



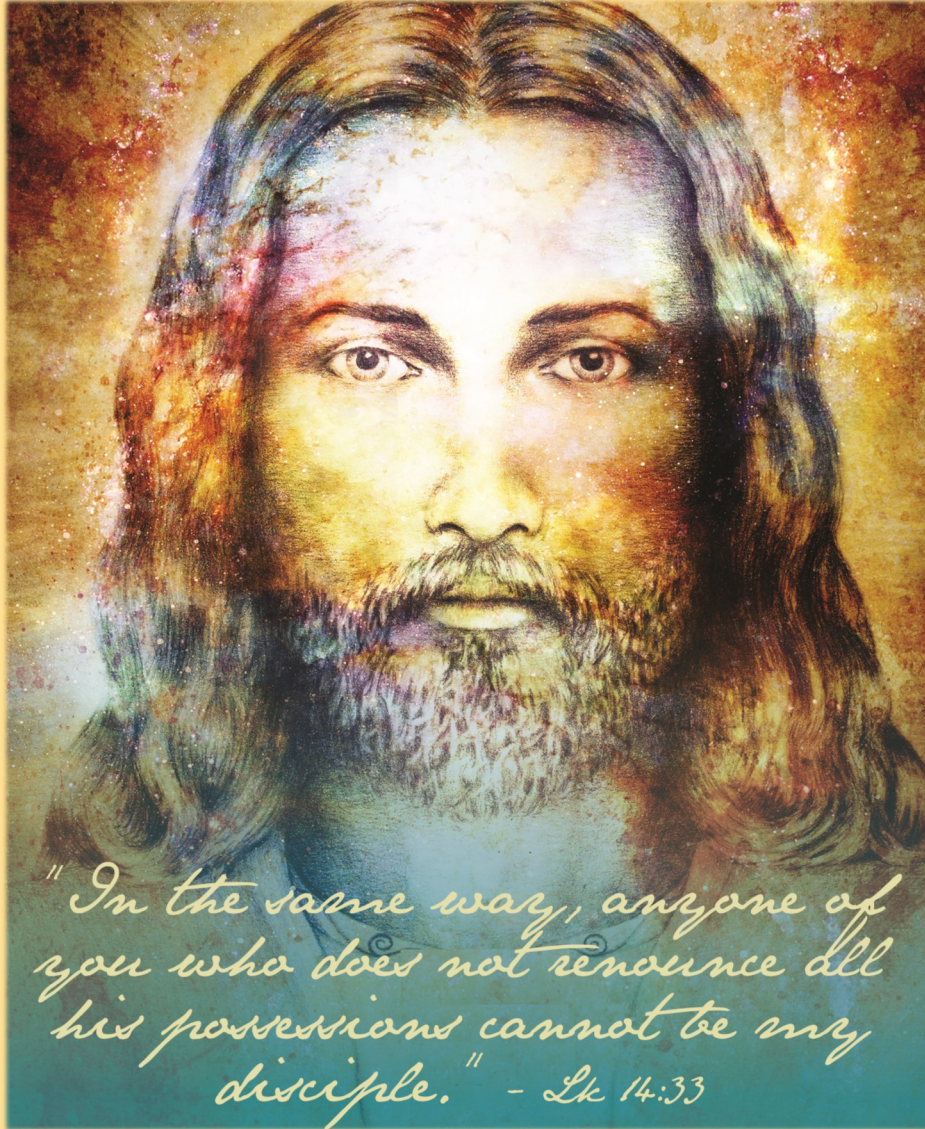

# DISCIPLESHIP IS A PROCESS

## REFLECT

It's said that upon reading the Gospels, Gandhi commented that he very much liked Jesus Christ. It was Christ's followers he found troublesome. One wonders who Gandhi had met and if these Christians had truly counted the cost of their faith. Following Jesus, really following Jesus, is much more challenging than we may think. He emphasizes this with strong language in this Sunday's Gospel. He compares discipleship to the carrying of one's own execution device - "his own cross" - and for the need even to "hate" what could disrupt one's commitment. Some of this is standard hyperbole, exaggeration for effect common to the time period. Some of this should make us wonder how deep our discipleship goes.

"Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost?" Jesus imagines this construction project gone wrong. Someone may lay the foundation but not have enough resources to finish. We've received the firm foundation of the sacraments - our baptism, for one, along with weekly Mass attendance and regular confession. Yet how often do we find ourselves too distracted, exhausted, or uninterested to truly build our lives on our faith? We have all met such Christians. Some days, we may be those Christians ourselves. We become the incomplete tower that confuses and baffles the onlookers. "This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish!"

For some of us, our cross may feel heavier than we expected upon the first lift. Building a tower means laying stone upon stone. It's a process. We don't arrive at completion overnight. Grace is always sufficient to provide the resources, but we need to keep saying yes to the task. This week, consider your own discipleship. What is one area where you've become distracted or discouraged? How can that improve this week? Let God lay another brick on the tower.

**HELP OUR PARISH ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS**  
**SEPTEMBER 21ST AND 22ND**

The HOPES (Help Our Parish Elementary Schools) Collection is held every September and will be held on **September 21st and 22nd** of this year. The HOPES Collection proceeds benefit Catholic elementary schools in the Archdiocese of Hartford by funding HOPES Grants, which are then awarded directly to schools. Each elementary school in the Archdiocese of Hartford may apply for a HOPES Grant worth up to \$7,500. HOPES Grants fund school initiatives in technology, security, marketing, and advancement. Last year, the HOPES Grant committee approved \$146,000 in HOPES Grants to 28 schools, ranging in value from \$2,000 to \$7,500.

**Why is the HOPES Collection so important?** As a result of today's financial realities, elementary schools in the Archdiocese of Hartford continue to depend on HOPES Grants to allow them to implement new strategies, develop successful innovations, and create effective programs contributing to student achievement and school viability. For instance, at Saint Rita School in Hamden, the 2019 – 2020 HOPES Grant will be used to purchase materials to create a new "makerspace." A makerspace is a place where students can get hands-on experience working with concepts they recently learned in the classroom. The point of the space is to make, create, and invent new things. There are many advantages to giving students a place to apply concepts they are learning in their classroom. Pre K through 8th grade classes will be able to experience the makerspace, allowing for more interactive instruction that greatly enhances their engagement in the subject matter and will inspire further investigations into arts and engineering.

We are grateful to all parishioners throughout the **Archdiocese of Hartford** who so generously participate in the HOPES Collection. Your support makes such a positive difference for the elementary schools in the Archdiocese, and is a great gift to the deserving students our schools serve.

**ST JOSEPH CATHOLIC SCHOOL, OKON, NIGERIA: A BEACON OF HOPE**

The weekend of **September 14th and 15th**, St. Jeanne Jugan Parish will be blessed to welcome a Missionary who will speak about St. Joseph Catholic School in Okon, Nigeria. The Missionary will speak at the Masses at Holy Family Church but a free-will offering will take place at both Holy Family Church and St. Bernard Church. As this is a free-will offering, we encourage all parishioners to give what they can to assist St. Joseph Catholic School so the children of Okon, Nigeria may receive an education at a Catholic School.

Below is a letter our Parish received from Reverend Sabastian Umouyo. We ask that you read his appeal to learn more about this wonderful opportunity presented to us to help further the Catholic education of our brothers and sisters in Nigeria.

*St. Joseph is a Catholic school, established to foster primary evangelization as well as catechetical activities which will prepare the children for the sacraments.*

*Established in 2013, it has taken six years to build the first classroom block of eight rooms. The first students were admitted in 2018. There were only twelve in number. This year the number will increase but not significantly because of the lack of infrastructures. Some key structures are not yet in place.*

*The major problems to be addressed include the insufficient facilities. But the absence of financial assistance from the State is a major headache. Most of the parents are poor and cannot afford the full support needed. Their children are to be cared for by the school: food, books, clothes, etc.*

*The teachers and the school administrators, the Marist Brothers, have also to be maintained in order to be able to do their duties. The Brothers are passionate about bringing out the best potentials from the children.*

*The subjects offered in the school include religious knowledge, modern subjects like science: Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Agricultural Science, Physical Education and French are also offered.*

*Being in a rural area, there is no public electricity. The school has therefore one old generating plant which breaks down often. The Catholic Relief Service of the US Catholics has provided water. But the essential structure like dormitories and one more classroom are waiting for funds for their building.*

*This is why our mission appeals and a generous response is essential to give the children in the school a sure future.*

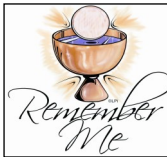

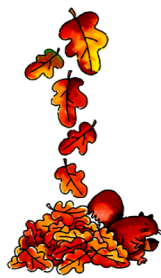
