore communion with the Father. To heal wounded hearts. To feed the starving soul.

And this is why Mary matters: She teaches us how to receive Him, how to trust Him, and how to give Him to others. Christmas is not merely a memory it is an invitation. An invitation to bring our hunger, our wounds, our fears, and our emptiness to the manger and to the altar. Mary stands beside us, pointing not to herself, but to her Son.

The Child born for us is the Bread of Life, and He is still saying to each heart: **"Come to me... and take and eat."**

May this Christmas be more than a celebration. May it be an encounter with the God who chose to be born for you, with a Mother who received Him for you, and with a Savior who becomes your nourishment forever.



«**Dios con nosotros**»

Tu nacimiento, Cristo nuestro Dios, ha mostrado al mundo la luz de la sabiduría. Porque los que adoraban las estrellas fueron enseñados en tu Navidad por una estrella a adorarte, ¡Oh sol de Justicia! Y a saber que tu viniste del Oriente de las alturas, ¡Oh, Señor, ¡Gloria a ti!

El nombre, para aquella mentalidad judía, expresa el ser, su destino y su misión. Es como el A.D.N. más profundo. Los nombres que el Ángel da al Mesías no pueden ser más significativos: EMMANUEL Y JESUS. Emmanuel significa "Dios con nosotros". Y Jesús "Dios salva. Dios es para mí "presencia y salvación". No se trata de una presencia meramente externa, sino íntima, profunda. Él es mi mejor yo. La salvación significa "solución". No da soluciones baratas y pasajeras. Da solución auténtica y definitiva al problema de la vida y de la muerte.

Dios con nosotros. Desde el momento que Dios se ha hecho "hombre" Dios ha dejado definitivamente de ser sólo "Dios en sí" para ser también "Dios-con-nosotros". El evangelio de Mateo que comienza hablándonos del EMMANUEL, termina con estas consoladoras palabras: **"Yo estoy con vosotros todos los días hasta el fin de los tiempos"**. Desde este momento ya nadie podrá decir que está solo. Éste es el gran misterio de la Encarnación. Un misterio que debemos "contemplar" en Navidad, en cualquier rincón del mundo donde se represente un belén. Pasemos de prisa la mirada sobre tantas luces, ríos, montañas, animales, figuras, personajes, -aunque sean reyes-, y concentremos nuestra mirada en ese Dios Inmenso que se hace pequeño y vulnerable en la fragilidad de un niño que llora. Caigamos de rodillas "estremecidos" ante ese enorme misterio. Es lo que hicieron los Magos: "Y cayendo de rodillas, le adoraron" (Mt. 2,11).

Dios salva. ¿De qué nos salva? Nos salva de la oscuridad. Nos salva de nuestras dudas, de nuestros miedos, de nuestras angustias, de nuestra perplejidad. Así sucedió con José, "el hombre justo". El Ángel del Señor le cierra una puerta a un mundo de oscuridad y zozobra y le abre otra a un mundo de luz y de paz. Nos salva de lo peor que hay en nosotros: nuestro egoísmo, nuestra violencia, nuestra mirada miope y materialista.

Nos salva de la esclavitud. Decía Jesús: "El que hace el pecado se hace esclavo del pecado". (Jn.8,34). Nuestro pecado son las tendencias, los apetitos, la concupiscencia que nos impulsa a apetecer lo que no nos conviene, y nos hace daño. Preferimos un placer inmediato y pasajero a una felicidad plena y duradera. Ser libres es quedar fascinados por Dios, vivir enamorados de Dios y de su Reino hasta el punto de perder el gusto y el atractivo por las cosas del mundo que nos esclavizan. ¿Cómo puede ser esto? **"Dame un corazón que ame y entenderá lo que digo"**. (S. Agustín)

Nos salva del falso concepto de Dios. Hay todavía cristianos que no comprenden a un Dios enamorado de la vida, un Dios que sufre más que nosotros cuando nosotros lloramos y goza más que nosotros cuando nosotros reímos. Un Dios que, si pudiera dormir, despertaría sin cosas, pero no sin sueños. **Nosotros somos el sueño de Dios.** "Su delicia es estar con los hijos de los hombres" (Proverbios 8,3)




