







FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT



WELCOME

"Now there were some Greeks among those who had come to worship at the feast. They came to Philip and asked him, 'Sir, we would like to see Jesus.'" It has begun. News of Jesus has spread beyond native-born, Aramaic-speaking Jews. We don't know if the Greeks mentioned here heard of Jesus from fellow travelers or if news of this intriguing rabbi had reached all the way to their home. What we do know is that this interaction spurred an interesting comment from Jesus: "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." In other words, it has begun. The time has come for the message to move beyond the geographic bounds of Israel.

But what does this message require? The Gospel is clear: "he said this indicating the kind of death he would die." A grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies to its life as only a seed. A caterpillar takes on the appearance of temporary death in order to transform into a butterfly. In the Gospels, sacrifice and death are a way of becoming something more than you were before. This Lent, new life can come from our sacrifices. When we enter into the season with Jesus, our difficulties can transform our perspective. "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit."

As we abstain from meat and fast from eating between meals, we can grow in compassion for the hungry. We can give alms of our time, sacrificially spending time with the lonely, the sick, and the marginalized. Our little Lenten "deaths" -- death to unnecessary preferences, death to selfish living, death to ignorance of other's pain -- can bring new life to the world long after the season is over. This is the invitation this Sunday and every Lenten season, to begin anew from death to life.

FROM FR. GOLAS:

The Executive Committee (EC) and the Merger Transition Committee (MTC) are meeting and working on developing the plan for the merger of the two Churches into St. Jeanne Jugan Parish. You have seen the various ways the Parish functions both jointly and separately. The MTC is in the process of interviewing the various ministries and committees of the parish as well as contacting the parishioners involved in various activities or events. In addition, they are contacting staff and taking inventory of Church properties and equipment. It is an enormous task. They are making a concerted effort to have reports ready by June 1st. The EC is providing the leadership to the Transitional Finance Committee as well as studying the overall operation of the Parish and the Churches. Once the reports are completed from the MTC, the EC will study them with a goal to develop a strategic pastoral plan for the Parish for the next 3 to 5 years. This plan will be part of a workshop that will be conducted by the pastoral planning office of the archdiocese in the future to offer further analysis and guidance as well to establish the objectives and goals needed to implement this plan. This is a process that takes time. In the meantime, I will communicate any developments concerning this process in a timely manner in the bulletin. If you have any questions, please contact me. I am grateful for all the cooperation that is taking place as part of the process. Please keep our Parish in your prayers.

A MESSAGE FROM FR. GOLAS:

There will be one celebration of the Sacred Triduum in the Parish. It is not possible to have two celebrations: one in each Church. The directives do allow for the celebration to alternate between different locations.

The Sacred Triduum this year for St. Jeanne Jugan parish will be as follows:

Holy Thursday - March 29th at 7 pm at St. Bernard Church

Good Friday - March 30th at 3 pm at Holy Family Church
Tenebrae at 7 pm at St. Bernard Church

Holy Saturday - March 31st at 8 pm at Holy Family Church

Easter Sunday - April 1st - regular Sunday Mass schedule at both Churches

As Holy Week approaches a more complete schedule with Confessions will be published.

FREE LACROSSE CLINIC OFFERED AT ST. BERNARD SCHOOL

A free youth lacrosse clinic, open to the public, will be held at St. Bernard's School, 232 Pearl St. in Enfield. The program, available to boys and girls from kindergarten to grade 8, will be held on Saturday, March 24th. The only equipment necessary will be a stick. Tennis balls will be used for the day's activities.

The clinic will be conducted by JT Galloway, the lacrosse coach at Enfield High School. Coach Galloway is interested in beginning a youth lacrosse program in the Town of Enfield, and says that it depends on the number of people interested, and their level of commitment. This introductory clinic will emphasize learning stick skills, some basic drills, and team-building exercises. Children will then have the opportunity to continue playing for the new Enfield Youth Lacrosse program, if interested.

The girl's clinic will run from 11:00 am - 12:30 pm and the boy's clinic will run from 12:30 pm - 2:00 pm. Play will be held in the gym at St. Bernard's School, or outside on the fields, depending on the weather. Bring footwear for either possibility. Arrive about 15 minutes early to sign the required permission slip or visit the school's website at sbsenfield.org to download the permission slip.



10 FUN FACTS ABOUT ST. PATRICK

1. St. Patrick wasn't Irish! He was born in 385 AD. His parents were Roman citizens living in modern day England.
2. March 17th is when St. Patrick died in 461 AD.
3. St. Patrick was a slave! When he was 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders, and spent several years herding sheep. He managed to escape at age 22, and made his way to a monastery in England.
4. St. Patrick used the shamrock to teach about the Holy Trinity.
5. There were probably never snakes in Ireland, since the climate is too cool. Some scholars think the term "snakes" referred to pagan religious beliefs and practices that St. Patrick "drove out."
6. Blue is actually the original color associated with St. Patrick, not green.
7. The harp, not a shamrock, is the symbol of Ireland since medieval times.
8. There are more Irish in the USA than in Ireland! Approximately 34 million Americans have Irish ancestry, while there are only about 4.2 million people living in Ireland.
9. St. Patrick's Day in the US has a strong political history. To combat fierce discrimination when they first arrived in the U.S., the Irish organized themselves to demonstrate their collective political and social might.
10. St. Patrick's Day was a dry holiday in Ireland until 1970. It was a religious observance, and that meant no beer!



CEMETERY SPRING CLEAN-UP


Due to the fact that Easter is early this year, we will be having the Spring Clean-up for the St. Adalbert and St. Patrick Cemeteries in 2 increments.
