

LIVING AS MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

Sad to say, but most Catholics (many priests and bishops included) are just too scared to evangelize. “What, me? Talk about my faith and beliefs to someone?” And the current culture within the Church actually works against each of us being evangelists. For better or worse, we have a built-in system of classes, adult-faith formation, RCIA, etc. But all that, which is well and good, means evangelization becomes someone else’s responsibility and not each of ours.

Furthermore, we know that “cultural Catholicism” is one of comfort and ease. We aren’t really challenged to become evangelists; instead, we’re satisfied if people come to Mass and get their kids “sacramentalized” (note: This is distinctly different from being “catechized”). Big parking lots mean easy-in, easy-out, just like a shopping center. This kind of easy and comfortable Catholic culture is counter to the universal call given to us by Jesus himself to share the Good News of the Gospel with others.

There is a lack of real community, accountability, and deep Christian friendship so many of our parishes,

so we don’t have anyone challenging us.

We have settled for a middle-of-the-road, ho-hum kind of Christianity, which doesn’t shake us up, challenge us, or push us to grow. Show up, get your Mass card punched once a week and all’s good. Well, is it? Obviously not.

Each Christian and every community must discern the path that the Lord points out, but all of us are asked to obey the Lord’s call to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach all the “peripheries” in need of the light of the Gospel, says Pope Francis.

God is always greater than our greatest fear. It does us good to listen to him when he says time and again in Scripture, “Do not be afraid!” May we entrust our efforts at missionary discipleship to St. Joseph, patron of our archdiocese and of the universal Church. What we can learn from St. Joseph can be summarized like this: Accept our mission from God, let ourselves be led by God and embrace any hardship we might encounter in order to serve Jesus Christ and live as missionary disciples.



Welcome

Jesus wasn’t a talk radio pundit, a TV talking head or a political commentator. He was — and is — the Son of God and the Savior of all mankind. That does not mean that what Jesus taught has no bearing on our lives outside of Church. In fact, just the opposite. We are called to live as Catholic Christians 24-7-365.

Most of us are familiar with today’s Gospel (Mt 22:15-21) and Jesus’ instruction to us to give to Caesar what belongs to him and to God what belongs to Him.

What we should, or should not, render unto Caesar or, in our case, the government, shapes much of our daily discourse as citizens. We are constantly being challenged to defend our beliefs as faithful citizens in the public square. That is what the religious freedom debate is all about.

Roman coins all featured an image of Julius Caesar on them. Jesus looked at Caesar’s image and concluded that the coin belonged to Caesar. In creating us, God said in Genesis, “Let us make man in our image, after our likeness” (Gen 1:26). Thus, we are “owed” to God.

If we claim to be disciples, then what does this mean in the way we speak and act? What do all of us really render to God in our personal lives?

As our Psalm response says: “Give to the Lord the glory due his name.”

Nothing more...nothing less.





World Mission Sunday,
Oct. 22

Jesus was a missionary. As the Word of God, he is the light of all nations. As the Word made flesh, he brought God's own life into our midst. Before returning to the Father, he sent the Church to continue the mission given him by the Father and empowered her with his Spirit: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (Jn 20:21).

This weekend the Church universal observes World Mission Sunday, an effort to show our support for and solidarity with the men and women serving as apostolic missionaries throughout the world.

World Mission Sunday invites us to reflect anew on the mission at the heart of the Christian faith. The Church is missionary by nature; otherwise, she would no longer be the Church of Christ, but one group among many others that soon end up serving their purpose and passing away. So it is important to ask ourselves certain questions about our Christian identity and our responsibility as believers in a world marked by confusion, disappointment and frustration, and torn by wars and violence that unjustly target the innocent. What is the basis of our mission? What is the heart of our mission? What are the essential approaches we need to take in carrying out our mission?

On this day, we are called — as baptized Catholics — to celebrate and support local churches in Asia and Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe, an area that covers more than half the territory of the globe. Your generosity for the second collection and prayers are appreciated.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Sts. Simon and Jude

Feast Day: Oct. 28

This coming Saturday the Church celebrates the feast of Sts. Simon and Jude, two of the Apostles. Their sanctity is celebrated on the same day possibly because they both preached the Gospel in Mesopotamia and Persia where it is said they had both been sent. In actual fact, we know nothing for certain about them beyond what is told us of their being called as Apostles in the New Testament. St. Jude is the author of a short epistle which forms part of the New Testament.

St. Simon is often represented in art with a saw, the instrument of his martyrdom. St. Jude is often shown holding an architect's square to associate him with being a builder of God's house. St. Paul called himself by this name; and St. Jude, by his epistle, has also a spe-

cial right to be reckoned among our Lord's principal workmen.

But St. Jude had another nobility, far surpassing all earthly titles: He was the nephew, by his father Cleophas or Alpheus, to St. Joseph, and legal cousin to Jesus. Jude was one of those called by their compatriots the "brethren" of the carpenter's Son.

St. Jude is most known for being the patron saint of those in desperate or trying situations. He was given this intercessory role to distinguish him from Judas, Jesus' betrayer, who in his own desperate situation chose to rely on himself rather than turn to God. Jude's epistle also stresses that the faithful should persevere in the environment of harsh, difficult circumstances.




St. Bernard Catholic School News


