

# OUR LADY OF FATIMA ROSARY CONGRESS OCTOBER 7-13, 2017

To commemorate the 100th anniversary of the appearances of the Blessed Mother at Fatima, Portugal, a traveling "Rosary Congress" is being held from Saturday, Oct. 7 to Friday, Oct. 13, 2017.

A Rosary Congress is seven days of around-the-clock eucharistic adoration and hourly praying of the rosary in response to Our Lady of Fatima's call to conversion, consecration and prayer. During a traveling Rosary Congress, each 24-hour period is hosted at a different site.

The Little Sisters of the Poor (1365 Enfield Street) is hosting the initial day of this graced time in the life of the Church and in our archdiocese.

From Saturday, Oct. 7 at 6 pm through Sunday, Oct. 8 at 5 pm, in the chapel at St. Joseph's Residence, there will be extended adoration of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Every hour, a rosary and



Divine Mercy chaplet will be prayed.

A closing Mass will be offered at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford on Friday, Oct. 13 at 7 pm.

Please consider participating in this special event as we pray in reparation for our Church and Holy Father, our archdiocese, our world, our country and our community.

## FIVE FIRST SATURDAYS

**In a private revelation to the Fatima visionary Sister Lucia, the Blessed Mother offered us all a "formation program" to be faithful to her Son Jesus.**

**The Blessed Mother asked that the four following pious acts be performed on five consecutive First Saturdays to help us grow spiritually.**

**First: Go to confession.**

**Second: Receive Communion.**

**Third: Recite five decades of the rosary.**

**Fourth: Keep our Blessed Mother company for 15 minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary.**

**Jesus said that in the end times evil will increase so much that the love of most will grow cold (Matthew 24:12). To prevent this coldness from entering our hearts, Our Lady is giving us this simple way to increase our faith.**

**The next five First Saturdays are: Nov. 4, Dec. 2, Jan. 6, Feb. 3 and March 3.**



## Welcome

There was a popular high-stakes TV game show a few years back in which the host would ask the contestant after every question, "Is that your final answer?" The game-show host's purpose, it seemed, was to sow doubt in the contestant's mind about his or her answer.

Jesus offers us a short parable in today's Gospel (Matthew 21:28-32). It's about a man who tells his two sons to go work in the vineyard. The first son says he won't go, but later regrets it and works. The second son says he will go but does not. In each case, it's the final answer that is most important.

This parable is a lesson about obedience to the will of the Father. It is our final decision for or against God that will decide our eternal reward or eternal punishment. As people given free will by our Creator, it is we who choose our eternal destiny.

In our Second Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians (2:1-11), we are shown how Jesus was obedient to his Father. Jesus gave himself completely, for us and to us. Though he is the Second Person of the Trinity, Jesus took on the form of a man, then the form of a criminal and then the form of bread in the Eucharist. He did all this in order to free us from sin.

Growing always in sacramental grace we are given the help we need to make the best decision the first time, but if we don't...then to make our final decision be for God and his kingdom.



## STATE'S BISHOPS BACK 'DREAMERS'

The bishops of Connecticut have spoken out in defense of the so-called "Dreamers," undocumented young people brought to the United States as children by their parents. The Trump administration has asked for a review of the DACA program (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) that has allowed these undocumented young adults to remain in the United States.

In a joint statement, the bishops write: "The DACA program assists many undocumented young people ... approximately 8,000 in Connecticut—to follow their dreams in creating a life for themselves in a country that they have called home since their childhood. ... The resulting deportations would not be consistent with our history as a nation largely of immigrants nor would it reflect the biblical injunction of the Book of Leviticus that 'when an alien resides with you in your land, do not mistreat such a one' (Lev 19:33).

"We ask our Catholic brothers and sisters to pray and reflect deeply on this issue and to remember that Christ taught that our 'neighbor' is anyone that needs us."

My husband and I have just moved back to the area from Atlanta, where I was working as a Catholic school teacher and track coach. I practice a liberal-arts teach-



## A MESSAGE FROM THE U.S. CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS

This past month has presented us with a seemingly unprecedented number of natural disasters. The toll on human life, property, livelihoods and faith communities is immense and the full extent will not be known for some time.

You, the Catholic faithful, have been generous with your prayers, outreach and financial donations. Without much time to take a breath, Hurricane Maria swept through much of the same geography as Irma, and our brothers and sisters in central Mexico were hit with a 7.1 magnitude earthquake not even three weeks after an 8.1 magnitude earthquake hit southern Mexico. The Church in the

Caribbean, especially Puerto Rico and Cuba, and Mexico have suffered significant devastation. Recovery and rebuilding for the Church and the broader community will be long and difficult in all affected regions.

The USCCB Office of National Collections has set up funds for both Hurricane Maria relief and Mexico earthquake relief. Any contributions individuals or parishes wish to make to these two funds will be distributed accordingly. Donations can be made to either Catholic Charities USA or Catholic Relief Services.
